Bangladesh completed their threematch exhibition rubber against the visiting Karachi Electric Supply

Corporation (KESC) with an impressive all win record when they handed the mediocre Karachi outfit a six-wicket defeat at the Dhaka Stadium yesterday.

Chasing a fighting Karachi total of 221 in the stipulated 50 overs, the strong Bangladesh batting line-up rattled up the required 222 for the loss of four wickets and with 14 balls to

Although the hosts won the match quite comfortably, it was Arif Mehmood who stole the lime-light with a blazing 95 off only 64 balls.

After a disastrous start with Karachi reeling at 89 for seven. Arif, who came into bat at number nine, led a spectacular rescue act with skipper Zafar Ahmed. Together the pair put on 116 runs for the eighth wicket to guide their side from mire to a fighting total.

Zafar Ahmed, who played the sheet anchor role, scored a captain's knock of 54 off 105 balls which included a quarter of fours.

But it was Arif Mehmood, whose pyrotechnics offered some sort of excitement among the handful of local cricket fans in an otherwise one-sided and mundane affair. The hard-hitting right hander clouted half a dozen sixes and seven fours in his chancy yet highly enterprising innings. Dropped twice by the butter-fingered Bangladeshi fielders, Arif, raced on to complete his 50 off 47 balls. He then plundered 45 runs off only 16 deliveries in the last five overs punishing each and every bowler disdainfully. He flayed Athar thrice and right-arm seamer Saiful once. But it was slow left-arm spinner Enamul against whom Arif clouted two successive sixes over midwicket; the second one travelled all the way out of the big bowl after a couple of bounces. This was some sort of a feat considering that no one had ever hit the ball out of the two-storied stadium earlier.

Arif was eventually out in the last over of the innings when he went for another big hit for an elusive three-figure mark. Arif's brilliant batsmanship later earned him the manof-the-match award.

Bangladesh, who once again produced some bizarre fielding and bowling especially in the slog overs, had also dropped as many as four regulation catches.


But the batting, however lived up to expectations with openers Athar Ali Khan and Naimur Rahman Durjoy putting on 69 runs in only 10.5 overs. 

Franklyn Rose became the fifth West Indian to take five wickets here Saturday — but India were Ganguly and Mongia shared still making a fight of it when 81 for the sixth wicket in just play ended on the absorbing third day of the first cricket Test at Sabina Park Saturday,

reports AFP. Urged on by a patriotic crowd of around 8,000, the 25year-old Rose, who hails from the rural district of St Ann's on this island's north coast, finished the day with five wickets for 79 from 26 overs.

However, the fortuitous pair of Nayan Mongia (74 not out) and Sunil Joshi (23 not out), frustrated West Indies for two hours until the close in an unbroken eighth wicket stand of 60 which brought to an end a riveting contest between bat and ball.

India, responding to West Indies' first innings total of 427, had reached 308 for seven at stumps.

Both batsmen were fortunate to have survived having been dropped in successive overs.

Joshi, had made 15 when he skied a ball from Carl Hooper to deep mid-on where Rose running back failed to grasp the chance.

And Mongia, after hitting 67, swung a full toss from Shivnarine Chanderpaul to midwicket where captain Courtney Walsh muffed a simple chance.

Through it all, Mongia, whose sights are now set on completing a second Test century, and Joshi, equalling his best score in the solitary Test against Australia at Delhi last year, showed the kind of resolve which was expected from the top-order batsmen but was sadly lacking - especially before lunch when Rose shook the match to life.

Capitalising on the platform provided for him by the economical bowling of Curtly Ambrose and Walsh in the first 45 minutes and helped by poor shot selection. Rose mown down the top-half of the Indian batting in a devastating sevenover spell before to the interval.

V Laxman and Rahul Dravid, the overnight pair when India were 108 for one, were unflappable prior to their separation. Unable to gain the breakthrough after he and Ambrose called upon the combined experience of 613 wickets in 152 Tests, Walsh turned to Rose who responded with a four-wicket burst in the space of 22 balls.

With the last ball of his first over in the spell and seventh overall. Rose breached the defences of Laxman — whose 64 in almost four hours contained six boundaries - with a ball that moved back to extract the legstump.-

As usual, the spring returned to the West Indies' step, and as usual, they were deadly with Rose taking wickets in three consecutive overs.

It brought to an end a second wicket stand of 95, but the crowd was soon to be thrown into a state of delirium when Rose captured Dravid and opposing captain Sachin Tendulkar in 12 balls. Dravid, who hit five fours in

a 43 which lasted 202 minutes, top-edged a flat-footed cut at the wide, first ball of Rose's 10th over to wicketkeeper Junior Murray, and Tendulkar disappointed many of his fans around the Caribbean when he was bowled by the last ball of Rose's 11th over to bring his nervous innings of seven to a climax. Fresh from three centuries

in his last six Tests and India's most decorated batsman, Mohammad Azharuddin might have been expected to halt the slide, but a reckless flat-footed drive to the wide, fourth ball of Rose's 12th over gave Brian Lara a chest-high catch at first slip. The former Indian captain made five.

Blewett hits another ton


