Dutch-German showdown

KARACHI, Mar 21: Hosts Pakistan failed to find the winning way as their crucial match in the five nation hockey tournament

against Germany ended in a 3-3 draw here today, reports AFP. European champions Germany with seven points from three matches qualified for the final along with the Netherlands who also have seven points from three matches.

The final of the tournament, being played to celebrate the golden jubilee celebrations of Pakistan's independence, will be played on Sunday.

The crucial nature of the match made the tussle absorbing right from the start. Pakistan, needing a win to remain in contention for the final. dominated the first half but a calculated game by Germans outlasted the hosts in front of a 10,000 strong vociferous crowd.

A spurned penalty stroke in the second half by Tahir Zaman and several other missed chances saw the home team finishing at level scores for the third time in row. Pakistan had earlier finished 1-1 with England and 3-3 with Holland. Both teams defended their

territory well in the initial stages. Pakistan had two penalty corners in the first 10 minutes but German goalkeeper Christian Schulte save Danish Kaleem's hit on both occasions. Pakistan in their runner-up

finish in the December 1996 Champions' Trophy had beaten Germany 4-2. In the meeting at Atlanta Olympics last year Germany had downed Pakistan

Pakistani forwards assaulted rampaging attacks and scored two goal in the space of six minutes. Right-out Mohammad Ali was fouled in a goal scoring position by Christian Philip.

Tahir Zaman safely converted the resulting penalty stroke, pushing the ball high in the left corner. Mohammad Shahbaz nodded in the second goal after a goal-mouth scram-

Germany reduced the deficit in the 31st minute when on their third penalty corner Bjorn Michel slotted home a fine push.

Pakistan led 2-1 at breather. Soon after the resumption the Germans brought more thrust to their attacks. Steffan Saliger's Chaun found Oliver Domke in the circle who with the first time reverse hit made the score 2-2. That came about

in the 40th minute. Nine minutes later the same duo was involved in Germany's third goal

Their one-two tactic gave Christoph Bechmann a goal scoring pass whose push was saved by a Pakistani defender on the line. Kai Haollonsteiner beguilled Pakistani custodian on the push to make it 3-2 for Germany.

Pakistan soon hit back and on their fourth penalty corner were rewarded with a penalty stroke but Zaman faltered with the stroke, hitting the top bar. Valiant attempts for an

equaliser by Pakistani defend ers bore fruit just two m from time and on an indirect attempt on the penalty corner Pivot Kamran Ashraf levelled the scores 3-3.
