SPORTS TALK"We've come to win": Zaheer Abbas
Mujtaba's men in town

A 16-member Pakistan A team arrived in the capital yesterday to take part in the SAARC cricket tournament scheduled to begin at the Dhaka Stadium from February 19.

On arrival at the Zia International Airport in the morning, Zaheer Abbas, the manager of the strong Pakistani team for the four-nation regional meet, said that his boys are here to win and make friendship with other participants.

Talking to The Daily Star at the VIP lounge, the former Pakistan captain and star batsman of the yester-years observed it was his second assignment abroad as an official. "This is my second visit as an official. I had earlier managed the Pakistan national team on its Zimbabwe tour," said Zaheer.

Lauding the idea of holding such tournaments as a very significant effort for the promotion of the game, Zaheer felt SAARC tourney can also do a world of good in cementing the relationship among the sports fraternity of this region.

Although this is his first visit to Bangladesh as an official, the venue where the ten-day meet involving the second string sides from India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka and hosts Bangladesh will be played, is very much known to Zaheer, one of the greatest exponents of elegant batsmanship.

"It's a wonderful ground (Dhaka Stadium). I played here several times and scored a lot of runs," quipped a nostalgic Zaheer, who is now a national selector.

He climbed in no uncertain terms that the Pakistan A team is the second best selection of Pakistan.

"This is a very good side. It has got the right blend of experience and youth. We have picked the players who did well in the domestic cricket. I think it will be a very good team to watch," informed a confident Zaheer.

But the man at the helm was, however, of the opinion that the artificial wicket at the Dhaka Stadium could cause a problem or two for his boys.

"Since our players are not accustomed to such wickets, it will certainly be a bit difficult to start with. What we need now some practice to adjust ourselves to the alien surface," added a soft spoken Zaheer adorned once all over the world for his graceful and majestic batting.

The squad includes 14 play-

ers off whom half has already donned the national cap. Although Zaheer Abbas seemed to be concerned about his players' unfamiliarity with synthetic wicket, Asif Mujtaba, the captain, appeared very relaxed.

"We are professionals. If we can have some practice here on the artificial turf for the next couple of days, it should not be any problem," said the former Pakistan international.

"I have been informed we failed even to make it to the final in 1994. But this time we have a balanced side and I am optimistic about making amends by winning the tournament this time," said Asif Mujtaba.

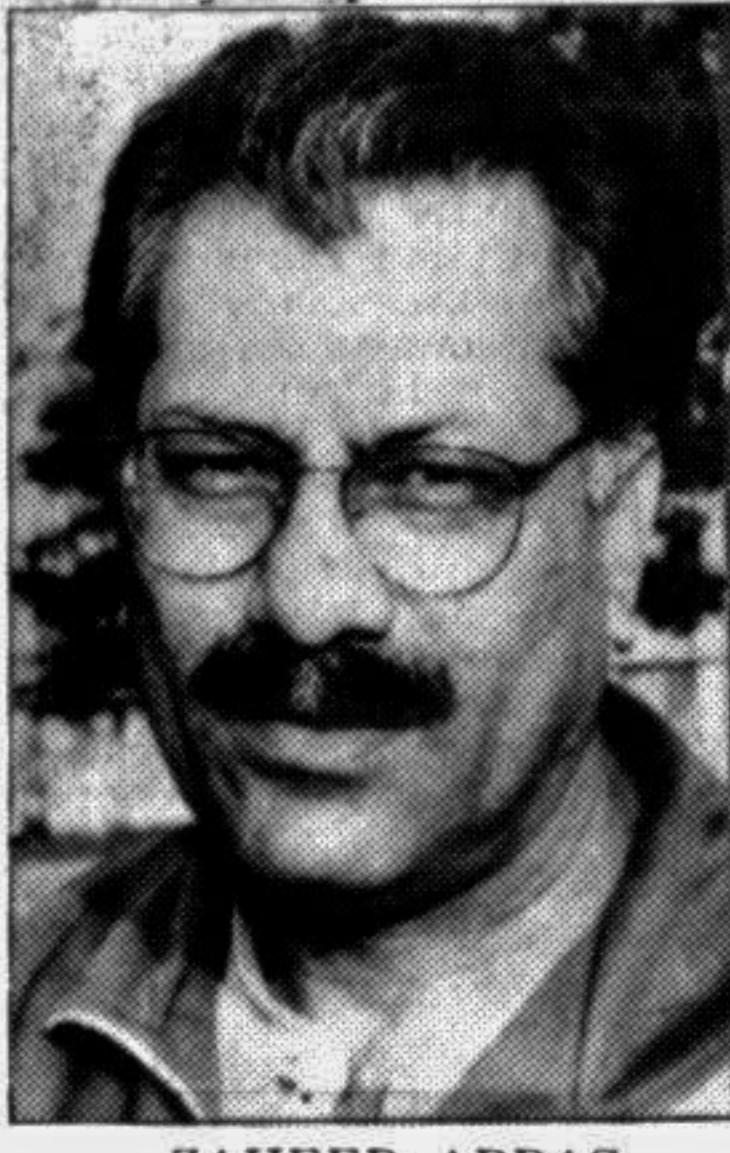
While shedding light on the composition of his squad, the left-handed, middle-order batsman said they have three seamers, two spinners, couple of experienced batsmen and an all-rounder. Off the two tweakers, Arshad Khan is a right-arm off-spinner and Mohammed Hossain is a left-arm spinner.

