Deve Gowda: A profile

H D Deve Gowda was born on May 18, 1933 in Hardanahalli village of Holenarsipura Taluk, Hassan district, in Karnataka state. reports BSS.

Deve Gowda, a diploma holder in civil engineering, participated in the freedom struggle as a student leader and was also convoked. He joined the Congress Party in 1953 at the age of 20 and was a member of the party till 1962.

Before becoming a member of the legislative assembly in 1962 at the age of 29, Gowda was a member of the Taluk Development Board and also of a number of cooperative societies. His effective debating style and grasp of issues were acclaimed by the press and his colleagues.

Holenarsipura constituency elected him to the state assembly six times since 1962. He was the leader of the opposition in the state assembly from March 1972 to March, 1976 and from November, 1976 to December, 1977.

He was elected leader of the legislature party and assumed the office of the Chief Minister of Karnataka on December 11, 1994. He attended the Forum of International Economists at the Commonwealth Conference held in London in 1973.
