Launching of comprehensive AIDS awareness programme in villages suggested

A team of ICDDR, B experts suggested launching a comprehensive AIDS awareness programme in the rural areas of the country as knowledge about the killer disease is extremely low among men and women living in villages, reports BSS.

"A comprehensive AIDS educational campaign would probably be the most effective approach towards preventing an AIDS epidemic in Bangladesh," the team members said in a survey report. A survey was conducted in three thanas under Chittagong district late last

According to the study report, about 20 per cent of the females and 40 per cent of the males reported having heard about AIDS. "About 33 per cent females and 66 per cent males of those heard about AIDS could specify probable transmission mechanism of this killer dis-

ease," the report said. The survey was conducted among 1,876 married women of reproductive age and 1,506 married men. The survey revealed that awareness about AIDS was higher among the ed-

ucated than uneducated respondents. Middle-aged women or women with fewer children were more aware of AIDS than other women, it noted.

The team members, however, expressed the opinion that if participatory research methods were applied, the villagers would participate enthusiastically in mass awareness campaigns for diseases like AIDS.

Another team of ICDDR, B conducted a survey on AIDS awareness in three unions of Chakaria thana in Cox's Bazar district during the same period last year. The survey was conducted among 300 men and 300 women aged 18 to 60 years.

At least 38 per cent of the respondents in the post-intervention survey reported to have heard about AIDS compared to 19 per cent in the pre-intervention survey. The level of in-crease in knowledge was higher among males than females.

Of those who have heard about AIDS, the survey said, the knowledge of prevention was 24 per cent before intervention compared to 36 per cent after intervention.



The much awaited comet Hale-Bopp is now seen over the north-west horizon of the sky just after sun set. It has developed excellent coma and prominent tail attaining brightness upto minus 1.7 magnitude. The tail is about 30 degree long stretching upto pole star. The brightness of the comet is now at its peak it will start dimming its brightness from next week, says a press re-

The best time for observing the comet Hale-Bopp is upto 8th April because in these time moon will remain in the eastern sky. April 9, moon will rise in the western sky and the brightness of the sky comet will be interfered and much of its dazzling effects will be dimin-

The comet now lies in the constellation of andromeda, moving towards the constellation of orion to reach there by early May when the comet will be set down in the western horizon to say goodbye.

The comet Hale-Bopp is a

long orbited comet. If you want to see it again, you shall have to wait another 4,000 years only!
