He said in the next few years, four companies, which had signed Production Sharing Contracts for hydrocarbon exploration in eight blocks of the country with the government were likely to invest around 500 million dollars in the gas sector

'We are hopeful about a bigger amount of investment for the remaining 15 blocks which are now open for bidding," he

added

He informed the editors that the government was setting up a private power distribution company called Power Grid Company Bangladesh in Rampura under Asian Development Bank funding.

This power gird company would be a private company owned by the PDB and it would have a private management system. "The PGCB will be a model for the PDB which will monitor if there is any improvement in power distribution. If the result is positive, we will go ahead with the idea on a greater scale," he added.

About administrative reforms, he said the World Bank is waiting for the Administrative Reform Commission to become effective to manage reform programmes as the government has accepted many of the recommendations of the report titled "Government That Works."

Regarding the erratic power sector, the World Bank resident mission chief said some corrective actions are still needed to address the system losses "if Bangladesh wants a sound and

efficient power sector." The pricing situation of gas needs to be addressed to attract more foreign investment in the sector, he suggested.

clined to receive the medal from previous governments, who were in power after the assassi nation of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, as "those regimes were against the spirit of the Libera tion War." Handing over the medal

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said that her government was trying to restore the spirit of Liberation War and give recognition to those who fought for independence.

She lamented that the nation had to pay a lot due to disunity among the pro-liberation forces and called for forging unity to build this country with

Receiving the medal, both the mother and the widow of Col Taher demanded retrial of what they alleged, 'killing' of the valiant freedom fighter.

Expressing gratitude to the Prime Minister, Dr Anwar Hossain, younger brother of Col Taher, said "Taher was killed at the instruction of Ziaur Rah-

He said public prosecutor of the conspiratorial trial A T M Afzal (now Chief Justice) also did not approve of the capital punishment to the accused (Col Taher).


Dr Anwar said the body of his brother was wrapped with a torn bed-sheet after he was hanged. "They did not show minimum respect to the hero even after his death."

Dr Saleemul Huq, Director of the local think-tank BCAS, said his organisation is also providing some assistance in the study undertaken on identifying potential of likely projects for the "Development Triangle." He added the World Bank study is headed by a reputed Harvard University academic Prof Peter Rogers. Workshops will be held in Dhaka, Delhi and Kathmandu on the subject and a preparatory meeting is due to be held in Dhaka this month.