But the most lethal weapons in the Pakistan bowling arsenal will be the three pacers. They are: the ever dependable and seasoned Aaqib Javed, left-arm fast bowler, and Mohammed Zahid.

Of the trio, Mohammed Zahid, the young teenager will certainly hog the limelight for his sheer pace. The young speedster, who on his debut Test in Lahore last year tore the New Zealand batting apart with a match haul of 11 wickets, is fancied to be quicker than either of his illustrious peers on the national team — Wasim Akram and Waqar Younis.

"He has a bright future. I believe he has the ability to go a long way in the highest level," said Asif Mujtaba while commenting on the new shining

pace star. Among the batsmen, Selim Elahi and Azam Khan are likely to open the Pakistan

innings. Off the two Selim Elahi, a member of the Pakistan team in the tour of Down Under, was a prolific run-getter in Pakistan's domestic cricket while Azam Khan was described by Mujtaba as the lone all-rounder in the team.

The skipper himself and Basit Ali, who too were among the runs in the domestic circuit, are likely to form the back-bone of a fairly solid middle-order. Asif Mujtaba, who plays for PIA, scored more than 600 runs from seven matches. Besides, he enjoyed the highest average in the Patron's trophy.

On the other hand Basit Ali, who plays for United Bank Limited, scored more than 900 runs in the Pakistan First-class cricket which included nine 50s and a century.

"I am happy with my performance in the domestic cricket. May be, that was not good enough to win me back a recall to the national team. But I am not disappointed and I want to make the most of this tourney to bolster the prospect of my return to the Pakistan team proper," said the Karachi batsman once touted as a Javed Miandad clone for their identical batting styles.

The first among the visitors to arrive, Pakistan A players had a light practice session at the BUET ground in the afternoon where a synthetic turf has been laid to give the players a feel of the wicket the meet will be played on. Hosts Bangladesh and Pakistan A will feature in the first match on Wednesday.

Surjo Tarun Club almost confirmed their place in the elite Premier league for at least another year when they recorded an impressive 52-run win against the Greater Mymensingh Cricket Club (GMCC) in a relegation play-off match at the Jagannath Hall ground yesterday.

The facile victory for Surjo Tarun, put them in a comfortable position in the three-team relegation play-off which also involve Dhaka Wanderers. With Gulshan Youth already demoted to the First Division after finishing bottom of the table, the play-off however, has been enforced for the other relegation slot after the three ended up on same points on completion of the six-team relegation league.

Back to the day's match, Surjo Tarun, sent into bat in the morning, scored a fighting 199 before being all out in 49.1 overs. Zafar Ali noted up highest 58 runs for the winners. The middle-order bat, who stroled to the middle with his side limping at 58/3, hammered half a dozen hits across the rope in his 70-ball vigil at the wicket. While skipper Ehsan, who shared a vital 73 runs for the sixth wicket with the Zafar, scored a gritty 26 off 52 balls.

The Surjo Tarun captain than did not better with the cherry claiming four wickets for only 28 runs in his 10 economic overs as GMCC, chasing a fairly achievable target, were shot out for 147 in 43.3 overs. Opener Faiaz Ferdousi scored a sedate 32 off 98 balls while wicketkeeper Musa, who fought a lone battle against a never-ending procession at the other end, hammered a rapid-fire 31 off 44 deliveries.

Shamsul Huda with three for 29 in his ten nippy overs was the other notable wicket-taker for Surjo Tarun.

