Holland, Pakistan reprimanded

KARACHI, Mar 20: Olympic champions Holland and world champions Pakistan have been reprimanded by the tournament director for violating rules of the five-nation hockey tournament, officials said late Wednesday, reports AFP.

Both teams drew 3-3 after a fast paced acrimonious match here on Tuesday.

Three Pakistani players were sent off and the Dutch coach Roelant Oltman went on to the field to protest over a foul on his players.

Tournament director Carlos Hernandez Schaffer of Mexico told the news agency that the letters had been issued after watching the video of the match and long discussions with the umpires.

The letter issued to the Dutch coach states that his players had contravened rule 13.2 of the tournament which requires players on the bench to behave properly.

The Dutch coach has also been reprimanded for violating rule 13.4 which prohibits a coach to enter on to the field at any moment "under any circumstances."

The letter to Pakistan manager Tariq Aziz says it was observed in the match against Holland that Pakistani players indulged in rough play which unnecessarily retarded the tempo of the game.

Both these letters have been issued to ensure discipline or otherwise in any subsequent eventuality disciplinary proceedings may be taken against players for any future lapses. Carlos warned.

The tournament director refused to comment on umpiring during the match which Pakistani coach had termed as "biased."

"The umpires have the final say," he remarked.

No comments were immediately available from the umpires or officials of the two teams.

Becker's denial

MUNICH, Germany, Mar 20: Three times Wimbledon champion Boris Becker denied today he had left his native Germany for good and said he and his wife Barbara had not yet made any such decision about their future, reports Reuters.

Becker added that he had done nothing wrong from a tax point of view and said the behaviour of tax investigators, who raided his Munich house in December, would not play a role in such an important decision.

"Suspensions that it had turned my back on Germany are false, my wife and I have not yet made any such decision," Becker said in a statement released by his lawyer in Munich.

"We would not make such an important decision dependent on the behaviour of the financial administration, whose proceedings up to now in disprove of," Becker said. "I have done nothing wrong from a tax point of view and I am sure that will be recognised by the financial authorities."

Becker's statement came after the German media reported on Monday that he was leaving Germany for good with his wife and son Noah, 3, and flying to Florida to live there.

Ajax, Juve set to clash

PARIS, Mar 20: The 1995 European Cup winners Ajax qualified for a revenge semi-final with Juventus, who beat them on penalties in the 1996 final, on Wednesday as they pulled off a brilliant 3-2 win over Atletico Madrid — the match finishing 4-3 on aggregate, reports AFP.

Juventus beat surprise Norwegian side Rosenborg 2-0, 3-1 on aggregate, while Borussia Dortmund, the only one of the four semifinalists not to have won the European Cup, will meet Manchester United after the German side beat Auxerre 1-0, 4-1, on aggregate, and United held Porto to a scoreless draw, going through 4-0 on aggregate.

Nigerian winger Tijani Babangida scored Ajax's third, and his third of the campaign, in the last minute of extra-time, making the Spanish champions pay for Argentinian striker Juan Ensaider missing a 75th minute penalty.

Babangida's effort sets up Ajax with the chance of reaching their third successive European Cup final and possibly winning their fifth European Cup.

Atletico, searching for their first European trophy since the 1962 European Cup Winners Cup, had a glimmer of a hope when 30-year-old Yugoslavian midfielder Milinko Pantic had levelled the scores at 2-2 with a penalty in the 108th minute.

Ajax's former West Ham Portuguese forward Dani struck their second goal in the 100th minute with a wonderful curling effort from 25 yards, which was his third of the campaign.

Ronald de Boer, one of only six Ajax players remaining from the team that won the 1995 European Cup, had pulled Ajax level four minutes into the second half, heading home

Jari Litmanen's cross past Atletico keeper Francisco Molina.

Atletico had taken a 29th minute lead through their 24-year-old striker Kiko, who scored his second goal of the European Cup campaign with a shot from inside the box that took a deflection and left Ajax keeper Edwin van der Saar stranded.

Juventus made heavy weather of their win over Rosenborg, with a freak goal by Frenchman Zinedine Zidane in the first half and a late penalty from Nicola Amoroso, after the Norwegian had a man sent off.

Juventus only needed a 0-0 draw to go through but Zidane set them on their way when goalkeeper Jorn Jantfall's clearance cannonned off by the midfielder into the net.

Amoroso, who had missed a string of chances during the match, made no mistake from the spot kick in the 88th minute after Stale Stensaas was shown the red card for bringing down Juventus substitute Attilio Lombardo.

Marcello Lippi's men had the lion's share of the possession and looked clearly the better side, while Rosenborg failed to show the creative skills they had shown earlier.

Lippi was still marvelling at Zidane's goal after the match, admitting, "I've never seen a goal like that at this level. It was a bit special."

"We had a very good first half, but we let them play a bit, much in the second. It wasn't a night for really re-creative football but I'm happy with the result and team performance."

Looking ahead, he added, "It's harder to keep the Cup than win it for the first time. But we hope to go right through to the end, even though it's going to be difficult."

