

# Column One | Rain lets Bangladesh down

Bangladesh almost beat a hapless Ireland quite convincingly before the unfriendly Rain God bewildered theme midway through the Group F proceedings of the sixth International Cricket Council (ICC) tournament in Kuala Lumpur vesterday.

The rain-affected match turned from a possible triumph into a tragedy for Bangladesh as they fell foul of the controversial rain rules.

According to a faxed message received here last evening, all the four second round billings of the tourney were washed out due to heavy rain. And Bangladesh, perhaps the worst victim of the weather-forced injunction on games, had to content with one point instead of a deserving full two points as the two umpires in the middle called it off, citing the slippery outfield caused by heavy shower.

Bangladesh, who had earlier skittled Ireland out for a paltry 129, were cruising comfortably with openers Athar Ali Khan and Naimur putting on 23 runs in 6.1 overs before the rain sent them out of the crease.

The rain, a common phenomenon in this part of the world, fell for more than an hour much to the frustration of our cricketers as well as the whole cricket-crazy nations. Frustrated at being duped by rain, Bangladesh cricketers joined the groundsmen at the Royal Salenger complex in vein to make the field playing-

At one stage it seemed that the lady luck had smiled upon Bangladesh when the two umpires decided to resume the match in a bid to complete the twenty regulation overs. Bangladesh were given a revised target of scoring 66 runs in 20 overs, that is 40 runs from 13.2 overs, to win the match.

But that was not to be happened as a significant slip by an Irish fielder in the deep was more than enough to inspire the umpires calling the match abandoned after only three balls were bowled into the resumption.





## Where loyalties lie?



JOHANNESBURG, Apr 2: Africa's large band of professional footballers are in-, creasingly being

caught in a dilemma of club over country as the qualifying campaign for next year's World Cup clashes with the end of the European season, reports Reuter.

There are more than 250 African footballers who play for First and Second Division clubs in Europe, from Russia in the east to Portugal in the west, and many of them have to juggle the demands of their employers with the dreams of their

countrymen. All 20 of the African countries involved in World Cup qualifiers this weekend will be calling back players from Europe just days before vital matches in league and cup com-

petition. A poignant example is South African fullback Sizwe Motaung, who will play for his country in a vital qualifier in the Congo on Sunday and then attempt to dash back to help his Spanish club Tenerife in the UEFA Cup semifinal first leg match against Schalke 04 of

Motaung says it was a tough choice to make and has probably cost him a hard-earned starting berth for the Spanish team which he joined in Jan-

His dilemma is shared by countless African players, hard-pressed to keep their places in their club's first choice side in the wake of repeated travel back to Africa for national team duty.

This year countries are com-

peting for five World Cup berths in France next year as well as playing qualifying games for 124 places at the African Nations' Cup finals in Burkina Faso next February. Bachirou Salou, the Togolese striker who plays in Germany's

FIFA general secretary Sepp Blatter has accused players around the world of in

creasingly trying to cheat referees, reports Reuter. Writing in the April issue of FIFA News, the world governing body's monthly newsletter. Blatter also confirmed FIFA's opposition to the use of video

technology in matches. "There is, in many countries, a growing tendency to deceive the referee," Blatter said.

"When a professional star takes a dive, millions of lesser players give with him

"All players, stars, and amateurs alike, must acknowledge once and for all that they cannot expect the referee to be sympathetic to their cause when they repeatedly seek to mislead him by simulating fouls and other tricks.

"For such behaviour has name, and not a very pleasant one: cheating, and referees, for all their human fallibility, do not cheat.'

Blatter said coaches had a responsibility to make clear to their players that misleading referee "will be neither encouraged nor tolerated.'

"We should give more thought to helping referees rather than criticising them, he said. "The referee's job — and that of the assistant referees too is hard enough under normal circumstances ... but when (the referee) can no longer trust the


alright to eat fruit with some starches, such as your cereal. In fact it's better than using sugar. This chart covers the basic food combining principles.
