Train accident in Pakistan kills 126

ISLAMABAD. Mar 3: A runaway passenger train jumped its tracks in Pakistan's eastern Punjab province today killing at least 126 people, according to emergency rescue workers, reports AP.

Another 175 passengers were injured when the brakes failed on the express train near Khaniwal, about 400 kilometres southeast of Islamabad.

"The scene is horrific," said Mohammed Zubair, an emergency worker in Khaniwal. "Nineteen of the dead were children."

Hours after the accident occurred several people were still trapped inside the overturned railway cars, said Shamshed lobal, another ambulance worker.

"You can hear the people screaming for help, but we can't reach them," he said. "We are

SADHAPUR, Savar, Mar 3: Drastic action will be taken against those involved in the Sadhapur killing, the Prime Minister declared as the mourning villagers sought justice when she visited the spot today, reports UNB.

"Those who committed such a crime would be put to trial. The killers, whoever they may be, will be tried," said Sheikh Hasina and consoled the members of the bereaved families.

Four people were killed and nearly 50 injured on Friday when Ansars opened fire during a clash with the villagers over a dispute land.

Delhi to back Dhaka's move for IOR membership

Bangladesh has strongly pleaded for its inclusion as a member of the Indian Ocean Rim (IOR) grouping, a new alliance of littoral countries in the Asian and Pacific region. sources concerned said yester-

India has assured Bangladesh that it would move its case for membership at the IOR Foreign Minister's meeting in Mauritius this month. The assurance was conveyed by Prime Minister Deve Gowda to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina during their recent meeting in New Delhi, foreign ministry sources said. The bilateral meeting between the two premiers was held during the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) meet last month in Delhi.

Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad has also sent a let-

ter last month to his counterparts in 14 countries of the IOR alliance urging that Bangladesh be accepted as a member of the new block. It could not be learnt what was the general response but the sources said that several countries including India and Australia have indicated their support for Bangladesh's membership. Indian External Affairs

Minister I K Gujral, who would be a prime mover in the IOR Foreign Ministers' meeting in Mauritius, has also learnt to have assured his Bangladesh counterpart about backing Bangladesh's case for membership, the sources added. The First Ministerial Meet

of Foreign Ministers of 14 countries of the IOR will be held for two days in Mauritius from March 6. The meeting is due to