Borussia Dortmund delivered a performance of chilling efficiency to beat Auxerre with

Lars Ricken scoring the German side's goal just past the hour as Auxerre became the first French champions to fail to reach the semifinals of this competition for five years.

Dortmund's midfield general Andreas Moeller, who scored the clinching penalty against England in the Euro '96 semi-final, set up Ricken 25 yards out and his low shot deflected off an Auxerre defender past Charbonnier to kill the tie.

Guy Roux's side, who lost a UEFA Cup semi-final to Dortmund on penalties in 1993, endured another night of frustration against an unforgiving German defence expertly directed by 1996 European footballer-of-the-year Matthias Sammer.

Dortmund's only blot was a second-half booking for Sammer, which rules him out of the semifinal first leg.

"We have achieved our objective of the semifinals but now we have the great challenge at taking on Manchester United," Dortmund coach Ottmar Hitzfeld said.

Manchester United's triumph meant they became the first English club through to the semifinals since Liverpool in 1985.

United are now just who ties away from winning their second European Cup, adding to their 1968 success, a superb 4-1 victory over another Portuguese side Benfica at Wembley.

Their 4-0 thrashing of Porto in the Old Trafford first leg had virtually killed off the tie and Antonio Oliveira's team were not upto the task of even scoring a goal.

United had the best chance of the match in the 22nd minute when Beckham curled in a 35-yard freekick, which just went over the bar.

"I didn't think we were brilliant, but we did a professional job," United coach Alex Ferguson said.

Sydney Games cut short

NEW YORK, Mar 20: Boxing, wrestling, and weightlifting face cutbacks for the Sydney Olympics, according to an IOC memo obtained by the Associated Press. A spokesman for one of the sports called the changes "drastic."

The document, recently circulated to Olympic officials, appeared to be the first step in determining how the International Olympic Committee would try to squeeze in more sports and more countries while keeping the total number of athletes from soaring far beyond 10,000.

The memo, called "Intermediate information concerning the Olympic programme" for the 2000 Summer Games, said weight categories for wrestling and men's weightlifting each would be reduced from 10 to eight.

There also would be a "change in the number of weight categories" in boxing, the memo said. "I'd say they're going to knock a few weight classes off," a boxing official said.

No details were included in the one-page memo from the IOC's headquarters in Lau-

sanne, Switzerland.

IOC officials were unavailable for comment. Sports director Gilbert Felli was away from his office in Lausanne, while a message left for director general Francois Carrard were not returned.

Other officials said the reductions had been approved by their sports' international federations, and the new rules already were in effect in at least one sport.

Consolidating weight classes is an automatic way to pare a sport. By trimming the number of classes, officials hope to cut the number of athletes, since large countries often enter an athlete at each weight.

As the IOC tries to keep the schedule of the games more contemporary and add women's sports, it also is concerned about the field getting too big for host cities to afford.

Last summer's Atlanta Games featured the most women athletes, with females making up more than one-third from the competitors, and the IOC says it wants to move that split toward 50-50 in the next few games.

But the Atlanta Olympics also attracted more athletes

(10,744) from more countries (197) than ever, and the IOC and Sydney organizers have set the ceiling for 2000 at 10,200 athletes.

Weightlifting, which will add women's events in 2000, was told by the IOC that its total number of competitors had to be no more than 250 and the men's classes were changed for the third time in five years, according to Anthony Bartkowski, a spokesman for USA Weightlifting.

The new figure, incorporating men and women, is only six lifters more than the 244 who competed in the men's tournament in Atlanta.

Wrestling already is using the new weight classes in both freestyle and Greco-Roman tournaments, said Gary Abbott, a spokesman for USA Wrestling.

"We lose six medals in each style, 12 medals lost," Abbott said. At USA Boxing, executive director David Lubing was awaiting details from the International Amateur Boxing Association. But the national federation said the size of the boxing tournament at the Olympics almost surely would decrease.

Graf's fourth in a row

KEY BISCAYNE, Florida, Mar 20: Germany's Steffi Graf won an unprecedented eighth women's tennis 'player-of-the-year' award Wednesday during ceremonies here, reports AFP.

The selection, made by a global media panel, moves her past the record of seven she shared with Martina Navratilova. It was the fourth year in a row and eighth time in the past decade Graf has taken the honour.

Graf went 54-4 last year and captured seven tournament titles, including Wimbledon, the French and US Opens and the WTA Championships.

The only other finalist for the honour was 16-year-old Martina Hingis, the Swiss phenomenon who will replace the injured Graf as world number one in the next rankings.

Hingis was named the WTA's most improved player. Retired Navratilova won the tour service award given by the WTA.

Argentina's Gabriela Sabatini, who retired last year, was given the 'aces-award' Capriotti, recovering from drug and legal



problems, was named the WTA's comeback player-of-the-year.

Indonesia's Yayuk Basuki won the tour sportsmanship award.

Monica Seles did not win but she did appear with Andre Agassi and basketball coach Pat Riley to open a restaurant of which they are part owners. She then worked out in preparation for the 1.75 million-dollar Lipton Championships that open today.

