Govt hopes to sign PSCs for 15 blocks by Dec 16

Some 60 international oil and gas exploration companies have expressed their interest in participating in the bidding for hydrocarbon exploration in 15 blocks of Bangladesh, Energy Minister Noor Uddin Khan said vesterday.

The government expects that production sharing contracts (PSCs) for all these blocks would be signed by December 16

Till now different foreign oil and gas companies have signed five PSCs with the government and it is expected that there will be an investment of more than 500 million US dollars under these five agreements very soon, the minister said.

Addressing a press briefing on the outcome of the recently concluded promotional semi nars on the prospect of hydroearbon exploration in Bangladesh, the minister said, "our special emphasis is on faster implementation of deci-

An eight-member government delegation led by Energy Secretary Toufiq-e-Elahi Chowdhury held two rounds of promotional seminars in London and Houston throughout March 24 to April 3. Some 30 companies attended the seminar in London and 30 others attended in Houston.

The press briefing was attended, among others, by experts of Petrobangla and officials of the Energy Ministry. According to the Energy Sec-

retary, the bidding for the 15 blocks were opened on March 15 and it would close on July 15. "After that, we will complete review of the bidding documents within one month and, finish all negotiations and procedures with the participants to sign PSCs by December 16," the Energy Secretary said.
