ATLANTIC CITY, New Jersey, Mar 31: David Reid, the only US' boxer to win an Olympic gold medal in Atlanta, opened his pro-career with a solid victory in a ballroom at the Trump Taj Mahal, reports

"I wanted to open against somebody who wants to fight,' Reid had said of why he picked Sam Calderon, who had a 10-0 record, as his first pro-oppo-

Calderon came to fight but Reid had too much power and speed and scored a unanimous four-round decision Friday night. Reid, who weighed 154

pounds, knocked down Calderon, 157 pounds, with a right hand-left hook 46 seconds into the fight. Calderon got up at four and was hurt again by a right to the head at 1:09.

Reid kept his poise and did not go wild looking for a knockout but was content to box the rest of the round.



where all the things happened and what somebody did to me was never punished," Seles said here Monday. "It's very hard to go back and feel safe again there. I think

anybody in my shoes would look at it that way too. Seles missed 2 1/2 years while recovering emotionally and physically and has no plans to play in upcoming French Open tuneups at Berlin

or Hamburg. "You have to understand my point. How do I feel safe siting in that chair again and turning my back?" Seles said.

"If somebody attacks you and you see that person, that is different, but for somebody to attack you from the back, not even seeing him and no way of defending yourself, is a totally different story."

Seles plans to play in two US events and possibly the Italian Open, and while she would not rule out ever playing in Germany again, Seles made it clear the thought of doing so again is a troubling one for her.

"I do not know, never say never in anything," She said. "But obviously the things that happened to me there, not just the stabbing but everything afterwards... how, that should keep me away. I don't know.

"For the person not to spend a day in jail for what he did to me. I don't think was fair, I do know that."

In skill terms, the world number-one player who was stabbed in Hamburg has not been seen since.

"When I don't play those 2 1/2 years, it was definitely hard on my game because I lost a lot of the ball touch that I had," Seles said.


