


are very personal and nasty."
Shane Warne, one of the two Australians to be punished by the International Cricket Council and subsequently by the Australian Cricket Board during the 1994 Test, has been talking to his teammates about it. The other to be punished was fast bowler Merv Huges.

"Warne has told us it is tough but to expect it," Taylor said. "We talked about in a lot of meetings and we are mentally prepared."

Taylor feels despite South Africa's home advantage his side is better equipped to win the Test series.

"There is far more pressure on the South Africans than on the Australians," Taylor said referring to South Africa's recent success over India at home. "They haven't really played tough Test cricket."

South Africa considers itself a top Test nation in the ranks of Australia, Pakistan and the West Indies.

"We've got more tough cricket under our belt in our favour," Taylor said with reference to Australia's back-to-back success over the West Indies. The current series is billed

TAUPO, New Zealand, Feb 27: Left-arm seamer Chaminda Vaas took a hattrick and claimed six for 22 today as Sri Lanka started their New Zealand tour with a warm-up match, reports Reuter.

The World Cup champions skittled Northern Districts for 116 despite good batting conditions on the first day of the twoday match. The tourists replied with 138 for two at stumps.

Vaas dismissed top-scorer Matthew Hart, who made 42. Dion Bennett and Mark Tesar with successive deliveries to wrap up the home team's innings midway through the afternoon session. But historians will not re-

Benjamin may miss Test series

ST JOHN'S, Antigua, Feb 27: West Indies paceman Kenneth Benjamin is doubtful for the Test series against India in the Caribbean stating next week because of a stress fracture, reports Reuter.

Benjamin, who recently returned from New York where he saw sports-injury specialist Dr Ainsworth Allen, has been told by the Jamaica-born doctor that a rib stress fracture will keep him out of action for up to six weeks.

The Antiguan bowler, who came home early from West Indies recent tour of Australia nursing what was reported then as a side strain, aggravated the injury in a Red Stripe Cup match against Trinidad and



mate at Spanish club Barcelona, had set up the win with two first half goals. Poland scored twice in the last four minutes on goals by substitute Cezar Kucharski and Marek Citko, who scored from a

saved by Carlos Germano. Poland, like many other middle-ranking European sides, played some neat midfield but were ultimately short of creative ideas in attack until their late revival made the score respectable.

Brazil suffered an early fright when Poland striker Krzysztof Warzycha fired narrowly wide from inside the penalty area in the second

But five minutes later Giovanni opened the scoring. calmly placing the ball under the body of goalkeeper Grazegorz Szamotulski.

Giovanni scored again on Brazil's next real chance 19 minutes later. This time, Romario split the defence, Leonardo latched onto the ball, rounded Szamotulski and laid on a pass for Giovanni to place into the empty net.

Poland had enjoyed plenty of possession until that point but in the second half they tired and the South Americans began to turn on the style the public had expected.

Romario missed his chance for glory with the score at 3-0 when, with the goal at his mercy, he stubbed the ball wide from six metres. However, he still produced a couple of moments of skill that sent the crowd into delirium.

Hodgson joins Blackburn?

LONDON, Feb 27: Roy Hodgson was named as Blackburn Rovers' new manager on Wednesday - although the announcement appeared to take his current club Inter Milan by surprise, reports Reuter.

Hodgson, who has been at Inter for 16 months, is expected to take over from caretaker boss Tony Parkes at Ewood Park in July, Rovers' chairman Robert Coar said.

The announcement came just three months after Hodgson extended his contract with Inter until June 1999.

In a statement issued on November 20, Inter said that Hodgson had turned down an approach from Blackburn and had extended his contract, originally due to end in June this year, for a further two years.

Napoli's day of delight

NAPLES, Italy, Feb 27: A penalty shoot-out took Napoli through to the Italian Cup final on Wednesday on a day of double disappointment for favourites Internazionale.

The victory, 5-3 on penalties after the two-legged tie ended 2-2 on aggregate, brought an explosion of fireworks from fans in the San Paolo stadium and revived memories of the glory days of Diego Maradona, the last man to lead the club to cup honours in 1987.

Their hero was yet again a Latin American in a number 10 shirt — Brazilian Beto who struck a goal in the 77th minute to level the second leg at 1-1 and put Napoli back on the path to a June final against Vicenza. Inter, held 1-1 in the first leg

Tagliatela from outside the area. Reduced to 10 men when striker Maurizio Ganz was sent off in the 34th minute for a foul on Francesco Colonnese, Inter had looked like resisting a Napoli onslaught diminished by poor finishing until Beto saw

his chance. He broke through and found himself alone in front of goal to nudge the ball just wide of Gianluca Pagliuca.

With the aggregate score at 2-2 after extra time and 210 minutes of soccer, the semifinal was decided when nerves got the better of Inter defender Massimo Paganin, who served up a weak penalty straight into Tagliatela's grateful hands.
