Tennis' dubious distinction

MONACO, Jan 15: Spaniard Ignacio Truvol on Tuesday became the first tennis player to be suspended for doping, reports

The ATP Tour, which controls most of the competitions in men's professional tennis, said in a statement that Truyol, 23. had "violated the tennis anti-doping rule for Class I and Il substances" and had been banned with immediate effect.

It said Truyol, ranked 127 in the world, would be banned for a year from all tennis and forfeit 192 singles ranking points. The ATP said Truyol would also forfeit 39,985, dollars in

prize money earned since the Ostende Challenger Circuit tournament last July, suggesting that was when he failed a dope test. It did not, however, say what

substance Truyol had taken. But it said a one-year penalty was applied in the case of Class I products "which include steroids, masking agents - AFP/UNB photo and compounds."
