Earlier, on Wednesday, another Bangladeshi shooter Mohammad Afzal lifted the gold medal in men's 177 air rifles while Saiful Alam Chowdhury Rinku took the event's bronze. The two shooters also shared the event's team gold.

On the first three days, Bangladesh secured four golds, one silver and one bronze medal.

The meet will conclude on Saturday.

Imran was the most successful Mymensingh bowler who captured five wickets for 30.

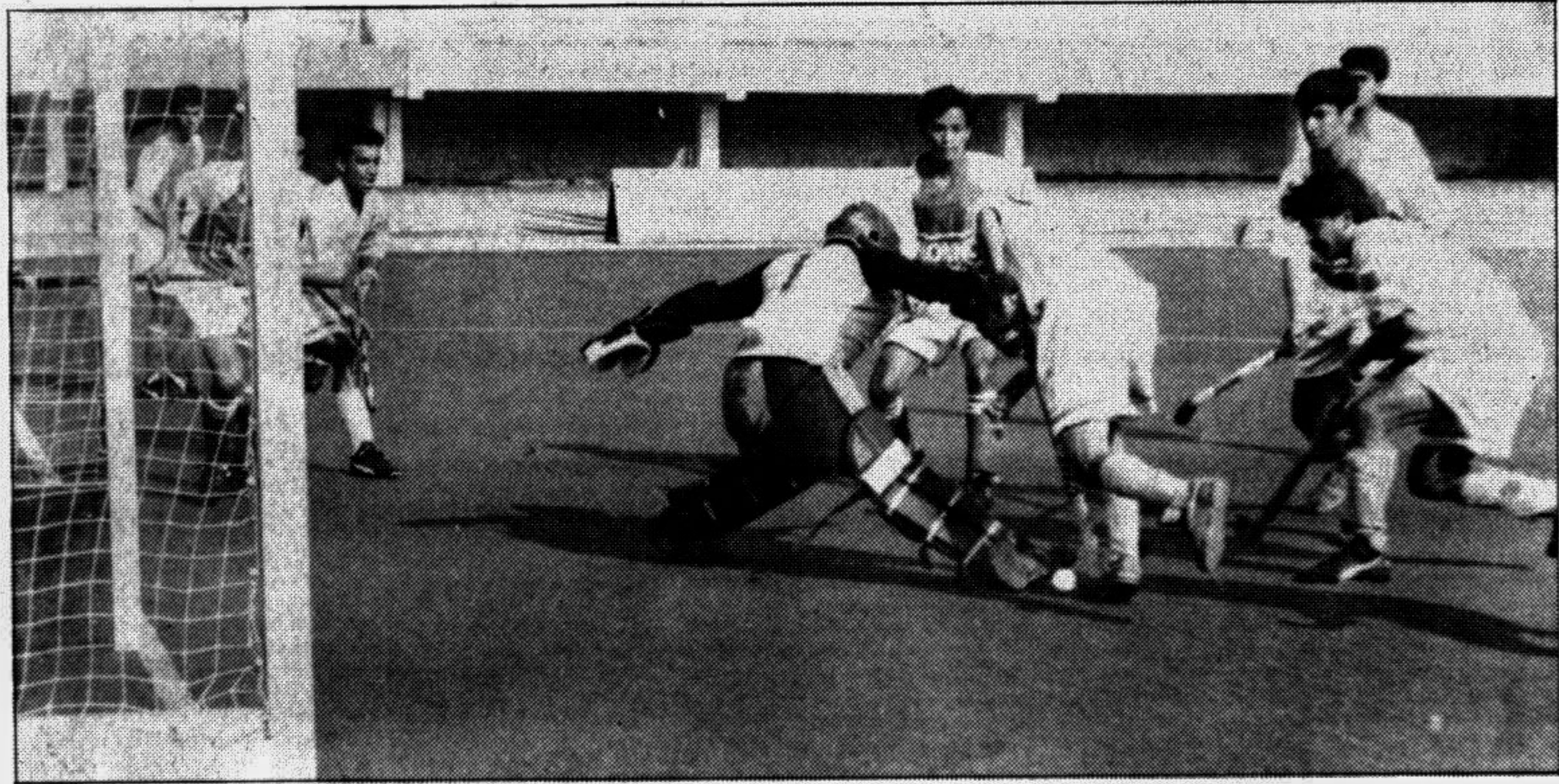
Mymensingh will join defending champions Narayan-ganj, runners-up Khulna and five others zonal champions in the final round scheduled to begin in the capital from March 20.

Tasmania right on target

SYDNEY, Mar 13: Tasmania, needing an outright result to ensure playing Western Australia in next week's final, were in a strong position after the opening day of their Sheffield Shield cricket match with New South Wales here today, reports AFP.

At the close, David Boon's Tasmanians were 370 for four, bolstered by an innings of 143 by opener Jamie Cox and half centuries from Ashes tour hopeful Ricky Ponting and Michael Divenute. Boon was 48 not out.