Rain plays foul in Harare

HARARE, Feb 16: Monday's second one-day international between India and Zimbabwe was called off today because of a water-logged pitch at the Harare Sports Club, reports Reuters.

The washout gave home team their second successive home victory in a one-day series after their 3-0 drubbing of England last month.

Zimbabwe won Saturday's opening limited-over match by eight wickets after rain reduced the home side's target to 136 in 38 overs.

It was only their second one-day win over India in 15 attempts.

Zimbabwe drub India

BULAWAYO, Zimbabwe, Feb 16: Zimbabwe beat India by eight wickets in a rain-interrupted one-day international at the Queens Ground here Saturday, reports AFP.

After skittling India out for 168 in 43.5 overs Zimbabwe had no trouble taking the match which was originally reduced to 44 overs a side and then to just 38 overs for Zimbabwe with a target of 136.

Zimbabwe captain Allister Campbell won the toss and sent the Indians in to bat.

The Zimbabwean bowlers took full advantage of the overcast conditions and had India struggling at 95 for six before a seventh-wicket stand between Rabindra Singh and Anil Kumble took the score to 158.

The Indian tail then collapsed and they were all out for 168 in 43.5 overs. Best of the bowlers was paceman Heath Streak who took five wickets for 32 runs in 8.5 overs.

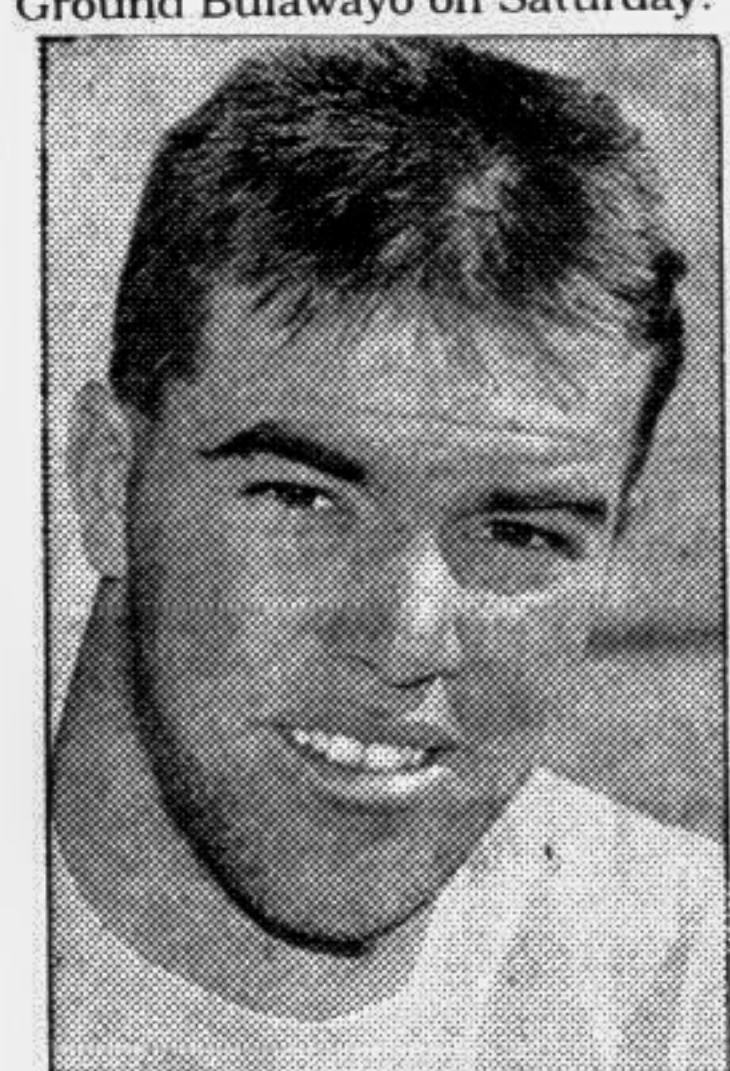
Zimbabwe looked confident from the start of their innings, putting on 31 for the first wicket, which saw captain Allister Campbell get a fine edge

to a Kumble delivery to be caught by Azharuddin in the slip for 24.

Opener Grant Flower was 61 not out at the end, having seen Andy Waller come and go, bowled Ganesh for 25.

Guy Whittall was with Flower at the end, scoring 19 not out, and Heath Streak was declared man-of-the-match. The two sides are due to play a second one-day match in Harare on Monday.
