# Tribute to Denis Compton

(1918-1997)

Tawfiq Aziz Khan

One of the most attractive personalities of post-war cricket, Denis Compton is no more among us.

As a child at school, I was drawn to this great English cricketer without even the knowledge of his cricketing prowess. Though the book of general knowledge taught in our class recorded Sir Donald Bradman of Australia as the greatest cricketer and all of us had to memorise that, the name Denis Compton had tremendous influence on me. It was perhaps because of the rhythm in the two words, and much later his unorthodox and cavalier approach to the game of cricket.

In those days we had to depend mainly on The Statesman of Calcutta, and other dailies reaching our small town by noon the same day. Occasionally, there would be picture of the player or the match and that's how we would see our heroes. Radio commentary was practically a luxury because there were hardly half-a-dozen sets in the town.

Our interest in the game increased as India and Pakistan played their first series in the winter of 1992-93 and all the five Test matches were covered by the All India Radio. We huddled together over the radio set and followed the commentary with rapt attention. Our interest got a further boost when Pakistan went to England in the summer of 1954 and played four Test matches.

It was a wet summer as the Englishmen called it. At Trent Bridge, Nottingham, England handed down an ignominious defeat to Pakistan and Denis Compton was the hero of the match. As he clobbered the Pakistani bowling that included the great Fazal Mahmud, probably the best of his type, our hearts stopped beating. We prayed for the early departure of Compton but in vain. He was in full cry and produced one of the best innings of his career and his highest Test innings of 278 in less than 300 minutes. It was a gem of an innings played by one of the most attractive cricketers the world has ever seen. As all cricketers of his time, Compton had to sacrifice six years of his prime due to the Second World





Krajicek, who at four is the highest seed left in the tournament will face the number eight Carlos Moya of Spain in the quarterfinals. The Australian Open finalist comfortably saw Ukrainian Andrei Medvedev 6-

Unseeded Frenchman Fabrice Santoro, who shocked Austrian specialist Thomas Muster in the second round, was at it again on Thursday as he beat another former French Open winner Sergi Bruguera. The Spaniard, seeded 16, went down 3-6, 7-5, 6-1.

Santoro will face another Spaniard, Carlos Costa, in the quarters, Costa beat Frenchman Arnaud Boetsch 6-4, 7-5.

Chilean seventh seed Marcelo Rios plays Pete Sampras' conqueror Magnus Larsson of Sweden in the last eight after defeating 10-seeded Spaniard Alberto Costa 7-6, 6-4. Larsson Dispatched Czech Daniel Vacek with similar ease. 7-5, 6-0.

Spain's Alex Corretja, the number 12 here, defeated Czech Bohdan Ulihrach in three sets, while compatriot Emilio Alvarez lost to Norwegian Christian Ruud, a winner on Wednesday over Russian Yevgeny Kafelnikov, also in three sets.

Tim's likeness is inside the head of the tennis racket. He died May 3 at age 44 after a 16month battle with brain cancer. Tom was overcome with emotion several times during



# Chang survives a scare



averted a shocking upset Thursday by beating little-known Juan Albert Viloca at the US Men's Clay Court Championships, report agencies.

Chang beat the Spaniard 6-2, 6-7 (3-7), 7-5 to advance to the quarterfinals.

"It's all about fighting back," said Chang. "I'm a stubborn person and I hate to lose at anything. I was taught to never give up. That doesn't mean you'll always come back, but you have to give yourself at least the hope that you will." In other matches, third-

seeded Petr Korda was upset by Marcelo Filippini of Uruguay; fifth-seeded Jason Stoltenberg of Australia defeated Magnus Larsson of Sweden 7-6 (7-3), 6-4 in an error-filled contest; and, No. 7 Byron Black of Zimbabwe edged Holland's Dennis van Scheppingen 7-6 (8-6), 3-6, 6-3. The American Chang, whose

world ranking will improve to No. 2 next week, started the match against the 79th-ranked Viloca as though it would be another routine victory, sweeping the first three games and winning the first set in less than 30 minutes.

