


Golota-Mercer bout May 16

NEW YORK, Mar 20: Controversial Polish heavyweight Andre Golota is to fight former Olympic heavyweight champion Ray Mercer on May 16 in Madison Square Garden, it was announced here on Wednesday reports AFP.

The 29-year-old Golota, who was disqualified twice for hitting former undisputed world heavyweight champion Riddick Bowe with low punches despite being ahead on points, said he would behave himself against Mercer because he played by the rules unlike Bowe, who was the dirtiest fighter in the world.

"The gloves were off against Bowe but Mercer's not that kind of guy. I've never seen him do anything illegal in a fight," said Golota, whose record stands at 28 wins with 25 inside the distance and the two defeats to

The 35-year-old Mercer, who won gold at the Seoul Olympics while Golota won bronze in the same division, warned Golota that he would not allow him to play dirty.

"He cheated against Bowe and I hope he has fixed his problem. If no it then I will,

Mercer said. Mercer, who only took up boxing at the age of 22 when he was an infantryman so he could avoid a gruelling 30-day winter survival exercise, will be a stern test for the pole as he lost narrowly on points to current World Boxing Council champion Lennox Lewis in a heavyweight bout last May.



SAF Games fate uncertain

The eighth South Asian Federation (SAF) Games, scheduled to begin in the Nepalese capital of Kathmandu from September 20, is almost certain to be delayed, at least till April 1998.

According to a faxed message

received here yesterday, it was learnt that the organisers Nepal Olympic Committee (NOC) has expressed their inability to complete the necessary preparations for holding of the biennial regional extravaganza within the stipulated time. The regional sort of Olympic Games include the seven SAARC nations - Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Nepal, Bhutan, Maldives and Sri Lanka. It was gathered that if the NOC suggest for a change in the schedule. they would have to ratify the existing bye-laws which read, the Games should be organised in every two years. And for a change, it is mandatory to convene a meeting.

Booters ensure all-defeat record

Bangladesh ended their first-leg World Cup Asian Group One qualifying round with a whitewash when fancied Saudi Arabia handed them a 1-4 defeat in their last match at the Shah Alam Stadium in Kuala Lumpur yesterday.

According to a faxed message received here last night, Saudi Arabia, one of two Asian representatives in the 1994 World Cup in USA, led the first half 2-

They took the lead in the 20th minute and extended the margin ten minutes later before Bangladesh showed signs of a bouncing back with defender Jewel Rana converting a penalty four minutes from the lemon-break.

But after the breather, the strong Saudi Arabia punched in two more in within the span of eight minutes to seal the fate of the match.

It was the third consecutive defeat for Bangladesh. They had earlier conceded a 0-2 defeat at the hands of host Malaysia in their inaugural match before Chinese Taipei humbled them 3-1 in their second match. The national football team

is due to return home tomorrow. and will immediately set off on the following day for the second leg to be held in Saudi Arabia on March 23, however, with a new set of officials. In the second leg, Bangladesh will meet hosts Saudi

MLS enters 2nd season Saturday

SAN JOSE, California, Mar 20: Major League Soccer (MLS) begins its second season of trying to establish the sport in the United States here Saturday when San Jose play hosts to the New York-New Jersey Metrostars, reports AFP.

The host clash will be without scoring leader Eric Wynalda who will be playing for the US national team in a World Cup qualifying match at Costa Rica on Sunday. Wynalda scored the first goal

in MLS history here last year off an assist from Nigeria's Beniroha who wound up scoring the league's 500th goal last September off a pass from Wynalda. The Metrostars, missing in-

jured Tab Ramos, are guided by Carlos Alberto Parreira, the man who guided Brazil to the 1994 World Cup crown. Italy's Roberto Donadoni and Venezuela's Giovanni Savarese provide scoring punch. The teams to catch in most





NEW YORK, Mar 20: US Soccer organisers are planning an ambitious 1999 women's World Cup that

will dwarf the previous two 'stagrings' of the event !! tournament officials said yesterday, reports Reuter. "The first one in China was

sort of hidden away in China and in Sweden it was purposefully done very small and lowkey," US Soccer president Alan Rothenberg said of the first two

women's World Cups, held in 1991 and 1995. "This time we are going for it," Rothenberg said at a news conference to introduce members of the organising committee including former Olympic gold medalist swimmer Donna

de Varona as chairwoman. "We are going to make this the biggest women's sports tournament in our lifetime," said Rothenberg, who was the head of the men's World Cup held in the United States in 1994. The women's World Cup is

scheduled for June 20-July 7. Sixteen teams will play, with only the host US team, the 1991 champions, assured of spot. Defending champions Norway will have to qualify. When the United States first won the right to stage the event,

organisers envisioned a small tournament played in four cities all located in the American northeast. "Our thinking was to hold a small event and have a nice lit-
