

Aman paddy procurement drive in Natore may end in fiasco

NATORE, Jan 19: Aman paddy procurement drive in the district is about to end in a fiasco due to whimsical attitude of officials of the food department.

Not a single grain of aman paddy or rice has been purchased at some food godowns in the district so far.

The food department has fixed the purchasing target of aman paddy and rice in the district at 1500 metric tons which is very disappointing for a region like Natore in North where like every year aman paddy is produced in surplus quantity. The places where output of aman is said to be very good are Gurudasapur, Boraigram and Shingra thanas under the country's greatest Chalan beel areas.

According to official sources, a total of 750 metric tons of aman paddy and another 750 metric tons of aman rice will be purchased from six thanas of the district.

Of these targetted figures — 200 metric tons of aman paddy and 200 metric tons of rice will be collected from Shingra thana, 150 metric tons of paddy and 150 metric tons of rice from Gurudasapur thana and 100 metric tons of paddy and 100 metric tons of rice will be purchased from each thanas of Boraigram, Bagatipara, Lalpur and sadar.

During this season, about 87,000 metric tons of aman paddy have been produced in the district, Agriculture Extension Department sources said.

But, the food department has reportedly settled the target to procure only 1,725 per cent of aman paddy and rice from total output from six thanas of the district this year.

Where as, from other thanas of some neighbouring districts, the food departments are collecting a huge quantity of aman rice and paddy which is much more than that being collected from six thanas of Natore district.

The food department has targetted to procure 2000 metric tons of aman paddy and rice from Nachol thana alone of Chapainawabganj this year. Whereas, the department last year had fixed it's target to procure 2,104 metric tons of paddy and rice from the five thanas of Chapainawabganj district.

On the other hand, only 1,500 metric tons of aman paddy and rice has been targetted to be collected from six thanas of Natore district this season as against about 7,000 metric tons of aman paddy and rice targetted last season.

The department had also been able to achieve target to purchase 12,250 metric tons of paddy and rice from the district during last IRR-Boro procurement drive.

The growers are not getting fair prices at open markets as smaller quantity of the total produced aman paddy are being purchased by the government.

The food department in Dhaka this year settled the countrywide aman procurement target upto thana levels that is being considered as the cause of the problem.

Millers of the district are also sufferers of this problem. They are fearing that they may have to incur a huge loss as the government allocation for the millers for boiling rice this year is not sufficiently in good quantity.

The government procurement rate of aman paddy and rice have been fixed this

year at Taka 670 and Taka 1050 per quintal respectively. So, according to calculation, aman paddy and rice are being purchased at Taka 250 and Taka 393 per maund with 14 per cent moisture.

But, the coarse aman paddy is selling in most markets of the district between Tk 190 and Tk 215 per maund. The fine quality of aman paddy has been selling between Tk 210 and Tk 225 per maund. However, the prices of coarse and fine quality of aman rice are varying between Tk 335 and Taka 350 per maund.

There appears little hope of any appreciable change of the prices as the government procurement drive has not been geared up to full swing as yet.

The aman procurement drive has been started with effect from last December 01 and expected to be concluded on January 31.

The district food office sources said that they have purchased only 98.35 metric tons of aman paddy and 256.88 metric tons of rice till January 13.

Of these purchased paddy and rice, 65.24 metric tons of paddy and 22.64 metric tons of rice has been collected from Sadar thana, 9.8 metric tons of paddy and 194 metric tons of rice from Shingra, 0.28 metric tons of paddy and 40.24 metric tons of rice from Bagatipara, 2.1 metric tons of paddy from Gurudasapur, 19.46 metric tons of paddy from Boraigram and 1.47 metric tons of aman paddy has been collected from Lalpur thana. Aman rice procurement at Gurudasapur and Boraigram thana is yet to be started because of meddling of local MP of the area, it is alleged.

Not a single grain of rice has been purchased at Lalpur thana as yet.

When asked about the cause of dissatisfactory picture of aman procurement drive, inspite of fixing such 'poor' target, the District Controller of Food (DCF) told The Daily Star that millers of the district are showing less interest to sell aman paddy and rice to the LSD godowns as much less quantity of allocation were given to selected 92 millers. Where as, there are 314 licensed mills in the district.

