During the three-day talks, split into several sessions, at the state guest house Meghna since their arrival on Saturday, the PCJSS leaders formally placed their five-point charter, encompassing 49 demands, to end insurgency by its armed wing, Shantibahini.

The sources said that accords had been reached on major issues like strengthening the local government councils and formation of a 'central council' enjoying more autonomy than granted previously with majority of its elected members to be drawn from the tribespeople.

But the talks entered into rough waters when the PCJSS insisted on granting land rights to the tribespeople, which would literally leave the settlers from the plains without their prime farm lands which they had carved out diligently in the forests.

The government side said the laws regarding the land rights would have to be as per the country's existing law. Those who were 'evicted' or 'lost' their lands would be returned their property on the basis of documents, they said.

But the PCJSS stressed that the settlers should be 'evicted' and their lands returned to the tribespeople. They also said those who had settled in the hill-districts since 1974 falls under this category.

Despite the last minute effort by the government side, which included the three tribal MPs from the three hill districts, the talks which resumed at 11-30 am yesterday, however, failed to match the drafts of each side.

A Bangla typewriter and a stenographer was rushed to the guest house in anticipation of an agreed draft, sources said.

The dialogue stumbled on the vexed issue of land rights, made complex by the traditional 'jhum' or slash-and-burn farming style of the tribespeople, leaving them hop-stepping around the hills. From one clearing to another, as they nomadic nature of farming style leaves them with no permanent farms, they have no

documents of land rights. Finally, at 2-35 pm, the Chief Whip escorted them out. But they faced newsmen waiting at the entrance of the guest house. After a very brief chat they hurried to the air base.

Our staff correspondent Nurul Alam reported from Chittagong last night that Aatur Rahman Kaiser, financial affairs secretary of the Awami League, who is a member of the National Committee on CHT escorted the PCJSS delegation back to Dudukchhara.

As the Mi-17 helicopter, carrying the PCJSS delegation back to their temporary headquarters, landed at the tiny frontier hamlet of Dudukchhara at 4-45 pm about 200 tribespeople received them with cheers. Meanwhile, the security forces are going back to eight camps in the next three days. They had vacated the camps in and around Dudukchhara along the border with Tripura state of India. Five other camps were kept neutralised also under an agreement with the PCJSS reached earlier when talks began in 1992.

UNB adds from Khagrachhari: Alighting from the chopper, the PCJSS leaders went straight to a hill-top from where they addressed a spontaneous gathering of over 1,000 tribal people.

Addressing the gathering, the PCJSS leaders said they had talks with the government in a friendly and cordial atmosphere for three days.

PCJSS chief Shantu Larma, in his speech, called upon all the tribal people for unity and patience to maintain a peaceful co-existence in the CHT until a permanent solution is reached on the basis of the five-point demand placed by the PCJSS.

"We have thoroughly discussed the five-point demand and already reached consensus on a number of issues... we'll sit again on March 12," Larma told the cheering tribal men and women.

Speaking in their own dialect, the tribal Chakma leader, however, asked them not to be misguided by any quarter. He also sought their all-out cooperation to continue the next round of the peace talks.

The Communication Ministry's development budget for transport by 50 million US dollars per year. Different government bodies involved in infrastructure development however have different opinions about involving the private sector in building such an important road.

Some RAJUK officials opined that the by-pass project could easily be merged with the World Bank financed Greater Dhaka Integrated Township Scheme instead of making it a stand-alone scheme. "It will be very difficult for any party to realise their expenditure through the toll system in such a small-run of the highway," said a top official of the RAJUK. "Moreover, in the context of our road users, the idea of toll collection may not work well."

For recovering the expenses, the RAJUK official suggested that roadside lands could easily be developed as commercial sites to ensure the returns. If this is agreed upon, the RAJUK itself can finance this scheme under BOT terms, he said.

Some other town planners suggested that if the government is serious about introducing the toll collection system in the proposed by-pass, it will have to protect the highway so that nobody can build link roads haphazardly.

Some officials of the Ministry of Communications observed that since the investment was huge, toll collection might not ensure return of the investment within a short span of time. Therefore the private sector might not participate in this scheme at all.

BJP to seek no-confidence motion against Gowda

NEW DELHI, Jan 27: India's main opposition Hindu Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) will seek a no-confidence vote against Prime Minister H D Deve Gowda in parliament next month, the Press Trust of India (PTI) reported today, says Reuter.

The agency quoted former BJP prime minister Atal Behari Vajpayee as saying in the northern town of Lucknow that he expects some deputies of the Congress Party, Deve Gowda's reluctant make-or-break ally, to vote for the BJP's motion.

The BJP commands 195 votes in the 545-seat Lok Sabha (lower house of parliament). The Congress Party, with 140 seats, is shoring up Deve Gowda's seven-month old government which has fewer than 200 deputies of its own.

PTI quoted Vajpayee as saying the BJP will encourage the Congress also to move a simultaneous no-confidence motion, saying: "The BJP will support such a motion if it is brought by the Congress."

Lalmonirhat Rly Divisional HQs gheraoed

LALMONIRHAT, Jan 27: Railway employees today gheraoed the Divisional HQ of Bangladesh Railway, Western Zone, here protesting the move to relocate the HQ building, reports UNB.

They also demanded reinstatement of two trade union leaders suspended for spearheading the movement.

The employees have been waging movement for last two months to resist the move to shift the zonal head office to another railway building.

Meanwhile, the railway authorities floated a tender for renovation of the office building on January 20. But the tender box was snatched away on the day.

Chowdhury Shahidul Kabir, president of local unit of Railway Sramik League, and its joint secretary Zahirul Huq Patwari were suspended on Thursday following the incident.

Foreign Secretary Farooq Sobhan, in his briefing after the Hasina-Gowda summit, said that the Joint Working Group (JWG) meetings will also make detailed follow-up on eliminating insurgencies like those of the ULFA, NSCN, Bodos in the seven eastern states of India and the Shantibahini in the Chittagong Hill Tracts.
