The two-day sixth annual scientific conference of ICDDR,B began in the city yesterday with a call for launching a vigorous campaign for preventing the spread of sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) in the country, reports BSS.

Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University, Prof AK Azad Chowdhury inaugurated the conference, dubbed as 'Ascon vi', and urged all concerned to give much more attention to preventing the spread of such diseases.

With the director of ICDDR,B Prof Demissie Heble in the chair, the function was also addressed, among others, by ODA representative Dr Mehtab Currey and representative of UNAIDS Dr Lisa Messersmith.

Dr Sarah Hawkes of ICDDR,B gave the vote of thanks while Dr Q Monir Islam of WHO and Prof David Mabey of London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine gave lectures on reproductive tract infections and sexually transmitted infections respectively.

Dr Chowdhury stressed on the need for creating widespread awareness, particularly among the women, about the aftermath of such killer diseases as HIV/AIDS.

"The real picture of HIV/AIDS is yet to be discovered in Bangladesh due to cultural barriers," he said, urging the ICDDR,B authorities to take up a plan to pursue study in this field as they have successfully done on diarrhoeal diseases over the decades.

A total of 52 scientific papers and 30 posters were pre-

sented at the conference by the researchers of the centre, government of Bangladesh and NGOs. As many as 225 delegates and participants are attending the conference, divided into ten technical sessions.

In his welcome address, Prof Demissie Heble said reproductive tract infections and sexually transmitted infections were incurring high morbidity particularly among the women — nearly 80 per cent — because these two factors enhance the transmission of HIV.

The control of reproductive tract infections is one of the most important interventions against HIV and AIDS, while it is also important for the health of women and their newborns.

Heble said the centre has recently embarked upon setting up of laboratory facilities to test for HIV.

The two-day conference will include presentations as well as sharing of views on public health and epidemiology, behavioral aspects, child health, financing and delivery of health services, developments in diarrhoeal disease research and the reproductive aspects.

Obituary

Shireen Akbar, Head of Adult and Community Education Unit of the Victoria and Albert Museum, died in London yesterday after a prolonged illness. She was 54, says a press release.

Shireen Akbar was awarded MBE in the Queen's Honours List in 1996 in recognition of the role she played to enable the V&A to break new grounds in widening links with the community, especially the South Asian community.

For over 15 years, she organised a number of exhibitions on non-traditional themes. 'Woven Air' — an exhibition celebrating the Kantha and Muslim traditions of Bangladesh — was held at the White Chapel Art Gallery, London in 1988. In the same year, she was commissioned by the British Museum to make a collection of rickshaw paintings. She was also responsible for setting up the Nehru Gallery National Textile Project at the Museum of Mankind in 1991. In 1994, she was invited to curate the exhibition at the Fukoka Art Museum of Japan.

Shireen Akbar was born in Calcutta. She obtained a masters degree in English literature from Dhaka University, and completed advanced studies at Cambridge University. She worked for the Inner London Education Authority from 1971 to 1988.