PSG's moment of truth

LONDON, Mar 20: (AP) Swedish side Aik will try freezing Spain's Barcelona out of the Cup Winners Cup.

In Italy, Fiorentina coach Claudio Ranieri is feeling the heat, under fire from all sides to bring home a trophy.

That's half the story in Thursday's Cup Winners Cup second-leg quarterfinals. The other half sees defending champions Paris Saint Germain on the verge of being eliminated by AEK Athens and English side Liverpool with a chance to make their biggest headline since winning the European Championship 13 years ago.

Barcelona go to Solna Aik — a city just a few miles from Stockholm — leading 3-1 off the first leg two weeks ago. They should expect a frigid reception.

"We can only pray the forecasted weather of minus-6 Celsius will have an impact," said Aik general manager Stefan Soderberg. "The Spaniards are not used to playing under such harsh conditions."

Aik are expected to attack from the start and look for punch from Pascal Simpson, who scored in the first leg. Central defender Krister Nordin will be out with a suspension.

In Spain, where the temperatures are hovering in the mid 20s, Barcelona manager Bobby Robson has a healthy side for freezing Sweden.

"We have been told that the field is in bad condition and

that it is very cold there," said Barcelona midfielder Guillermo Amor. "But we'll take our coats with us and it will be all right."

"The most worrying thing is the cold," added team captain Romanian George Popescu. "To go from 25 degrees to 10 below zero is a big difference and it'll be difficult to adapt."

In Italy, Fiorentina are up 2-0 on Portugal's Benfica and looking for a cup to salvage what has been a disappointing league season. Team owner Vittorio Cecchi Gori sent an open letter to the club this week, published in a Florence newspaper, chastising them for a 2-0 loss to AC Milan.

Personally, I feel like the team is putting forth its best," said under-threat coach Ranieri. "Maybe it's blocked psychologically. In the cup it plays freely, but in league play it feels constrained by the (standings)."

Fiorentina will rely on Argentine star Gabriel Batistuta, who scored in the first leg. Francesco Baiano, the other scorer two weeks ago, and Brazilian-born Belgian international Luis Oliveira are likely to flank Batistuta.

Benfica, in a tailspin after two straight league losses, will probably field the same team it did in the first leg.

"It is going to be very difficult for us to overturn the deficit, but nothing is impossible in soccer," said Colombian defender Jorge Bermudez.

PSG — in the midst of a lackluster season — look set to go out after scoreless draw at home to AEK Athens. Greek coach

Petros Ravousis, sensing his team is on the verge of making the semifinals, is expected to start three offensive-minded players: Christos Costis, Demis Nicolaidis and Daniel Batista.

"You have the opportunity to make all Europe speak about you," the sports daily SportTime quotes Ravousis as telling his players.

Liverpool, who have won the Champions Cup, four time and the UEFA Cup twice but never the Cup Winners' Cup, will have the home turf advantage against Norwegian side Brann and their key striker Tore Andre Flo.

The English side's Norwegian midfielder Stig Inge Bjornebye said the thick, lush grass at Liverpool's Anfield stadium should favour the home team and strikers Steve Manaman and Robbie Fowler.

"It was a bad pitch in Bergen, but that suited their game as they launched the ball," Bjornebye said. "I am sure it will be different tomorrow as the Anfield surface helps our passing game, although we know we cannot afford to be complacent."

"Brann is a well-organised side, strong physically and the two lads up front are dangerous," he added.

Brann will still be without midfielder Jan Over Pedersen and goalkeeper Birkir Kristinsson, who were inadvertently left off the officials list for the Cup Winners' Cup. The two dropped threats to file suit against the club after reaching a cash settlement.

Portugal in hot water

LONDON, Mar 20: The British government is demanding an urgent report from the Portuguese authorities after Manchester United fans were injured in violent clashes with police in Porto, reports AFP.

"We are concerned of reports of injuries to a number of fans, seven of whom received some hospital treatments," said a foreign office spokesman today.

"We have also been told by injured fans that their injuries were caused by police batons and rubber pellets. We are urgently seeking a full police report on the events," he added.

Officials in Porto said 20 British supporters and five policemen were injured but Portuguese police deny using rubber bullets.

"The fans were injured by bottles and stones. They were also injured when they tried to force their way into the stadium," said police chief Dellfilm Passos.

But according to Sao Joao Hospital staff who treated the injured, several of them had wounds caused by rubber bullets.

A hospital spokesman said only one supporter would remain under observation. The rest would be able to catch their flights back to Manchester.

The first outbreak of violence began shortly before the European Champions' Cup quarterfinal second leg match between Manchester United and Porto kicked-off.

Thousands of English fans had arrived in the city without tickets and scores of others had forged tickets.

Police said trouble broke out when the Manchester fans began to try and force their way into the Das Antas Stadium.

They apparently had forged tickets and the police refused to let them join their fellow supporters," said United secretary Ken Merritt. "But, eventually
