But this time around in Malaysia, a happy hunting ground for Bangladesh as the triumphs of the Youth Team in 1995 and that of the national team in the ACC Trophy would suggest, our cricketers carved a niche in hearts of 120 million people with a poem of a success.

The well-deserved victory for Bangladesh also set the stage for a grand finale with Kenya, who had earlier confirmed their passage in the World Cup for the second consecutive occasion defeating Ireland in the first semifinal on April 7.

The final showdown of two worthy opponents will be held on April 12 with Bangladesh looking for a revenge of their defeat at the hands of the top seed in the 22-nation meet to accomplish their mission. Kenya had earlier defeated Bangladesh in the Fifth ICC Trophy which eventually dashed our hopes for a passage in the last World Cup, staged in

the Sub-continent last year. Dhaka yesterday turned into a city of joy. People took to the streets to celebrate an unprecedented success. From the narrow strips leading up to boulevard the ecstatic sports lovers honked the horns, sprayed coloured water and some were seen driving their cars with the red-and-green flags on rooftop. It looked like a moving kaleidoscope. The great spree of mirth was, however, considerably soured when some unruly hooligans spoiled the spirit of what should have been an occasion of spontaneous celebration through voluntary participa-

While away in Kuala Lumpur, the heroes of the country kissed the ground for the divine blessings from the Almighty after Aminul Islam clung on to a catch at point. And the 3000 strong Bangladeshis who cheered the home side all the way, invaded the pitch to join in a joyful celebration.

Although cricket buffs lost sleep at night in eager anticipation over the result, few expected an upset after Bangladeshi batsmen built commanding total of 243/7 in the stipulated 50 overs on Tuesday. Scotland opener Philip, however, gave the rank-out-

#### 6 policemen hurt in clash with dacoits in city

By Staff Correspondent At least six policemen were injured, one of them seriously, in a clash with a gang of dacoits at a filling station in Demra area in the city Tuesday night.

The gang of about six armed dacoits opened indiscriminate fire and used daggers when the police team from the Detective Branch (DB) cordoned the gang and grabbed three of its members. The gang had attempted to snatch cash from M/s Abdullah Filling Station of East Dholaipar at Demra at about 8:10 pm, police said.

Injured policeman, Ayub Ali, who was stabbed by the dacoits was operated upon at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH), Tuesday night. He is now under treatment at the hospital, police said.

The three arrested dacoits, aged between 20 and 25, were identified as Sagar Ahmed alias Badsha, 24, Sheikh Sadi, 24, and Anwar Hossain alias Khokon, police said. Police recovered two revolvers, one cut riffle, a razor and 12 bullets from them.

The police team, acting on a tip-off, was waiting around the filling station since Tuesday evening. They cordoned the dacoits when they came there in a microbus.




He also denied press reports that the SEC had blacklisted certain newspapers as regards publication of prospectus. The only instruction it gives to companies is that prospectus should be published in a widely circulated newspaper for the convenience of investors, he stressed.

Dr Rashid further said SEC does not have, as in the past, enough manpower for surveillance of the market. "There are only 10 fulltime and one part time officer in SEC. However, we are sending one surveillance officer to the DSE trading floor from December."

He also pointed out that without electronic tracking system, effective surveillance could not be ensured. "We have submitted a proposal for reorganisation of the SEC to the government. We will be able to overcome our weakness to a large extent if this proposal is accepted," he said.

### Australian DPM tells press in city

## Dhaka often subjected to unfair publicity in the western media

Australian Deputy Prime Minister Tim Fischer said that Bangladesh was often subjected to unfair and negative publicity by the western media.

"I can say that you are under wrong publicity. Good things are also happening here, for instance, the Jamuna Bridge, one of the largest bridges in the world is being constructed here," Tom Fischer said hoping that the bridge would get as much publicity as a cyclone.

Addressing a joint press conference with Commerce Minister Tofael Ahmed, Fischer said that the negative publicity often masked the real progress which have been taking place in this

Fischer left Dhaka yesterday on conclusion of his 4-day visit to Bangladesh. He was accompanied by a 19-member business delegation.

Fischer, who also holds the change of the ministry of trade said his visit was "very successful, exciting and constructive."

The Australian Deputy Prime Minister admitted that his country was a 'little bit late' compared to other countries who have already made significant presence in this region. "We are anxious to make up the lost time." He added that the coalition government of Australia had declared 1997 the year of South Asia.

Fischer assured that his country would support Bangladesh's membership in

the Indian Ocean Rim (IOR), a planned trade bloc. Australia is committed to the IOR, he added. A lot of developments are taking place in the South Asian countries and Australia is eager

to tap the potential in the region, he said. The Australian Deputy Prime Minister said that the MOU signed on child labour last year has eliminate child labour from the floors. 
