

# Aussies win a thriller

JOHANNESBURG, Apr 9: New cap Michael di Venuto set Australia up for an eight-run victory over a 'never-say-die' South Africa

here Tuesday, putting the tourists 3-2 ahead in their seven-match limited-overs international series, reports

Di Venuto with a career-best of 89 in only his fourth one-day international, help put his team firmly in the driving seat - 258 for seven - the highest score of the current series and a record against South Africa on the Wanderers pitch.

Even with the bat-friendly wicket, it was a tall order for the gallant home side who came tantalising close with 250 for the loss of eight wickets.

South Africa came charging out after the dinner break, with Adam Bacher (6) and Herschelle Gibbs (22) putting on a brisk 27. But the fast start ground to a

halt when they lost three wickets in the space of 11 balls — Gibbs going lbw to Adam Dale on a controversial decision by umpire Barry Lambson. When all seemed lost, how-

ever, Jacques Kallis (55) and Daryll Cullinan (53), put South Africa back into the game with a sparkling 101 run partnership that included three sixes from Kallis — two of them consecutive hits that took the score over the 100-mark. This pivotal partnership

was finally broken when Greb Blewett clean bowled Cullinan. Kallis was later caught by Steve Waugh off Jason Gillespie's

#### FIDE World Championships in December

MOSCOW, Apr 9: The World Chess Federation (FIDE) Championships will be held at two venues - Groeningen in the Netherlands and either Lausanne, Switzerland or Elista in Russia, FIDE president Kirsan Ilyumzhinov announced here today, reports AFP.

The tournament will be held from December 16, 1997 to January 8, 1998 with Groeningen serving as the venue for the

rounds up to the semifinals. The semifinals and final will take place either at Lau-sanne or at Elista.

Last year llyumzhinov, the millionaire president of the Russian republic of Kalmykia, announced that he wanted to organise annual World Championships lasting two weeks over the Christmas period, consisting of a knock-out tournament as in tennis.

He also said he wanted to reunite FIDE with the breakaway Professional Chessplayers' Association (PCA), headed by unofficial world champion Garry Kasparov. Kasparov set up the PCA in 1993 when, along with the then world title challenger Nigel Short, he refused to play under the FIDE banner.

Kasparov argued that the prize-money was insufficient, but the split in fact was the culmination of several years of antagonism towards the then FIDE president, Florencio Camponmanes of the Philip-

Anatoly Karpov — world champion from 1975 to 1985 regained his title when FIDE stripped Kasparov of his title. He retained the title at the last FIDE Championships, held in July 1996 in Elista, the capital of Kalmykia, beating the Russian-born US Grand Master Gata Kamsky.

## Woodbridge

HONG KONG, Apr 9: Australian doubles specialist Todd Woodbridge scored a facile 6-1, 6-4 first-round victory over Japan's Shuzo Matsuoka in the first round of the Hong Kong Open here on Tuesday, reports

Third-seeded Woodbridge, ranked 32 in the world, arrived in Hong Kong from Adelaide after helping Australia to a 5-0 whitewash over the Czech Republic in their Davis Cup quarterfinal tie.

Two weeks ago, 25-year-old Woodbridge and his partner Mark Woodforde won the Lipton doubles title at Key Biscayne, Florida.

"The hardest thing for me was playing singles again after two and a half weeks of doubles," said Woodbridge, who with Woodforde is ranked number one in doubles. Also through to the second

round was American Jeff Tarango, who came back from 1-4 down in the second set to beat Russian Andrei Cherkasov 3-6, 7-6, 6-0. Top seed Michael Chang, the

crowd favourite, was leading Hong Kong's Melvin Tong 3-0 in the first set before rain called a halt to the night's play.

The winner of the match will

face Tarango in the second round.

Tarango only arrived in Hong Kong at 6:30 am on Tuesday morning after playing an exhibition tournament in Texas last week featuring Boris Becker, Bjorn Borg and John McEnroe.

#### Starie extends winning streak

LONDON, Apr 9: Unbeaten David Starie became the new British middleweight champion here on Tuesday when he stopped Irish southpaw Sam Storrie in the seventh round of a scheduled 12-round contest, reports AFP.

Starie, 22, has now won all 14 of his contests since turning professional.

MADRAS, India, Apr 9: Bigserving Richard Krajicek, the top seed in the Indian Open, trounced Tomas Nydahl of Sweden in straight sets Tuesday to enter the second round, reports AFP.

Unseeded Nydahl won the ninth game holding serve to narrow Krajicek's lead at 4-5. But Krajicek wrapped up the set and the game on his big serves after surviving a double fault.

Wimbledon finalist Malivai Washington, meanwhile, flirted with disaster as he was taken to a third set in his opening match at the tournament.

The third-seeded American finally overcame Bulgarian Orlin Stanoychev 7-5, 6-7, 6-3 to enter the second round.
