On-Line Shops woo **Techno-Savvy Women**

Boston, USA: Shopping on the Inter-net never used to be much fun. Users of the global computer network invariably found a poor selection of products and tedious procedures for finding and ordering goods.

As little as a year ago, those who tried Net shopping swore they would rather search for a parking space at the mall on the day before Christmas than hunt through cyberspace for a decent

Christmas 1996, however, seems to have changed some of these perceptions. While virtual shopping will never replace the real experience, the holiday season has left United States retailers optimistic that on-line consumerism is beginning to come of age.

One reason is that more companies are starting to see the advantages of selling

through cyberspace. Maintaining an electronic site on the World Wide Web seg-

ment of the Internet costs little compared with the price of printing and posting catalogues to potential customers. And the international nature of the network allows sellers to reach overseas customers as easily as they once reached those in their local neighbourhoods.

In addition, shopping online has become both simpler and safer. Computer users who previously needed to order by telephone the goods they had tracked down on their screens can now place orders with a simple click of their computer

Security concerns about pay-

ing for orders by giving out credit card numbers — thereby exposing the information to abuse by computer hackers have also begun to ease. It is still wise to be cautious about releasing such information indiscriminately, but growing numbers of on-line shoppers feel more confidentibecause they now have access to new encryption technology allowing data to be transmitted in code.

At the same time, previously-wary credit-card companies have adopted a more positive attitude, with MasterCard and Visa International now working together to set industry standards.

Yet another factor is that an increasing number of American women - traditionally the main shoppers — are starting to use the Internet. Some surveys have shown that the proportion of women on-line has risen from five per cent in 1994 to 32 per cent of an estimated 34.6 million US users at the end of 1996. Internet retailers are hoping they can entice these women away from traditional stores in

favour of shopping from their offices or homes.

Computer giant IBM, for instance, recently created World Avenue, an on-line shopping site where it supplies the technical infrastructure to businesses hoping to sell goods over the Web. Magazine advertisements to promote the service and aimed at retailers, with IBM promising clients a "new, low-risk way" for them to serve their clients.

The customer at whom these services are aimed, according to the advert - which devotes a page to a photograph of an expensively-dressed, middle-aged female — is the "techno-savvy woman of the '90s" who loves to shop and has "got the cash".

Other companies offer books, compact discs and videos. Outside the US, small specialty companies selling exotica such as Scottish haggis or rare Australian wines have capitalised on their access to Internet users by supplying cus-

Some merchants are trying to overcome the impersonal nature of the transaction by offering personalised information. One web site helps people select music recordings they would like based on information provided by the customer in an electronic questionnaire. Another on-line book store links customers to recent book reviews to help them choose.

Despite these advances, online shopping still suffers some significant drawbacks. Even the fastest modems take time to transmit pictures of items such as clothing. Customers without plenty of time to use the Net are often reluctant to order some-

"In addition to shopping at your store 24 hours a day," says the advert, "customers can do in-depth searches for merchandise: by product, category, or simply 'a gift, under 75 bucks, for my son-in-law who's into photography'. It's like giving customers their own personal
