Lankans in dire straits

DUNEDIN, New Zealand, Mar 8: Sri Lanka were in serious trouble at 78-4 replying to New Zealand's first innings total of 586-7 declared at the end of the second day of the first Test here today, reports AFP.

New Zealand opener Bryan Young scored an unbeaten 267 as his team posted its second highest innings total in Test cricket.

The first innings declaration, at the tea interval, denied Young the chance to become the first New Zealand batsman to score a triple century in a Test match.

Martin Crowe came very close six years ago when he scored 299 against Sri Lanka in Wellington, when New Zealand achieved their highest Test total of 671.

New Zealand resumed their innings today on an overnight 343-4 and immediately lost the

wicket of night watchman Daniel Vettori.

But Chris Cairns came in to score 70 and Dipak Patel put on 30 runs against an inadequate Sri Lankan bowling attack as New Zealand worked for a total which would ensure they could not lose the match.

At close of play, Sri Lanka were in very real danger of losing the first Test after Simon Doull took three wickets and Heath Davis one to leave the tourists struggling.

Sri Lanka's most successful bowler was Chaminda Vaas. The seamer returned with a figure of 4-144.

The tourists began their innings badly when Sanath Jayasuriya was bowled without scoring by Doull when he got an inside edge and then Doull removed two more batsmen, Marvin Atapattu and Roshan Mahanama, both leg before wicket.

The experienced Aravinda Silva played at a wide delivery from Heath Davis and was caught by Dipak Patel in the gully.

Sri Lanka resume their devastated first innings Sunday with Arjuna Ranatunga on 13 and Hashan Tillekeratne on seven.

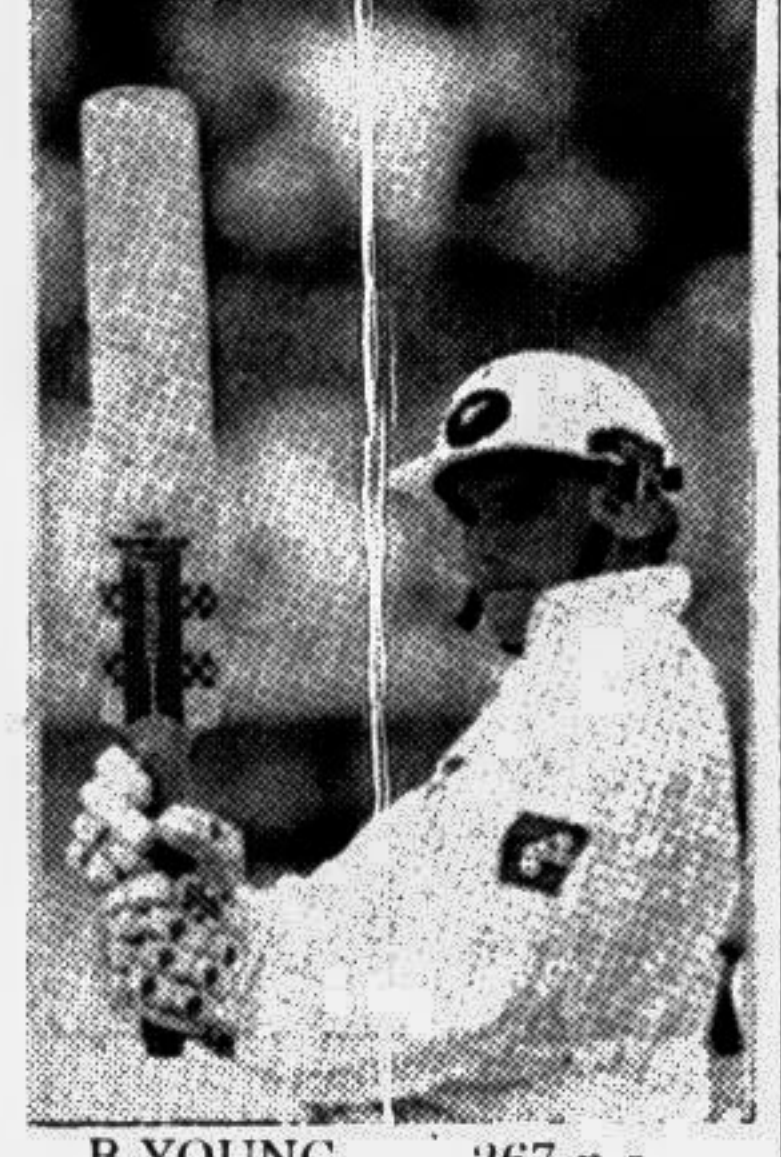

World Cup qualifiers

Koreans down Kiwis

KUALA LUMPUR, Mar 8: Asian giant South Korea edged closer to the finals when they downed New Zealand 2-1 on the third day of the ninth World Cup hockey qualifier played here today, reports AFP.

South Korea virtually assured themselves a place in the World Cup proper in Holland next year when they overcame the gritty Kiwis in a close match to enable them to lead the Group B with an unbeaten record.

The hard running Koreans exhibited skillful and speedy performance to keep a clean slate in three matches with two in hand.

Six teams from here move to Holland with the semifinals in the 12-man qualifier here automatic choices, with the remaining two slots to be decided over classification matches.

South Korea now have nine points while New Zealand, who missed the last two World Cups, share six points with Argentina and Belgium. The weakest team, Belarus have yet to collect a point.

