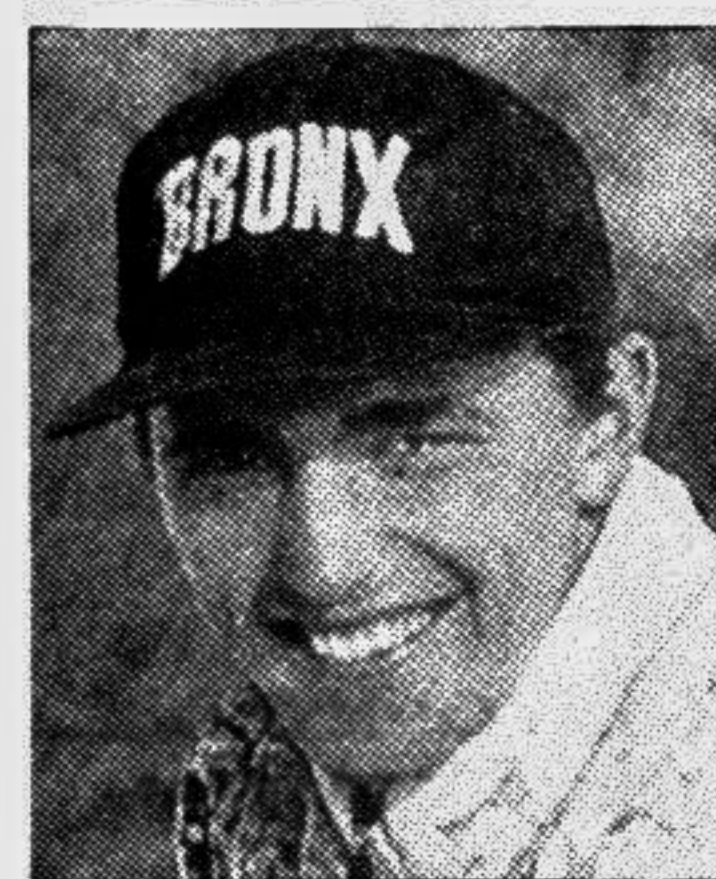

Romania names soccer squad

BUCHAREST, Mar 23: Romania coach Anghel Iordanescu named 14 overseas-based players in a 20-man squad on Friday for World Cup qualifiers against Liechtenstein and Lithuania, reports Reuter.

Midfielders: Gheorghe Popescu, currently with Barcelona, will miss both games because of injury.

Undefeated Romania leads Group Eight with nine points from three matches. They play Liechtenstein on March 29 in Bucharest and Lithuania away on April 2.

Man United extend lead

LONDON, Mar 23: Manchester United showed no signs of a hangover from their visit to Porto when they beat Everton 2-0 at Goodison Park on Saturday to open up a six-point lead at the top of the English Premier league, reports Reuter.

United had failed to win in the league immediately after their last five matches in the European Cup but they were never seriously troubled by a pedestrian Everton side who were always second-best in the spring sunshine.

The home team were not helped by reserve goalkeeper Paul Gerrard making errors for both goals.

He was slow to get down to Ole Solskjaer's 35th-minute opener and then completely missed the ball when he came out to cut out a cross which Eric Cantona converted for United's second after 79 minutes.

United had lost only twice at Goodison in the last eight seasons and, while never playing at their best following their European Cup quarter-final success over Porto, they were always too good for the home side.

Duncan Ferguson, who had never previously been on the losing side against United lost that record but was lucky to stay on the pitch after appearing to elbow David May in the face in the first half which earned him only a yellow card.

United moved on to 63 points with seven matches to

play. Second-place Arsenal meet third-placed Liverpool at Highbury on Monday, both have 57 points.

Most interest on Saturday was focused on the bottom end of the table.

Middlesbrough, who had not lost at home to Chelsea since 1931, maintained that record with a 1-0 victory thanks to a second-half goal from Brazilian Juninho, who has scored four times in the last five matches.

The match, a possible FA Cup final rehearsal, produced Middlesbrough's fourth successive league win and took them out of the bottom three for the first time since December.

Their position will be even healthier if an inquiry next Wednesday decides to restore the three points deducted from their total in January after they refused to play a match at Blackburn because of injuries and illness.

West Ham also boosted their chances of avoiding the drop with a 3-1 win at fellow strugglers Coventry who slipped back into the relegation zone for the first time since December.

Coventry, who have never been relegated since they moved up to the top division in 1967, scored first through Dion Dublin but two goals from John Hartson and one from Les Ferdinand's young cousin Rio Ferdinand, gave the Hammers the points.

It was also a good afternoon for worried Derby who had slipped into the relegation dog-

fight after winning just two of their last 15 league matches.

They raced into a 2-0 lead against Tottenham after only 22 minutes through Robbie van der Laan and Paul Trollope but Spurs fought back with goals from substitute Ronny Rosenbhal (29) — his first in the league for three years — and Jason Dozzell (50).

