Bright prospect for pvt sector cooperation

Manila and Dhaka have bright prospect of bilateral economic cooperation, particularly in the private sector, said Jose O Juliano, Under-Secretary of the Department of Trade

and Industry of the Philippines.
"This is an excellent time for us to strengthen our trade and investment relations," he said while addressing a discussion meeting at the conference room of the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and In-

dustries in the city yesterday.
Organised by the FBCCI, the function was presided over by its vice president Kazi Shafiqul Islam. Roberto Lesaca Garcia of Petrochemical Development Corporation (PNOC), Andres Soriano of San Miguel Corpora-

tion also spoke on the occasion. Juliano told the FBCCI meeting that there were ample scope for joint venture projects be-

tween the two countries. "We are offering a good package of incentives and we have well-trained manpower and better infrastructural facilities for the overseas investors," he

pointed out. He said his country was offering 'build, operate and transfer (BOT) facilities for joint venture project in different

countries. Juliano, who is leading a 25member delegation also described the reforms in the Philippines towards economic

liberalisation. The delegates who attended the meeting represented the engineering, telecommunications. leather and footwear, utilities, computer training, food processing, ship-building, petro-

chemical, power and other sec-

Juliano told that entrepreneurs of the Philippines might import Bangladesh's leather and leather products. cattle feeds and other items. He said Bangladesh could import electronics, textile, food and

beverages, etc from his country. Juliano later told the journalists that two memoranda of understanding - one for developing infrastructure and the other for setting up a computer training school in Bangladesh - might be signed today (Thurs-

Welcoming the Filipino businessmen, FBCCI vice-president Kazi Shafiqul Islam apprised them of the incentives and liberal investment facili-

ties available in Bangladesh. He said the investors of the Philippines could take the advantage of facilities being offered by Bangladesh for setting up of joint venture industries or of their own.

Islam particularly invited the entrepreneurs of the Philippines to invest in setting up of composite textile mills, pisciculture, leather and footwear, and horticulture sectors.

He also mentioned floriculture, light engineering, electronics, toy-making, sports goods, jewellery, hotel and con vention centre and tourism as potential sectors.

He suggester to constitute a monitoring and follow-up committee consisting of the members of both the countries to achieve a positive result in this regard.