The DCF added that the growers are also avoiding selling of their aman paddy to the LSD godowns due to non-availability of necessary quantities of gunny-bags and comparatively high rate of carrying cost.

On the other hand, the DCF mentioned that in most cases, supply of paddy is rejected by the godown officials as the quality of paddy, the farmers willing to sell, is not so good.

The growers are reluctant to supply their aman crops to government godowns as most of them do not prefer to receive payment through the banks which, according to them, is both time-consuming and troublesome.

There are allegations that sometimes, the godown officials take away 10 kilograms excess rice per maund from the growers on the plea of excessive moisture.

The official sources added that in Natore district, capacity of godowns are 7,500 metric tons of food grains. There are seven LSD godowns in the district under food department. At present, there are total of 1,500 metric tons of food grains, some drums and gunny-bags in the seven LSD godowns in the district.

Ban on use of wood in brick kilns defied

CHAPAINAWABGANJ, Jan 19: Wood is being burnt at random in most of the brick-kilns of the district. Fuel-wood is being sold at high rates. As a result, garden owners are selling their mango trees. The kiln

owners have been burning wood without any hesitation from the very beginning of the dry season allegedly through unholy alliance with the concerned authorities.

Brick-field and brick-kiln owners use wood instead of coal for baking bricks every year. This phenomenon goes on at random. Last year the Thana Nirbahi Officer (TNO) of Nawabganj Sadar thana, making a surprise visit to some brick-kilns saw stocks of wood for burning and recommended to the they Deputy Commissioner (DC) for taking necessary action against the brick kiln owners. But for some 'unknown reason' no action was taken. As a result, this year also they have begun burning wood at the brick kilns at random.

Besides, a remarkable number of kiln owners bake bricks without any licence. Not only that they are making brick-kilns here and there without caring a little for the environment. It is alleged that innumerable brick-kilns have been constructed in and around the mango of chards at Shibganj. According to the observers, the size of mangoes are becoming

little due to this phenomenon. In order to check the environmental pollution and also to save government revenue immediate action by the concerned higher authorities is necessary.

263 illegal arms recovered from Khulna last year

KHULNA, Jan 19: Khulna Metropolitan Police (KMP) recovered a total of 263 unauthorised firearms during last one year from different places of the city. Pipeguns are outnumbering the recovered firearms, said KMP source. Most of the firearms were found abandoned, the source said.

The recovered illegal firearms include four rifles, one sawed-off rifle, five SBL gun, two DBL guns, three home-made guns, four sawed-off guns, eight home-made revolvers, 15 foreign revolvers, five home-made pistols, five foreign pistols, one toy pistol, five shutter guns and 205 pipeguns.

Nine injured in two separate incidents

GAIBANDHA, Jan 19: Nine persons including a woman, UP member received injuries in two separate incidents over the issue of disputed immovable properties in Sunderganj thana within the last week.

In first incident, a long-standing disagreement developed between Anwar Hossain and Rafiqul Islam of village Dakahin Sreepur under Sunderganj thana over the possession of a disputed pond. On January 13, Rafiqul Islam together with some other fellows attacked the house of victim Anwar Hossain. They started beating the inmates of house. At one stage when wife of victim Monowera Begum, an UP member of Sreepur union and two other inmates came to resist the miscreants they severely injured her. Four other members sustained serious injuries. They were removed to Gaibandha sadar to Gaibandha sadar hospital. The condition of UP member Monowera, Raja Mandol and Yalsha Mandol are still critical.

In another incident, five persons of a family sustained injuries when rival group attacked them with deadly weapons. The incident took place on January 12. On the day victim Anwar Hossain of village Purbo Sonaray under Sunderganj thana cut down a bamboo from a disputed land which was strongly protested by the owner of the disputed land, Abed Ali.

Soon the situation turned into a clash following exchange of hot words. The other members while encountering the situation were also injured.

Total five members of the same family sustained injuries and they were admitted to Sunderganj health complex. The separate cases were filed.

