HAMILTON, New Zealand, Mar 16: New Zealand were on target for a second Test win over Sri Lanka at two days play remaining, report agencies.

At the close of the third day the Sri Lankans were 305 behind the New Zealand total with only eight wickets in hand.

New Zealand, who made 222 in their first innings were all out in their second innings during the final session Sunday for 273. Bryan Young top scored with 62 while skipper Stephen Fleming (59) and Nathan Astle (52) also contributed half-centuries.

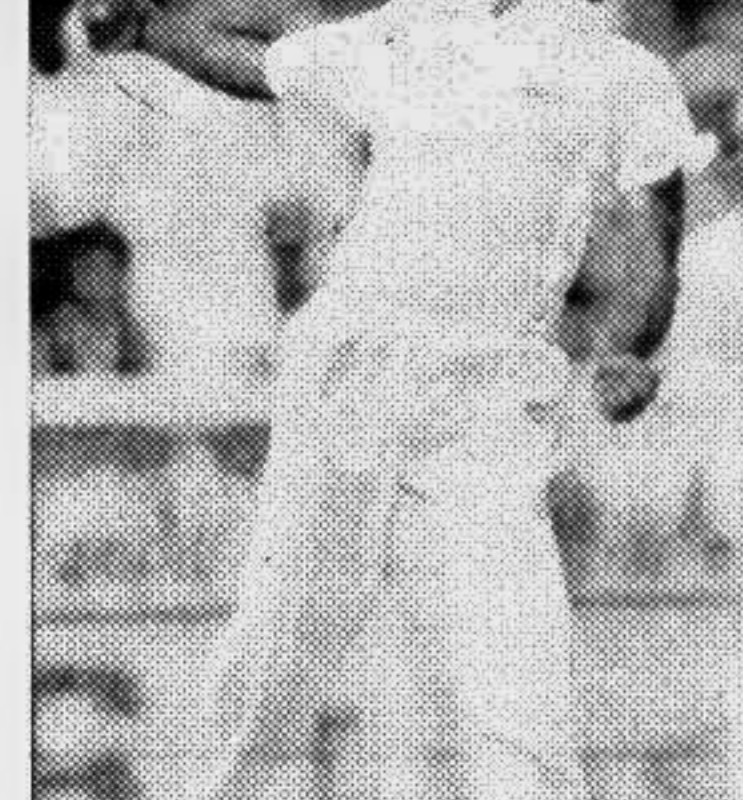

Chang-Ulihrach showdown

INDIAN WELLS, California, Mar 16: Third seed Michael Chang beat second seed Thomas Muster of Austria 6-1, 7-6 (7-1) Saturday to earn the chance to defend his Champions' Cup title, against surprise finalist Bohdan Ulihrach, reports Reuter.

The unseeded and 43rd-ranked Czech posted a 6-3, 6-2 victory over unseeded and 35th-ranked Jonas Bjorkman of Sweden. By virtue of his semifinal success Ulihrach should move into the top 30 in the ATP rankings.

Ulihrach has had a dream week. He ended Pete Sampras' 20-0 match winning streak in the second round here. But instead of being overwhelmed by his second career victory over the top-ranked Sampras, Ulihrach's continued his winning ways.

"You cannot look past his results this week," Chang said of Ulihrach, whom he has never played. "Although Bohdan is not a top 10 guy at this particular time, he's had great results."

Muster and Chang came into the match with identical win-loss records this year of 15-2. Each had won one title in four tournaments played this year, each has won one Grand Slam, the French Open.

Prior to Saturday's match, Muster had won five of their six encounters. But the normally tenacious Muster had problems getting around the court, which put him at the mercy of Chang.

Five-nation hockey Olympic champs extend run

KARACHI, Mar 16: Two short corner hits by Bram Lomans and a field goal by skipper Stephen Veen helped favourites Holland to a 3-2 win over Australia in the opening match of the five-nation tournament here today, reports AFP.

The win allowed the current Olympic champions to keep their 20-plus match winning streak since losing 4-1 to India in January 1996.

The match opened at a fast pace and Australia took an initial lead in the fourth minute when Stephen Davies, recalled to the side after missing the Champions' Trophy last year, made a weaving run and passed the ball to Baeden Choppy who scored.

The Dutch equalised in the 16th minute when on their third short corner Lomans scooped the ball to the top left of the net.

Australian skipper Jason Stacy regained the lead for Australia in the 28th minute from a set-piece and the underdogs stayed 2-1 up at the breather.

The Netherlands dominated play after half-time, scoring through Lomans in the 49th minute and then Veen on a move from left field in the 55th minute.

Dutch coach Roland Oltmans said his side missed the services of Jacques Brinkman, who was about to become a father, and Tuen de Nooijer who was unavailable because of exams, but they still had an edge with penalty corners.

