

Ganguly had added a scant five to his overnight score of 68 when he went, chasing a swinging delivery from Lance

Lusener with the total on 245. The edge Ganguly steered into the safe hands of Brian McMillan at second slip was perhaps the only wayward shot he played. But then India hit a slump.