Loadshedding PDB engineer assaulted in Nalchhiti

BARISAL, Jan 19: The Resident Engineer (RE) of PDB of Nalchhiti thana was allegedly assaulted by some local people this morning.

Witnesses said, a group of people brought out a procession at about 11 am protesting irregular power supply at Nalchhiti. They gheraoed the local PDB office and pelted brick bats. At one stage, they assaulted Nazrul Islam, RE.

Soon after the incident police went to the spot and brought the situation under control.

Later the 'Nagarik Committee' of Barisal gave an ultimatum to the PDB demanding regular power supply in the town, otherwise they would stop payment of electric bills.

The 'Power Consumers Samity of Barguna district' also brought out a procession demanding regular power supply yesterday. The angry people also gheraoed the PDB office at Banaripara.

Works of Shibganj stadium going on in full swing

Boy murdered in Rajshahi

RAJSHAHI, Jan 19: A minor boy aged about 10 was reportedly killed at Kamnagar village of Bagmara thana yesterday.

The local people caught the alleged killer red handed when he was digging a grave to bury the unfortunate boy.

According to police, some labourers, while going across the Lakati beel saw a man digging earth with a big bag beside him. On suspicion, they challenged him and after opening the bag, found the body of a boy. The head and an arm were detached from the body.

They took the man and the corpse to the villagers.

The man was identified as Abdul Khaleque, son of the late Nanir Foujdar of the same village while the victim was identified as Golam Mostafa, 10, the only child of one Abdul Kader of the neighbouring village Saipara.

The villagers handed over Abdul Khaleque to the Bagmara police. A case has been filed.

The cause of the gruesome murder was not known.

Urea fertilizer crisis in Gaibandha

GAIBANDHA, Jan 19: Crisis of urea of fertilizer may hit the ensuing IRR-Boro crop cultivation in the district due to short supply.

The alarm was expressed by the Bangladesh Fertilizer Association, Gaibandha unit in a press briefing held at Gaibandha public library hall on January 13.

The allotment of fertilizer by BCIC is not adequate compared to the demand, they said.

Moreover, allotted quota of 2,684 tons of fertilizer against Gaibandha district for the month of December '96 is yet to reach dealers. As a result, price of fertilizer is continuing to increase in the local market.

In Gaibandha there are 34 fertilizer dealers. Of them 14 for Gaibandha sadar, two for Sadullapur, 8 for Shaghata, 7 for Gobindaganj, two for Palashbari and one for Sunderganj thana.

According to agriculture extension department, a total of 67,650 hectare of lands have been brought under IRR-Boro cultivation in the district during the ensuing crop season. Urea fertilizer has become a common chemical.

According to farmers, they usually use 150 kg of urea per acre against specific dose of 80 kg. Moreover, farmers are using excess quantity of urea in wheat field and other crop field as well as fish cultivation. As a result the demand of urea is continuously increasing day by day. Urea fertilizer is being sold at Tk 274 per 50 kg bag in the local market.

BCIC should enhance the quota of fertilizer for Gaibandha and ensure its prompt supply to overcome the probable crisis in the ensuing IRR-Boro crop season.

Rajshahi under grip of cold spell

Tk 6 cr sanctioned for pry schools works in Barisal

BARISAL, Jan 19: The government has sanctioned Tk 6.24,28,000 for construction and repair of 86 government primary schools in four districts under Barisal education circle in the current fiscal year, reports BSS.

The districts are: Barisal, Jhalakati, Bhola and Pirojpur.

According to an official source, the projects include reconstruction and repair of 61 government primary schools and construction of 25 two-storied town primary schools with sanitation, water supply and electrification.

The work is being financed by the Asian Development Bank (ADB). Construction of 46 projects including 16 two-storied town primary schools have already been completed and the rest is expected to be completed by May next, the source said.

Road mishap: Driver killed, Australian citizen hurt

CHITTAGONG, Jan 19: A driver was killed and an Australian citizen received serious wounds when a Dhaka-bound truck rammed a private car from opposite direction on Dhaka-Chittagong highway Saturday, reports UNB.

Witnesses said the mishap occurred at Joraganj of Mirsharal thana at 1:30 pm, leaving the car driver dead on the spot.
