Holland, Pakistan reprim anded

KARACHI, Mar 20: Olympic champions Holland and world champions Pakistan have been reprimanded by the tournament director for violating rules of the five-nation hockey tournament, officials said late Wednesday, reports AFP.

Both teams drew 3-3 after a fast paced acrimonious match here on Tuesday.

Three Pakistani players were sent off and the Dutch coach Roelant Oltman went on to the field to protest over a foul on his players.

Tournament director Carlos Hernandez Schaffler of Mexico told the news agency that the letters had been issued after watching the video of the match and long discussions with the umpires.

The letter issued to the Dutch coach states that his players had contravened rule 13.2 of the tournament which requires players on the bench to behave properly.

The Dutch coach has also been reprimanded for violating rule 13.4 which prohibits a coach to enter on to the field at any moment "under any circumstances.

The letter to Pakistan manager Tariq Aziz says it was observed in the match against Holland that Pakistani players indulged in rough play which unnecessarily retarded the tempo of the game.

"Both these letters have been issued to ensure discipline or otherwise in any subsequent eventuality disciplinary proceedings may be taken against Carlos warned. 155 Y sint fails

Becker's denial

MUNICH, Germany, Mar 20: Three times Wimbledon champion Boris Becker denied today he had left his native Germany for good and said he and his wife Barbara had not yet made any such decision about their future, reports Reuter.

Becker added that he had done nothing wrong from a tax point of view and said the behaviour of tax investigators, who raided his Munich house in December, would not play a role in such an important deci-

"Suspicions that it had turned my back on Germany are false, my wife and I have not yet made any such decision,' Becker said in a statement released by his lawyer in Munich.

"We would not make such an important decision dependent on the behaviour of the financial administration, whose proceedings up to now in disapprove of," Becker said. "I have done nothing wrong from a tax point of view and I am sure that will be recognised by the financial authorities."

Becker's statement came after the German media reported on Monday that he was leaving Germany for good with his wife and son Noah, 3, and flying to Florida to live there.

KEY BISCAYNE, Florida, Mar 20: Germany's Steffi Graf won an unprecedented eighth women's tennis 'player-of-theyear' award Wednesday during ceremonies here, reports AFP.

The selection, made by a global media panel, moves her past the record of seven she shared with Martina Navratilova. It was the fourth year in a row and eighth time in the past decade Graf has taken the honour.

Graf went 54-4 last year and captured seven tournament titles, including Wimbledon, the French and US Opens and the WTA Championships. The only other finalist for

the honour was 16-year-old Martina Hingis, the Swiss phenomenon who will replace the injured Graf as world number one in the next rankings. Hingis was named the WTA's

most improved player. Retired Navratilova won the tour service award given by the WTA. Argentina's Gabriela Saba-

LONDON, Mar 20: (AP): Swedish side AIK will try freezing Spain's Barcelona out of the Cup Winners' Cup.

In Italy, Fiorentina coach Claudio Ranieri is feeling the heat, under fire from all sides to bring home a trophy. That's half the story in

Thursday's Cup Winners' Cup second-leg quarterfinals. The other half sees defending champions Paris Saint Germain on the verge of being elim-inated by AEK Athens and English side Liverpool with a chance to make their biggest headline since winning the European Championship 13 years

Barcelona go to Solna AIK a city just a few miles from Stockholm — leading 3-1 off the first leg two weeks ago. They should expect a frigid reception.

"We can only pray the forecasted weather of minus-6 Celsius will have an impact," said AIK general manager Stafan Soderberg. "The Spaniards are not used to playing under such harsh conditions."

AIK are expected to attack from the start and look for punch from Pascal Simpson. who scored in the first leg. Central defender Krister Nordin

will be out with a suspension. In Spain, where the temperatures are hovering in the mid 20s. Barcelona manager Bobby Robson has a healthy side for freezing Sweden.

"We have been told that the field is in bad condition and that it is very cold there," said Barcelona midfielder Guilermo Amor. "But we'll take our coats with us and it will be all right."

"The most worrying thing is the cold," added team captain Romanian Gheorghe Popescu. "To go from 25 degrees to 10 below zero is a big difference and

it'll be difficult to adapt." In Italy, Fiorentina are up 2-0 on Portugal's Benfica and looking for a cup to salvage what has been a disappointing league season. Team owner Vittorio Cecchi Gori sent and open letter to the club this week, published in a Florence newspaper. chastising them for a 2-0 loss to AC Milan.

dre Flo. The English side's Norwegian midfielder Stig Inge Bjornebye said the thick, lush grass at Liverpool's Anfield stadium should favour the home team and strikers Steve Mc-Manaman and Robbie Fowler.

only one supporter would remain under observation. The rest would be able to catch their flights back to Manchester. The first outbreak of violence began shortly before the

European Champions' Cup quarterfinal second leg match between Manchester United and Porto kicked-off. Thousands of English fans had arrived in the city without

tickets and scores of others had forged tickets. Police said trouble broke out when the Manchester fans began to try and force their way

into the Das Antas Stadium. "They apparently had forged tickets and the police refused to let them join their fellow supporters," said United secretary

frontations broke out after the

match. According to Passos, the Manchester United supporters refused to follow police instructions and wait for an escort before leaving the ground.

As the fans tried to leave the ground police fired tear gas and made baton charges to break up the crowd.

Earlier in the day five Manchester United fans deported by Portuguese participation and three others arrested after a

series of clashes. Police said two people, a student and a 57-year-old man, were treated in hospital after

being attacked by Manchester supporters. One fan was briefly arrested after kicking a police car.

Security in the city had been stepped up to cope with the 10,000 Manchester fans and British police had helped identify known trouble makers.