Derby then regained the initiative with two goals in two minutes from Dean Sturridge (68) and substitute Ashley Ward (69) to in 4-2.

Former England international Chris Waddle made his debut for Sunderland, the team he supported as a boy, but could not inspire them to victory against fellow strugglers Nottingham Forest, the team which almost signed him from Bradford last week.

Kevin Ball scored from a Waddle corner to put Sunderland ahead after 61 minutes but Des Lyttle saved a point for lowly Forest with an 86th minute equaliser.

Southampton stayed bottom after being held to a 2-2 draw at home by Leicester, who came back twice to save a point.

Norwegian striker Egil Ostentad put the Saints ahead after 32 minutes, and Emile Heskey scored Leicester's first equaliser a minute after half-time. Two minutes after that Dutch defender Ulrich van Gobel made it 2-1 to the home side but Leicester got a share of the points when Steve Claridge equalised after 70 minutes.

African soccer scene

JOHANNESBURG, Mar 23: Tunisian club Etoile Du Sahel staged a remarkable recovery this weekend to reach the second round of the African Cup Winners' Cup, reports AFP.

The 1995 CAF Cup winners trounced Etoile Filante of Burkina Faso 4-0 in the eastern town of Sousse to overcome a three-goal deficit from the first leg two weeks ago.

Imed Ben Younes opened the scoring after 29 minutes, Riadh Jelassi added a second before half-time and Younes struck again in the opening minute of the second half.

With the teams level on goal aggregate, the Tunisians continued to press forward and Brazilian Carlos Perreira converted a 62nd-minute penalty to settle the tie.

In another dramatic encounter, Express of Uganda were eliminated from the Champions League despite scoring four times at home to Caps United of Zimbabwe.

The east Africans won 4-2 in Kampala only to go out 7-8 on aggregate having lost the first leg 5-2 in Zimbabwe, where they trailed by five goals at one stage.

After an even first half which finished 1-1, Express scored twice within 10 minutes midway through the second pe-

riod to raise hopes of a sensational triumph.

But Morgan Nkathazo, hat-trick hero of the first clash, grabbed a second goal for the Harare pharmaceutical company club before Ali Semyalo completed the scoring.

The resurgence of Chadian clubs continued in N'Djamena where Ascot defeated Africa Sports National 2-1 although the Ivorians progressed 4-2 on aggregate.

Expensively-assembled Africa Sports face Primeiro Agosto in the second round of the Champions League after the Angolans snatched a last-gasp win in Botswana.

A penalty shootout against Notwane was looming until Pedro Rodrigo struck and 88th-minute goal to give the visitors a 2-1 victory following a drawn first leg.

CAF Cup holders Kawkab Marrakech survived the first obstacle in defence of the trophy by beating ASC Linguere 1-0 in Senegal through a first-half goal from Yani Chikhli.

Marrakech, the first Moroccan winners of a competition for national league runners-up, won at home by the same score and face Cotonsport Garoua of Cameroon next.

The East African derby in the same competition proved disappointing with regional champions AFC Leopards of Kenya romping to a 3-0 victory over Simba from Tanzania.

Goals from David Odhiambo and John Lichuku inside 25 minutes reduced the eagerly awaited showdown to a one-sided contest as Leopards toyed with their old rivals.

Julius Berger of Nigeria and Mansoura of Egypt will clash in Cup Winners' Cup following comfortable home victories and Royal Armed Forces of Morocco also advanced despite losing in Mali.

Rattanapol retains title

SARABURI, Thailand, Mar 23: Thai champion Rattanapol Dutchbooygim retained his world mini-flyweight title Saturday with a fourth round knockout of number four contender Luis Doria of Colombia, reports AFP.

Early in the fourth round, the International Boxing Federation champion in the 105-pound-limit class landed a powerful right hook to Doria's head, dropping him for an eight-count.

Bacrot enters chess annal

PARIS, Mar 23: At 14, Etienne Bacrot of France became the youngest-ever chess Grand Master after sharing victory in a tournament at Enghien-les-Bains near Paris on Saturday, reports agencies.

Born on January 22, 1983, Bacrot obtains the title of International Grand Master at the age of 14 years and two months. The previous record was established in January 1994 by the Hungarian Peter Leko, who gained the title at 14 years and four months.

"He's much stronger than world champion Garry Kasparov was at the same age," said Bacrot's coach Jossif Dorfman, who was also Kasparov's analyst. Bacrot began playing at the age of four.

During the ninth and final round of the Enghien tournament, Bacrot beat the Canadian Grand Master Kevin Spraggett. That made him joint winner with the Swiss veteran Viktor Korchnoi, whom Bacrot beat in the first round.

