Khan was made OSD at the Finance Ministry on September 16 last year. Finance Minister S A M S Kibria on September 21 accused him of "acting against national interest" while granting licences to 14 non-banking financial institutions.

HC order to let Rahim act as AB Bank MD till disposal of appeal

By Staff Corespondent The High Court yesterday directed the Board of Directors of the Bangladesh Bank not to restrain A Rahim Chowdhury, Managing Director of the Arab Bangladesh Bank, to act as the MD of the Bank till disposal of his appeal concerning an order by the central bank governor refraining him from discharging his responsibilities on December 22 last year.

After hearing a writ petition filed by A Rahim Chowdhury, challenging the legality of the Bangladesh Bank (BB) governor's order, the division bench of the High Court, comprising Justice Mainur Reza Chowd hury and Justice M A Aziz passed the order, according to a press release of the counsel of

During his stay, President Ramos will also meet the Filipino community living and working in Bangladesh at a reception at a local hotel. He would visit the Savar Na

Govt to seek \$610m Japanese aid for eight projects

Bangladesh will seek some 610 million US dollars from Japan at a consultative meeting beginning here today to discuss new development projects under Japanese aid, reports UNB.

An eight-member Japanese Consultation Mission on Official Development Assistance (ODA) loans is already in the capital to take part in the twoday meeting.

Futao Motai, Senior Assistant for Loan Aid, Economic Cooperation Bureau of the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs, is leading his country's team in the two-day consultation, billed very important by officials here.