Riley better own mark

ADELAIDE, Mar 16: Former world record-holder Samantha Riley clipped half a second off her Olympic 200-metre breaststroke time here Sunday and started talking of regaining her world crown, reports AFP.

Australian Rebecca Brown, who holds the world record, was left in fifth place today and was put on notice that her two minutes 24.76 seconds record will be one of Riley's main aims over the next 12 months.

"I'm nowhere near 100 per cent fit so if I can do that sort of time now I know I can get back down there," said Riley who touched in 2:27.43.

"I know I have the ability to swim faster than the world record," she said.

Riley finished in 2:27.91 in the Olympic final won by South African Penny Heyns in 2:25.41.

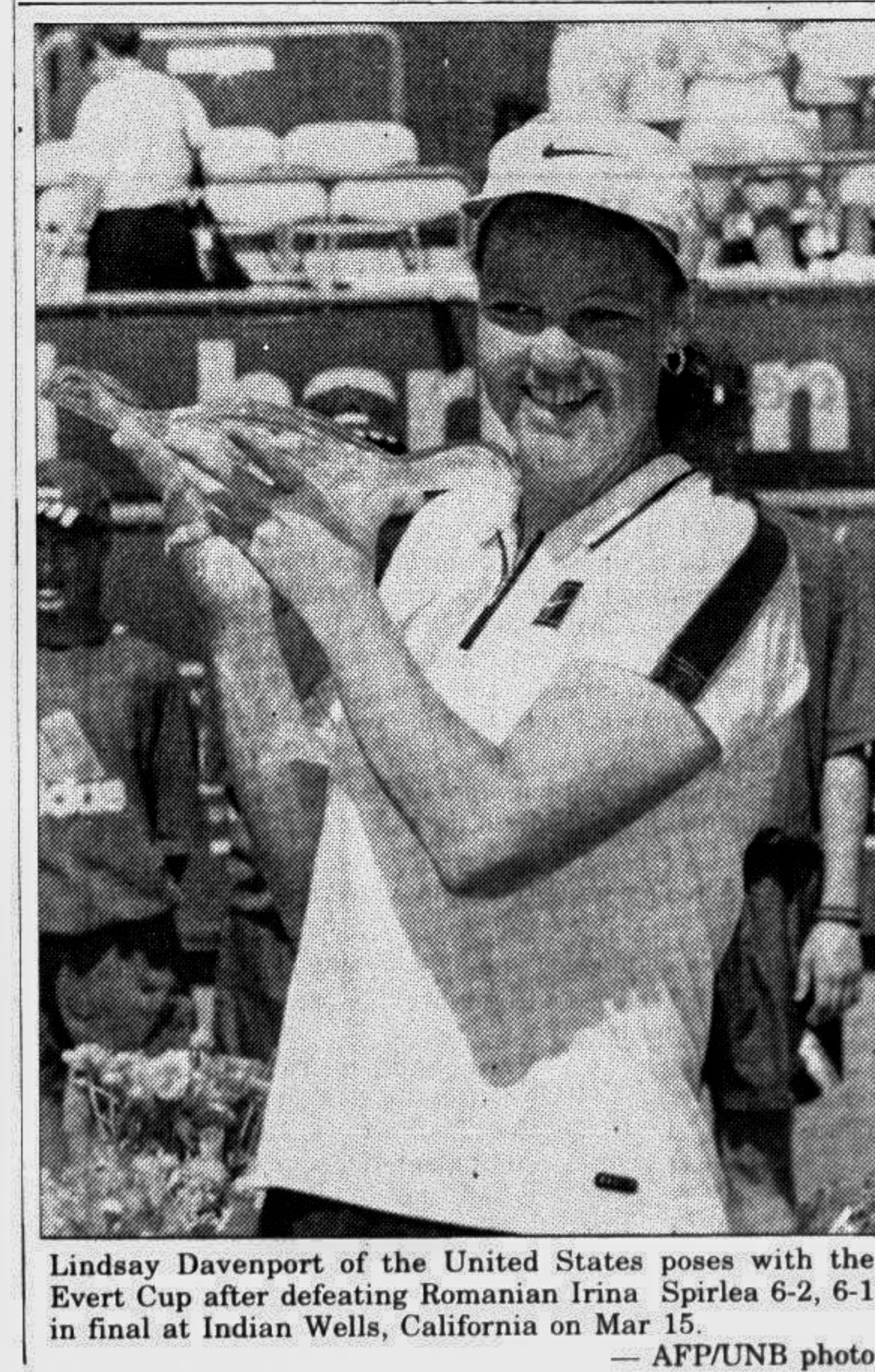
