ALICE, South Africa, Feb 6: An undefeated 95 by Andy Flower guided Zimbabwe to a comfortable 83-run victory over an Eastern Cape Invitation XI on Wednesday, reports Reuter

Flower and Stuart Carlisle (52) combined in 109-run partnership for the fifth wicket to haul Zimbabwe out of trouble after they had been reduced to 61 for four by the combined side, made up of second eleven players from Eastern Province and border provincial sides.

Flower's 116-ball innings helped Zimbabwe to 248 for six which proved far too much for the Eastern Cape side who were dismissed for 165 despite an enterprising partnership of 87 be-tween Ashwell Prince (39) and Steve Palframan (55) for the second wicket.

The match was played at the Ntselamanzi Cricket Club on the outskirts of Alice, a black town in the former "independent" homeland of the Ciskei.

Zimbabwe are next in action on Friday when they play India.

Harvey finished with four wickets after tearing through the Queensland middle-order.

Instead of a special effects extravaganza, Nagano is planning a "simple, solemn and spiritual" opening for the 16day Games, scheduled to begin Feb 7 next year, according to opening ceremony producer Man Arai. Athletes will be led into the

Olympic stadium in the central Japan Alps by 'snow children, and the arena itself will be surrounded by pillars at each of the four compass directions. "This will symbolise the

area as a spiritually purified place," Arai said. The two-hour opening cere-

mony for the Games — the first to be held in Asia in 26 years will also feature world renowned conductor Seiji Ozawa leading a 2,000-strong choir representing each continent but Antarctica in a rendition of Beethoven's Ode To Joy.

Representing the five continents will be Berlin, Cape Town, Sydney, Beijing and New York.

Thursday's announcement was part of a series of events organisers have held over the past week to drum up support for the Games ahead of the one-yearto-go mark.

To mark the actual passing of the one-year-left milestone. hundreds of thousands of tickets for the Games were to go on sale Friday, and organisers were planning a gala reception for guests in Tokyo.

Organisers say a total 1.28 million tickets will be made available for the Games, though 370,000 of those will go to sponsors, official broadcasters or other special guests and VIPs. Another 200,000 will be sold overseas.



MADRID, Feb 6: Valencia crashed out of the Spanish Cup on Wednesday to Second Division Las Palmas after squandering a 2-0 league from the first leg before finally losing on penalties, reports Reuter.

1995 winners Deportivo Coruna are also out after the goalless draw at Espanyol, who go through on the away-goals rule. They join Real Betis, Racing Santander, Celta Vigo and holders Atletico Madrid in Friday's quarter-final draw.

PALERMO, Sicily, Feb 6: Juventus, completing an academic task. won the European Super Cup on Wed-

nesday when they beat Paris Saint Germain 3-1 in the second leg after routing the French side 6-1 in the first leg. reports Reuter.

Italian international Alessandro del Piero gave the European champions the lead with a well-taken goal in the 30th minute he made it 2-1 in the 70th, six minutes after Brazilian Rai had equalised from the penalty spot.

Substitute striker Christian Vieri, seconds after seriously testing goalkeeper Bernard Lama with a brilliant stop and volley from the edge of the area. headed in the third goal in injury time from a Del Piero

Juventus' victory in the Super Cup, contested by the European Cup and Cup Winners' Cup holders, was largely academic given the Italians 6-1 advantage from last month's first leg in Paris.

But both sides played exciting football in front of 35,000 fans in Palermo, where Juventus had obtained UEFA permission to play as attendance was expected to be low in their home city of Turin.

"This was a confirmation for us, we came here wanting to see the kind of spirit we showed in the first leg, and we saw it," Del Piero said. "Now I've got to join the na-

tional team and we'll see what happens," added the striker, who is set to be Gianfranco Zola's back-up in Italy's key world cup qualifier against England at Wembley next Wednesday. Del Piero's first goal — a

short-range blast from a Moreno Torricelli pass — came after an evenly-balanced halfhour in which PSG's Dely Valdes and Patrice Loko forced fine saves from Italy goalkeeper Angelo Peruzzi.

If those saves reassured most Italians that Peruzzi is the right man to defend their goal against England, the robust

goalkeeper's clumsy tackle on Valdes in the 64th minute may have changed a few minds. Rai's equaliser from the re-

sultant penalty appeared to ensure that the French side would at least save face after the humiliating first leg. But Juventus were evidently not going to let their devoted Palermo supporters go home without a victory.

Fans at the La Favourita Standium had to wait only six minutes before erupting into cheers as Del Piero, exploiting a marred clearance by Poual le Guen, headed in the rebound of his first shot which Lama had blocked.

"This victory was possible thanks to the fantastic crowd we found here in Palermo," Juve coach Markello Lippi said.

Juventus became the third Italian team in four years to take the cup. AC Milan won in 1994, AC Parma in 1993, Last year. Ajax of Amsterdam swept all three major club titles: the European Champions' Cup, Toyota Cup and European Super
