Bangladesh Textiles Mills Association (BTMA), and Bangladesh Knitwear Manufacturers and Exports Association (BKMEA). The committee will ensure

strict compliance of the rules

before issuing GSP certificates.

The RMG export target for the current financial year is 2750 million US dollars. European union is the single largest market for Bangladeshi RMG. contributing 54 per cent of the total RMG export

Tofael Ahmed said the present government was commit ted to be transparent in all its activities including issuance of GSP certificates. He said, EU is providing this facility to the LDC countries including Bangladesh to be self-sufficient in producing yarn and fabrics to the garments industries.
