arms. But none could be arrested.

Besides, all security patrols in the hill districts were alerted immediately after the incident, the sources added.

It may be recalled that a sub-inspector of police, Shaiful Islam, was also killed at the same area on 13 October last year.

UNB adds from Bandarban: A police contingent led by the OC of Raungchhara thana visited the spot. Additional SP of Bandarban district Mohammad Jashim Uddin also visited the spot.

Raungchhara thana assumed that foreign-made ammunition was used in the killing. "I have never seen such bullet," a police official on the scene also said.

Police force has been reinforced in the troubled area.

This is the first killing incident after the peace talks held in the capital January 25-27 between the government and Parbatya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (PCJSS), the political wing of the tribal guerrillas.

The next meeting between PCJSS and government sides aiming to resolve the Chittagong Hill Tracts problem is scheduled for March 12.

Officials said the killing took place in flagrant breach of the current ceasefire that ends on March 31.

Bandarban Hill District Local Government Council Chairman Maung Kui Chin Chowdhury and MP Bir Bahadur in a joint statement condemned the killing.

"Such incident will disrupt the peace process as the government is trying its best to resolve the problems of Chittagong Hill Tracts through dialogue with the PCJSS people," the statement said.

AL to protect democratic rights of people: Zillur

LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Zillur Rahman yesterday said Awami League was determined to protect democratic rights of the people achieved through long struggle under the leadership of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, reports BSS.

The minister was speaking as chief guest at a rally at Bangabandhu Avenue organised by the party's city unit in observance of 'democracy killing day.'

Zillur Rahman said the autocratic government of Begum Khaleda Zia held a farcical election under her one party rule on February 15 last year, denying the popular demand of all political parties to hold a free and fair general election under the supervision of a caretaker government.
