



# Mexico, USA share points

FOXBORO, Massachusetts, Apr 21: Mexico, reduced to 10 men in the final 21 minutes, em-

erged with a 2-2 draw with the United States here Sunday to maintain their lead in the CONCACAF World Cup qualifying region, reports

Mexico appeared to be on the road to victory with a goal from Carlos Hermosillo in the opening minute.

US defender Alexi Lalas passed a ball back to keeper Kasey Keller, Keller, under pressure from Hermosillo tried to clear the ball but Hermosillo blocked it with his head and was rewarded when it bounced over Keller and into the goal.

Hermosillo admitted he got lucky, but said Mexico manager Bora Milutinovic, former manager of the USA team, had told him to pressurise Keller.

The hosts began to take the initiative late in the first half, and Eddie Pope finally broke through in the 35th minute when he fired home a pass from Eric Wynalda to make it 1-1.

nament. Pakistan's pace duo, Wasim Akram and Waqar Younis, have ruled themselves out of the tournament with injuries while leg-spinner Mushtaq Ahraed will be away playing county cricket in England.

on Thursday, reports AFP.
Richards a former captain, and Gus Logie a former vicecaptain, are included in the side to be captained by present vicecaptain Brian Lara.

Four other present-day West Indian internationals have been named. They are left-hand batsman Shivnarine Chanderpaul, his Guyanese compatriot Carl Hooper, all-rounder Phil Simmons, who has earned a recall to the West Indies side for the first two limited overs internationals, and fast bowler Mervyn Dillon.

One of the features of the match is the participation of players from other Test nations. This year, the organisers have been able to attract Heath Streak, the Zimbabwe fast bowler, and Damien Fleming, the Australian medium-pace bowler.

The team is completed by two South Africans, namely Mark Boucher and bowler Makhaya Ntini.

The match, which was inaugurated last year, is to be an annual event to help raise money to facilitate the Sir Frank Worrell scholarship fund.

tury in the series was dismissed for 83 and Dravid, the most prolific Indian batsman, for 91 as India, continuing from 194 for two after the previous two days were abandoned due to a combination of rain and a soggy outfield, reached 241 for four when bad light stopped a play with former captain Mohammad Azharuddin unbeaten on four and wicketkeeper Nayan Mongia on nought.

The 163 runs that Tendulkar and Dravid put on was a record for India against the West Indies at this ground surpassing the 156 Sunil Gavaskar and Mohinder Amarnath shared in the 1982-83 series.

Four inspections were needed before umpires Eddie Nicholls, a Guyanese standing in his first Test and George Sharp one of England's representatives on the international panel, decided that play would commence and 31 overs were to be bowled. Unbeaten on 62 for the last

to days Tendulkar's first scoring stroke was a well-timed straight drive for the eight of his nine fours off the 231 balls he faced in 287 minutes.

Ian Bishop who replaced captain Courtney Walsh after five overs struck immediately inducing Tendulkar into a mistimed drive which he caught off his own bowling.

Dravid was still playing resolutely and looked unshakable even though he endured two close calls before chasing a wide ball from fast bowler catch to Carl Hooper at point — his innings lasted 380 minutes striking eight fours and one six

The 33-year-old Simmons, who inspired Leicester to the English county championship last season, is one of three changes to the squad involved in the fifth and final Test which ends here on Monday.



# Bruguera begins in

MONACO, Apr 21: Former French Open champion Sergi Bruguera, eyeing a third round clash with Austrian world number two Thomas Muster, showed unaccustomed confidence at the net to beat fellow Spaniard Javier Sanchez in the first round of the 2.3 million dollar Monte Carlo Open here today, reports AFP.

The 16th seed, who won 6-4, 6-1 in one hour 10 minutes when Sanchez overhit a crosscourt backhand on his first match point, went to the net 33 times to finish 24 rallies. "I am much fitter this year

and have had some good hard court results to give me confidence," said Bruguera, a double winner here, who gave himself a difficult start by dropping his opening serve in the first match on the tournament's 100th birthday. Bruguera, the 1993 and 1994

winner of the French Open, has reached 21st in the ATP rankings after falling to 81st last year with injuries to his right ankle and left knee which bedevilled his game during almost all of 1995 and 1996. Bruguera next plays Jan Siemerink of Holland or An-

drei Merinov of Russia.


