

Petersburg gets presidential push

MOSCOW, Mar 5: Climaxing an all-out public push by Russia to land the 2004 Olympics, President Boris Yeltsin has made a last-minute appeal to IOC chief Juan Antonio Samaranch on St Petersburg's behalf reports AP.

In a letter released by the Kremlin press service on Tuesday, Yeltsin asked Samaranch to use his influence to ensure "an impartial choice" when the finalists are named on Friday by the International Olympic Committee.


