

Urea price hits record low: Survey

The fall in retail price of urea continued and it was record low in last week, according to a field survey conducted by International Fertilizer Development Centre (IFDC) in

Bangladesh, reports BSS. The Survey showed 11 per cent fall in retail price of urea in the third week of February than that of the same period of last year. The retail price of 50kg bag was Taka 244 in last week while it was Taka 273 in the third week of February last

The survey revealed that usually, the price of fertilizer maintained upward trend during the IRRI-boro season from

January to March. But this is for the first time the price is gradually declining despite its use moving towards the peak.

The survey also revealed that the price was three per cent lower in the first week of February and in the second week it was seven per cent lower compared to that of the last

The field survey covered various regions, particularly, greater Chittagong, Noakhali, Comilla, Sylhet, Dhaka, Kishoregonj. Mymensingh, Kushtia and Jessore.

Meanwhile, the government has distributed the entire quantity of urea to the dealers

for February and started to give delivery against March's quota to ensure steady supply of urea acres the country.

Besides, the entire distribution network has been streamlined and the activities of the district and thana monitoring committees have been geared

The total availability of urea in March will be 376,292 metric tons, of which 226,292 metric tons from the previous stock and rest 1,50,000 metric tons from local production. The projected demand for March is 3.45.614 metric tons, after fulfilling the March's demand the surplus quantity will be 30,778 metric tons.

Tk 806 cr project launched to improve rural roads, markets

The Second Rural Roads and Markets Improvement and Maintenance Project at a cost of Taka 806 crore was launched Monday, reports UNB.

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia, Feb 25: Buoyed by a surge of exports Malaysia's trade deficit slid 8.7 billion ringgit (3.48 billion dollars) last year, a 93.4 per cent decline compared to 1995, the Statistic Department said Tuesday, reports AP.

It said the deficit last year stood at 617.97 million ringgit (247.18 million dollars), far less than the 5.2 billion ringgit (2.08 billion dollars) forecast by the Treasury Department last

The deficit in 1995 was 9.53 billion ringgit (3.74 billion dol-

Exports totaled 196.69 billion ringgit (78.676 billion dollars) in 1996, 6.3 per cent higher than the 11.7 billion ringgit (4.68 billion dollars) worth exports in 1995, the Statistics De-

partment said. Imports increased only by 1.5 per cent to 197.30 billion ringgit (78.923 billion dollars). Thermionic valves and

WASHINGTON, Feb 25: Top US Treasury and Federal Reserve officials will meet with their counterparts from five key Asian countries next week for what will be the first-ever economic strategy session linking finance and central bank officials from a possible Asian group of Six, reports AP.

Dr Mohammad Harun-Ur-Rashid, Chairman of Securities and Exchange Commission,

and Industry held at the Dhaka Sheraton Hotel yesterday. Seated on his left are Pres-

The US delegation will be headed by Deputy Treasury Secretary Lawrence Summers. Others officials participating will come from Japan, China, Singapore. Australia and Hong

Kong. Clinton administration officials said the daylong meeting in Tokyo on March 4 could set the stage for regular sessions of the group, even after Hong Kong becomes part of China later this year.

Currently, the finance officials of the world's seven richest industrial countries — the United States, Japan, Germany, France, Britain, Italy and Canada - meet regularly to coordinate economic policies as

the Group of Seven. In addition, leaders of the G-7 countries get together once a year to survey mutual economic and political problems facing the group. This year's G-7-summit will be held in Denver from June 20-22.

A formal statement issued by the US Treasury Department said the Asian meeting would be held to discuss "economic policy and financial market issues

Officials said that one goal of the meeting is to develop a mechanism for responding to future financial crisis such as the one that engulfed Mexico after it was forced to devalue the peso in late December 1994.

In explaining the make-up of the group, officials said that while Hong Kong will become a part of China later this year, its central bank, the Hong Kong Monetary Authority, will remain an independent institution, in control of Hong Kong's huge 70 billion dollars in currency reserves.

The Asian G-6 represents the latest effort by the Clinton administration to reorient US policy to place greater emphasis on Asia, which features the fastest-growing economies in the world.

The administration views this region as a huge economic opportunity for American businesses although currently it is also the region where the United States is suffering its biggest trade deficits, including a 47.7 billion dollars gap with Japan and a 39.5 billion dollars imbalance with China.


