



"We did not invite any sponsor for financial assistance because that would have led to the inclusion of its name in the identity of the tournament which would have undermined the message of regional cooperation among the SAARC countries which this tournament highlights", added the BCB supremo.

"In the changed circumstances where countries around the globe are more keen to improve their living standard through cooperations in different regional fora, sport plays a very significant role in serving that purpose", said Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad, who is also the chief patron of the organising committee.

Gordon Greenidge, the coach of the national team, said that the tournament will play an important role in our preparation for the ICC Trophy, a qualifying tourney involving the non-Test playing members from where the top-down three will earn berths in the next World Cup in 1997.

Apparently hot under the collar because of the hamhandedness of the organisers in the last minute inclusion of the celebrated former West Indian cricketer in the press conference, Gordon Greenidge observed Bangladesh has every reason for qualifying in the next World Cup.





Paris Open Hingis moves into qtrs

PARIS, Feb 13: Swiss teenager Martina Hingis, who has vet to lose a match this season, extended her unbeaten run by defeating Italian Silvia Farina in straight sets to reach the quarterfinals of the Paris Open women's tennis tournament on Wednesday, reports Reuter.

Top-seed Hingis, ranked second in the world, recovered from a slow start to beat Farina 6-3, 6-4 in 67 minutes.

Farina, who beat Hingis in the second round of this tournament last year, broke her opponent to open up a 3-2 lead in the first set. But Hingis, who won this year's Australian Open as well

as tournaments in Sydney and Tokyo, then took seven games in a row to take control of the match. "I treated her with respect because I remembered last

year's match," Hingis said. "She played very well then but I have improved quite a bit since." Hingis will play either Ka-

rina Habsudova of Slovakia or Nathalie Tauziat of France for a place in the semifinals.

Kenneth & Co win Sweden Rally

555 Subaru World Rally Team driver, Kenneth Eriksson, and co-driver, Staffan Parmander, won the Rally of Sweden yesterday after an incredible three days of competition that saw the lead change no fewer ten times between five drivers. In doing so, the Swede, who has now won his home event three times, also brought Pirelli the acclaim of winning their first-ever Swedish Rally. Teammate and former world champion, Colin McRae, finished the event that has caused so much consternation with tyre choice in fourth position after a frustrating spin that knocked him off the head of the leaderboard this afternoon, says a press release.

"It feels fantastic to have won on home ground again, especially on my first outing with the new Subaru World Rally car," said Kenneth. "It has been very close all the way through and tyres have been the deciding factory every time the leaderboard changed. Pirelli have really done a fantastic job for us and I feel proud to have scored their first victory here. Yesterday for sure we did not benefit by running at the front of the field, so today has been good, especially as the weather was more suited to us. It also feels good to have maintained the record the rally has of always being won by a Scandinavian driver," Kenneth started the final leg in position, however three consecutive fastest stage times soon elevated him to first position with a 16 second advantage going into the last stage of the rally. "Kenneth went flat out all day," said Staffan. "At one point it got quite scary because he never once lifted his foot off the accelerator!"
