Ijaz steps into stew

COLOMBO, Apr 27: Pakistan's Ijaz Ahmed has been fined 20 per cent of his match fee for misbehaviour on the field after an altercation with the Sri Lankan captain on the first day of the second Test in Colombo, report agencies.

Cricket officials said today that match referee John Reid of New Zealand had also warned Ijaz that he would be barred from playing Test cricket if he repeated the offence in the next five months.

Ijaz reportedly abused Arjuna Ranatunga as the Sri Lankan captain was walking off the field when he was dismissed for four runs off the bowling of Saqlain Mushtaq on Saturday.

Reid later conducted an inquiry and imposed the fine on liaz, officials said.

The statement added that ljaz was also placed on a 30 per cent match fee suspended fine which would take effect from July 1 and run over a five month period if another breach of conduct occurs. Reid said in the statement that the second suspended fine of 30 per cent was imposed after ljaz was found to be "a stranger to the

Earlier Sri Lanka resumed from an overnight 281 for 7 and were all out for 331 with Aravinda de Silva remaining not out on 138, his sixth career century against Pakistan in a tally of ten tons.

De Silva, 101 overnight, scored 37 of the 50 Sri Lanka added to Saturday's score before they were all out 40 minutes before lunch on the second day.

The in-form De Silva; whose 10th century here followed his 168 in the first Test, now aggregates 729 runs in eight international innings in April alone. He scored 410 runs from five

outings in the three-nation Sharjah Cup earlier this month which Sri Lanka won against Pakistan and Zimbabwe. The stylish strokeplayer single-handedly lifted the home

side past the 300-run mark after a middle-order collapse on Saturday had reduced them to 144 for five. De Silva, who was on 55 when the seventh wicket fell.



their fifth successive win, 3-0 over Croatia, which means they have dropped only two encounters through the whole of stage This time the Chinese rested

The Green Delta Insurance hooliganism. First Division hockey league involving eighteen clubs begins

in the capital today. The league, the most attractive event in the calendar of the Bangladesh Hockey Federation (BHF), was suspended for the last two seasons due to what the authorities reasoned as 'the non-availability of a suitable ground.' And this year, of course for the first time, league matches will be played on the

newly-laid artificial turf at the Hockey Stadium. Defending champions Mo-hammedan Sporting Club, the winners of the coveted title in 1993-94 season, will feature in the inaugural match of the single league phase against promo-tees Victoria Sporting Club. The league will kick off at 2:15 pm. Besides, Sadharan Bima KS and Azad, the two mediocre outfits, will be pitting in the second match of the day, scheduled for a 3:15 pm start.

The league committee, which arranged a press briefing at the BHF office last evening, disclosed that it would introduce Premier Division league from next year involving the topdown eight teams of this year's

Like previous editions, win-

ners will be awarded with three points and teams in a drawn affair will be given one point each. Regarding the participation of foreign players in the league, the authorities have decided to follow the earlier rules which states that each team will be allowed to sign and field a maximum number of four foreign players. The committee, however, made some amendments in its bye-laws to fight out perennial problem of

that, the authorities did not "We have made some even feel the necessity for inamendments in the bye-laws cluding any provision against which states strict measures against those who involve in

the open-secret practice among all the clubs. any unsporting activities," said the league committee chairman Naim Ahmed, the DC (East) of

Regarding this serious issue Shamsul Bari, the long-standing general secretary of the BHF, appeared to have been philosophical while replying to a query about match fixing. "Match-fixing is a widely

practised culture across the globe. Till to date none of the sports bodies in the world has been able to come up with a suitable solution against the unholy practice," said Bari in a half-witted attempt to justify their failure in this regard. The league committee, however, decided to bring foreign umpires to officiate some crucial matches of the league.

The press briefing was also attended by a vice-president of the sponsors Green Delta Insurance Company, who has signed a three-year contract with the BHF to carry their names in both the First and Second Divi sion leagues. They are providing Taka 20,000. Meanwhile the league committee has fixed the rate of gallery ticket at Taka 10 per day. With two matches billed for a day, the league is expected to be completed within the first week of July.

Meanwhile, rain prevented any play between Glamorgan and Warwickshire at Cardiff, Lancashire and Durham at Old Trafford, Leicestershire and Gloucestershire at Leicester. Nottinghamshire and Worcestershire at Trent Bridge and Surrey and Somerset at the Oval.


