Market sources attributed the fall to a spree of panic sale, induced by a whispering campaign, and alleged manipulations by a section of traders/brokers, bent on pushing the market further down, apparently to avenge filing of cases by the authorities against the bigwigs of the capital mar-

Since April 2 when the SEC filed cases against 36 people, the DSE index until yesterday has shrunk by 28 per cent. The cases followed months of investigations by an independent committee, headed by Prof Amirul Islam, Vice-Chancellor of the Jahangirnagar University, which submitted its report on March 27.

The accused includes Chairman of the DSE Imtiyaz Ahmed, a number of other DSE members and some prominent owners of listed companies. They were charged with fraud allegedly for tailoring prices during a bull run between July and November last year.

It saw the All Share Price Index at DSE surging to 3647 points drawing thousands of small investors, swelling the ranks at the kerb market, who rushed for a slice of the pie.

But by the end of November the share prices began tum bling, the index sliding in a seesaw pattern despite intervention by the central bank.

The Bangladesh Bank had asked Investment Corporation of Bangladesh to buy shares and the banks to lend money to investors and brokers, announcing availability of a Tk 200 million fund.

But nothing worked so far. UNB quoted Dr Harunur Rashid, Chairman of SEC, as saying last night that he was considering a number of options to stabilise the market. "Some of them are continuation of the earlier measures," he said and added that the new measures are likely to be announced shortly. "But at the moment, I cannot disclose those." He was not available for further comments.

MA Hug Howlader, former honorary secretary of the DSE, told The Daily Star that the

market fell because of heavy retail sale pressure as small investors lost their confidence.

The demonstrators yesterday marched through the Motiiheel commercial area raising different slogans against the government for what they called failure in handling the situation in the country's capital market and against the DSE members for allegedly manipulating the share market.

The rally was addressed, among others, by Bangladesh Small Investors Forum leaders Moniruzzaman, Ali Zaman, Zahid Hossen, Atiqur Rahman, Mohammad Shahine and Saifuddin Babu.

But he observed that the power sector remained the "dark part" of the country's investment scenario since the generation of electricity has been far less than that of the requirement.

Chowdhury, however, informed that an additional 800 megawatt electricity would be available by the end of next year with the installation of three barge-mounted power plants. "It will not be adequate, but will ease the situation."

On the other hand, he appeared upbeat about the prospect of the energy sector. He quoted an international oil major that Bangladesh can export natural gas worth 500 million US dollars annually from the

year 2001. Earlier, FICCI chief Mahbub Jamil observed that the Industrial Policy and incentive package are excellent, but it would be very difficult to attract direct investment unless these are given legislative cover to make the policy provisions binding on all concerned agen-

He also suggested removal of the contradictions between various government policies that still hang over to gain confidence of investors and ensure that no decision contrary to de-

clared policy would be taken. Jamil said the BOI should have the sole responsibility of taking all investment decisions which should be binding on all agencies. The Board should also be manned by the "commercially oriented people" and the chief executive should be in the office at least for five years.

Bangladesh has been elected member of the executive board of UNICEF, according to a message received in Dhaka yesterday, reports BSS.

The three-year term of Bangladesh tenure will begin on January 1, next.

The Asian group at the United Nations (UN) endorsed the election of Bangladesh to the UNICEF executive board unanimously on Friday night.

Bangladesh which has been making efforts to get elected for last four years, made a major success at the election to the prestigious governing body of the world's foremost children's agency.

tion for enacting a new statute said, "The Artha Rin Adalat Ain, 1990, has undergone many amendments and it will be better if a new law is enacted."

Various amendments made to the said law from time to time are all scattered. If further amendments are made incorporating the recommendations of the LC, it will be difficult, if not impossible, to arrange all the amendments comprehensively. he noted.

Asked whether the existing law was insufficient, Justice Ahmed said, "The problem is in the implementation of the law. The quality of administration of justice can never be better than the quality of the person who administers justice."

The LC report said that it took up review of the law after considering the opinions and suggestions of various agencies, financial institutions including banks, lawyers, judges, debtors and members of the public.

A working paper with provisional recommendations was prepared on the basis of opinions and suggestions received by the LC and it was then circulated among the judges, lawyers and bank officials for their

Some of the final recommendations of the Law Commission on the Artha Rin Adalat (ARA) are:

"The presiding judges of the Artha Rin Adalats should be appointed to deal exclusively with suits under the Act alone. They should not be burdened with trial of cases of any other jurisdiction. Where there are more than one ARAs, the District Judge may evenly distribute suits among the presiding judges.

"Provision may be made restricting grant of adjournment of hearing for the filing of written statement by the defendant for two times only and if the defendant fails to file written statement within the time so fixed, the suit must at once be

"Provision may be made for issuing a combined order of attachment and sale of property of the judgement-debtor immediately after drawing up of the decree and not later than seven days therefrom.

"For this purpose, a list of the property on the security of which loan was advanced should be mentioned in the plaint by appending a schedule thereto. After publication of the sale proclamation, the procedures provided in the Code of Civil Procedure upto the stage of delivery of possession of the property to the auction purchaser may apply.

"The execution proceeding shall be taken in the record of the suit itself and no separate execution case after the passing of the decree need be filed.

"The execution shall also proceed if an appeal is field against the decree unless stay of execution of the decree is granted by the appellate court.