Cesare's roster

ROME, Mar 23: Top Italian League striker Filippo Inzaghi and young Juventus forward Cristiano Ronaldo were the two newcomers called by coach Cesare Maldini Saturday for the Italian national team's next World Cup qualifying matches, against Moldova and Poland, reports AP.

Inzaghi, 23, earned a place in the list of 22 players announced by Maldini by scoring 18 goals in 24 league games with low-ranked Atlanta of Bergamo.

Vieri, also 23, tallied decisive goals for Juve in recent league and Champions' Cup matches as he was fielded as substitute for injured Croat star Alen Boksic.

The list made public by Maldini on the eve of the league's 25th round of games included Italian expatriates Christian Panucci, of Real Madrid, Gianfranco Zola and Roberto Di Matteo of Chelsea and Fabrizio Ravenelli of Middlesbrough.

Italy, who lead the Group Two standings following their upset victory against England at Wembley last month, take on Moldova in Trieste on March 29 and Poland at Chorzow on April 2.

Michele Padovano, centre-forward of league leaders and defending European champion Juventus, was another unexpected name in the list of 22 led by AC Milan and national team captain Paolo Maldini — the son of the coach.

Cesare Maldini, who succeeded Arrigo Sacchi, made a triumphant debut on the Italian bench in a World Cup qualifier as Italy downed England 1-0 on a goal by Zola on March 29.

Maldini did not immediately announce the eleven he plans to start against Moldova, beaten by the "Azzurri" 3-1 in the first leg match.

Dubai WC track notes

Juggler, the Gai Waterhouse-trained dollars hope had his first taste of the Nad Al Sheba Racecourse in preparation for the 4,000 Dubai World Cup, sponsored by Emirates, Juggler, the 1996 Cox Plate (Gr1) winner who flew into Dubai on Thursday morning, took in his new surroundings as he huckered for 2,400 metres around the track, says a press release.

Bijou d'Inde, the Mark Johnston-trained Dubai World Cup runner, had an easy workout with a steady canter around the course ahead of his stablemate and Dubai Duty free challenger "Gothenberg." The Gay Kelleway-trained "Sorbie Tower" cantered behind his lead horse and in front of the Gorine Barbe-trained Classic winning mare Carling.

Singspiel, the 1996 Japan Cup winner who will be ridden in the Dubai World Cup by Jerry Bailey, had a relaxed morning's exercise. The Greek representative in the Dubai Duty Free, "Bala," cantered steadily over 1,600 metres increasing the pace as he turned into the home straight.

The Clive Brittain-trained duo of "Luso" and "Needle Gun" trotted onto the course before having an easy canter over 1,600 metres. They were followed by "Formal Gold" trotted around the course with his pony before cantering over 2,200 metres, his trainer William Perry is scheduled to arrive in Dubai on Tuesday.

"Helisso," the Elle Lelouche-trained Arc de Triomphe winner, warmed up before cantering over 1,600 metres behind his lead horse Aljathaab. As the pair rounded the home turn they increase the pace breezing the final 400 metres in 24.20 second.

"Hokuto Vega" the Japanese representative, cantered over a mile before picking up the pace and breezing over the final 1,000 metres which was hand timed at 63 seconds.

The Mark Tompkin's-trained "Even Top," under Richard Hills worked along with his lead horse Time For Action.

Juve, Napoli set to clash

ROME, Mar 23: Juventus may be the Italian league leaders and 17 points ahead of 13th-placed Napoli but they will still be wary of the Naples side when they meet at the San Paolo stadium today, reports Reuter.

Experienced Juventus defender Ciro Ferrara, for 10 seasons a Napoli player, has no doubt that his old club will offer stiff opposition.

"This is a difficult game for us, I'd say our most difficult away fixture from now to the end of the season," Ferrara said. "If I'm not mistaken only Inter have managed to win at the San Paolo this year."

Napoli goalkeeper Giuseppe

Tagliapietra is an old friend of Ferrara and usually phones him before they meet in a match.

This week, however, the Napoli goalkeeper has opted not to phone his rival.

"I rang him before all the other games but we never won. Let's see how it works out this time even if I know only too well that substitutions are not enough to guarantee a win."

An expected full house of more than 75,000 spectators will generate a 1.3 million dollar gate receipt on Sunday.

In the past, this was a game which brought together the exotic skills of Napoli's Argentine Diego Maradona and Juventus' French ace Michel Platini in a clash often decisive for the title

contest.

This time the title is not at stake but Neapolitan pride is at a club unsettled by the news that coach Luigi Simoni will be leaving at the end of the season.

Juventus come into the game five points clear of second-placed Parma, with Sampdoria a further four points back in third.

Juventus, who defeated Norway's Rosenborg 2-0 in mid-week to qualify for a European Cup semifinal clash with Ajax Amsterdam, have double about have doubts about their attack.

Alessandro Del Piero is still out through injury and the club is appealing against the two-week suspension of their Croatian striker Sen Boksic, who has already sat out one league fixture.