Shin Seok Kyo scored the winning goal for South Korea in the 46th minute when he picked up a pass from Kang Keon Wook and unleashed an energetic shot past rooted Kiwi goalkeeper Scott Anderson.

Kang Keon Wook himself set the ball rolling when he fired the opening goal in the 25th

Two English clubs fined

LONDON, Mar 8: English First Division clubs Norwich and Crystal Palace were each fined 40,000 pounds (64,000 dollars) on Friday for a mass on-field brawl involving their players in a league match in December, reports Reuter.

The two clubs must each pay 10,000 pounds (16,000 dollars) of their fines now with the remaining 30,000 pounds (48,000 dollars) suspended until June of next year when it will be waived if there are no further similar offences.

Both clubs issued unqualified apologies to the Football Association (FA) and admitted a charge of "failing to control their players."

Norwich said all of their players on the field at the time had already been fined.

Betting on soccer in China soon

BEIJING, Mar 8: Chinese sports authorities are considering a plan to allow legalised gambling on soccer matches, officials said on Friday, reports Reuter.

Under a proposal by the state sports commission, punters could buy tickets betting on winners and losers as well as differences in goals scored in matches of China's professional soccer league, a commission official said.

"It is like horse racing people buy the lottery tickets then choose the team they think will win," the official said without giving further details.

Gambling is still a sensitive issue in China and the plan has not yet received all the necessary approvals.

Seville to try again

SEVILLE, Spain, Mar 8: Leaders of Seville's bid to host the 2004 Olympics have vowed to try again after learning on Friday that their candidature was not among the five cities short-listed to host the Games, reports Reuter.

"Sevilla brings together the conditions and should continue in the race. I believe possibly the nearness of Barcelona (host city in 1992) has been a determining factor," said Mayor Soledad Becerril.

Istanbul, Lille, Rio de Janeiro, San Juan, Seville and St Petersburg failed to make the cut.

Mark rewrites the mark

SCOTTSDALE, Arizona, Mar 8: Chris Woodruff topped third seed Carlos Moya, Jonas Bjorkman upset fourth seed Albert Costa and Mark Philippoussis boomed the hardest serve ever clocked on the ATP Tour at the 328,000 dollars Arizona men's tennis tournament Friday, reports Reuter.

Australian Philippoussis was known for his big serve. But now on, he will be known for the biggest serve of all.

The towering 20-year-old, nicknamed "scud" for the explosive missiles he delivers from the service line, unleashed a serve Friday that was clocked by radar at a record-breaking 142 miles per hour (228.5 kph).

"I knew it was big but I didn't know it was that big," said Bjorkman.

Evert Cup tennis

INDIAN WELLS, California, Mar 8: Fifteenth seed Chanda Rubin ousted fellow American Amy Frazier 6-3, 4-6, 7-6 (8-6) in a marathon first-round match Friday at the 1.25 million dollars Evert Cup, reports Reuter.

All five seeds in action on the opening day — Rubin, 16th seed Lisa Raymond, 12th-seeded Elena Likhovtseva of Russia, 13th-seeded Nathalie Tauziat of France and 14th-seeded Ruxandra Dragomir of Romania — won their matches.

The top eight seeds all received a first-round bye. Spaniards Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario and Conchita Martinez were the unexpected top two seeds, injuries having forced Steffi Graf, Monica Seles and Mary Pierce to withdraw.

Two youngsters who have received international attention — 15-year-old Russian Anna Kournikova and 16-year-old American Venus Williams — were also in action Friday.

The 89th-ranked Kournikova defeated 60th-ranked Tour veteran Patricia Hy-Boulais of Canada 1-6, 6-1, 6-4.

A qualifier into the main draw, the 211th Williams posted an easy 6-2, 6-4 win over 48th-ranked Anne Miller.

The two-hour, 32 minute match between the 25th-ranked Rubin and 31st-ranked Frazier saw both players have difficulty asserting themselves through three sets as tedious to play as to observe.

Schalke earn full points

FRANKFURT, Mar 8: VfL Bochum lost to Schalke 04 Friday 0-1 in the Bundesliga, reports AP.

The lone-goal of the game came at the 72nd minute when Schalke's Yves Egenrauch fired a fierce shot into the left corner from 22 metres out.

Schalke, coming off a first-leg quarterfinal win over Valencia this week in UEFA Cup play, dominated throughout the game before some 34,000 spectators.

Bochum's best chance came at the 52nd when national player Dariusz Wozniak hit the post on a free shot from just outside the box.

"It felt extremely smooth and effortless," the Australian said of the biggest of his 17 aces in the 73-minute match.

Costa said he was frustrated over his inability to hold serve. He lost serve five of 12 times, including the final three. "The match makes me crazy," he said.

Woodruff admitted his two-hour, nine-minute baseline battle against Moya, the Australian Open finalist, was a dog-fight until finally notching his third career victory over a top 10 player.

"It takes a lot to beat a top player," said Woodruff. The world's 64th-ranked player after moving into his first semifinal of the year. "You can't just sit back there and let him dictate. You have to take your chances. I was just going for my shots under pressure."

Woodruff got the decisive break in the eight game to go ahead 5-3 when the Spaniard's inside-out forehand went long. He served out the match without any trouble.

"It's awfully tough to serve out a match against a top guy like that," said the American, who fired in 10 aces. "But you have to beat the top guys if you're going to do anything out here."