The trend continued in the second set as Chang secured a service break in the seventh game and served for the match at 5-4.

Then the tone changed abruptly as Viloca began ripping sharply angled forehand winners, breaking Chang's serve and forcing the set into a tiebreaker. Chang regained his composure temporarily, moving into a 3-0 lead, but was again knocked off-balance by Viloca, who reeled off 10 straight points.

Viloca won the tiebreaker, the second set and broke Chang in the opening game of the final

Viloca, 24, maintained his service break advantage until Chang, sprinting desperately around the court to return Viloca's powerful groundstrokes, broke the Spaniard's

serve in the eighth game. But Viloca promptly broke Chang in the very next game. With the score 5-4, Viloca was serving for the match and the

Viloca, one of 14 Spaniards ranked in the ATP Tour's top 100, however, could not finish. Though he twice came within two points of winning the match. Viloca was unable to complete the upset.

Chang hit two sizzling backhand passing shots to break Viloca and even the set. An obviously discouraged Viloca then faded as Chang won 10 of the final 11 points to escape into the quarterfinals.

Ousting Korda 6-3, 6-1 in only 66 minutes, Filippini was helped immensely by Korda's errant shots. Korda, who was once ranked as high as fifth in the world and was a finalist at the 1992 French Open, broke Filippini's serve in the second game. But from that point Korda's game steadily disintegrated as his experimental extra-long racket began spraying his shots

long, wide or into the net. Filippini capitalised by breaking Korda's serve three consecutive times to capture the


opening set. The second set was even more of a nightmare for Korda. Filippini, who has more career victories on clay than any player left in the tournament, chased down shot after shot and forced Korda into lengthy rallies. Korda's game self-destructed and Filippini sailed through the set 6-1.

"I felt like I was in control and up a set and 5-3 and the whole match turned around." said Chang of the two hour, 25 minute struggle. "I felt like things were slipping away. From there it was a dogfight. I played off the ropes all of the third set.

Viloca said, "I had the match won but if you don't win when you have the chance it is difficult. Good players give you one chance to win but they don't give you two chances. I knew I had the chance but I started to play badly."

Viloca said the presence of 14 Spaniards in the top 100, the most of any single nation, is inspiring for all of them.

"Every week a Spanish player is winning a tournament," Viloca said. "We practise together and so you are saying if he is winning then you must



Most children of the city are physically unfit, they lack considerably in strength and endurance. Changes in our living conditions and lifestyles over recent years have given way to less physical activity. On the average, a school age child spends nearly 10 per cent of each day watching TV and less than 1 per cent in organized physical activities. As a result, a great many children cannot do a single pull-up or a mile in 12 minutes.

Determining a child's overall physical fitness involves assessment in each of the three major areas: endurance. strength and flexibility. Endurance can be tested by a simple 12-minute run/jog/walk. A child eight years and older should be able to cover one mile in that amount of time.


A child's strength can be assessed by the number of pullups (palms away from the body) he or she can do. An eight-yearold should be able to do one additional pull-up for each additional year of age over eight, up to maximum of 10, and girls, one additional pull-up for each additional two years of age over eight, up to maximum of six.


mums is indicative of poor strength. It sounds easy, but you would be surprised at the number of children who cannot even do one pull-up.

Flexibility or skill testing can be assessed by the child's participation in sports, gymnastics or dance. The agility and coordination needed for jumping rope is also a good indicator of overall conditioning.

able to do at least 30 jump ropes with feet together and without missing a turn. Tests of physical fitness are

simple and can be easily administered. Interpreting the results can be more difficult. The child who passes or fails all areas of physical fitness testing is easily categorized. But what





about the child who fails one or two areas? The best way to approach this situation is the use the information to develop and exercise programme aimed at improving these particular areas. Reassessment at a later date should be done to ensure that the exercise programme is working.

Rarely are sophisticated

training devices, elaborate exercise equipment and complex exercise schedules needed for any child. The best way to encourage physical fitness in a child is a parents to set a good example. Take long walks; use the steps instead of the elevator; participate in sports together; walk to the corner store instead of driving.