Cox has scored 1,224 first-class runs this season and became the first player to pass the 1,000-run Shield milestone this summer.

Tasmania are four points ahead of Queensland, who bowled themselves into a promising position after being dismissed for a moderate 277 by champions South Australia on the first day of their match in Brisbane.

At stumps, South Australia, bottom of the standings, were a shaky 26 for three with Adam Dale taking 2-9 and Michael Kasprovic 1-12 in 15 hostile overs.

Earlier, paceman Brendan Creevey scored a career best 48 not out to lift Queensland from 196 for six to 277. Queensland must beat South Australia outright to have any chance of playing in this season's final.

In Melbourne, an unbeaten 90 by Shawn Craig lifted second-last Victoria to 205 for nine at the close of their match against finalists Western Australia.

Brendon Julian was the pick of the West Australian bowlers, destroying the top order to grab three wickets, while Jo Angel was also impressive in snaring three wickets.

Western Australia are 10 points clear at the head of the standings and will host this season's final in Perth next week.

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB), especially its president Saber Hossain Chowdhury and his dynamic deputy Syed Ashraf Haque, have done things so far exceptionally well in leading cricket towards

its desired goal.

But, like every battle, the future of our cricket lies with the men to be in the middle of the big occasion. Neither the Board nor the enthusiasts would be of any help if our cricketers fail to fight it out. Cricketers have already proved that at least they do not run short of potentials. May be they lack a bit of big-match temperament, did not practice as much they should do. But, perhaps, no one would deny the fact that odds are still in favour of our cricketers as a few of the participating twenty-one associate member nations are at par with Bangladesh both in terms of experiences and skills.

Dedication and determination to the cause will make a world of difference in Bangladesh's mission in Malaysia. Do remember the bravery of Sri Lankans who only with their dedication and team spirit have taken the whole world by storm. The ordinary islanders virtually compelled the snobbish lords of world cricket to salute its enviable transformation.

So, success never bestows on any one, it is meant to be snatched away. And we sincerely believe that our cricketers would leave no stone unturned to do us proud.

Taylor fit to play against SA
PORT ELIZABETH, South Africa, Mar 13: Australian captain Mark Taylor has recovered from a back injury and will be fit to lead his team in the second Test against South Africa beginning in Port Elizabeth on Friday, reports Reuters.

"He has had no adverse reaction after a full rest and fielding practice this morning and will definitely play on Friday," coach Geoff Marsh told reporters on Wednesday.

Taylor has been suffering from the injury (muscle spasms and pain in lower right side of the back) since last Friday morning when he was forced to pull out of Australia's three-day match against Border in East London.

He has been severely limited in his movements since then.

"He's basically been swimming, stretching and lying flat on his back for the last three or four days, which may explain why he felt a bit light-headed after the practice. But he is fine," Marsh said.

Taylor underwent surgery on his back last year and was ruled out of the game for two months, but the latest problem is thought to be unrelated to his previous injury.

Australia hope to clinch the three-Test series in Port Elizabeth after winning the first Test in Johannesburg last week by an innings and 196 runs.

Cricketers ready to take off

Bangladesh cricket team is set to leave the capital in the early hours on Saturday to take part in the sixth International Cricket Council (ICC) Trophy, scheduled to begin in the Malaysian capital of Kuala Lumpur from March 24.

The ICC Trophy, a qualifying tournament of the non-Test playing associate member nations, will feature 22 teams, who splitting into four groups, will fight it out for the top-down three slots in the next World Cup to be held in England 1999.

Bangladesh, one of the few firm contenders for a place in the ivy league of nine Test playing nations, is going to renew its bids to attain the ultimate desire after their five previous abortive attempts.

Prior to their departure, the tour manager of the 20-member Bangladesh team, Gazi Ashraf Hossain Lipu has sought the blessing from the countrymen for a successful mission in Malaysia.

"We seek the blessings from all so that we can translate the dream of millions in to reality," said Gazi Ashraf in a formal press briefing at the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) office last night.

While Gordon Greenidge, the West Indian coach of the national team, who along with Ashraf Haque, a vice-president of the BCB, attended the farewell meeting with the local press, offered a significant deliberation about our expectations as well as our chances in the meet.

"I think the expectation is very high. Everyone is dreaming of the success. But what I can assure you at this moment is that the boys will play positive and good cricket in every match," said the former West Indian opener.

"The SAARC tournament and three exhibition matches against the Karachi outfit have enabled us to notice the areas in need of improvement. And we have, though in the shortest period of time, tried our best to cement those loop-holes," added Greenidge in his first meeting with the press since his last appearance on the eve of the foundation SAARC cricket tournament.

But Greenidge, who advocated not to write anything which he thought would be unbecoming and effectively demoralise a player, once again expressed his dissatisfaction about the approach of the players.

"What the boys need is to apply themselves properly. I don't understand why they are so reluctant to bat out the 50 overs," said Greenidge adding that this was one thing the players must
