'This is not correct,' the handout added.

It said, actually BTV did not get any response from the BNP despite its earnest request since last year to let it know about important public meetings of the Leader of the Opposition, her press conference, party convention and calls on by important personalities from home and abroad.

Flood information centre in city

The flood information centre of Bangladesh Water Development Board (BWDB) starts functioning in the city yesterday, reports BSS.

The centre at the 8th floor of WAPDA building in Motijheel will disseminate day-to-day information about rainfall and water level of the rivers.

It will remain open everyday including holidays from 8 am to 2:30 pm and up to 10 pm under any emergency situation.

The centre will operate till September 30 until further order, sources said.

Disappearance day of 2 martyred brothers tomorrow

The 26th anniversary of disappearance of two martyred brothers — Salim Ullah and Zahir Hossain — will be observed tomorrow, said a press release.

On this day in 1971, the Pak occupation forces abducted the two brothers from their Deobhagh residence in Narayanganj and they could not be traced later.

On this occasion, a day-long Qurankhwani will be held and the destitutes will be fed at their 30, LNA Road in Deobhagh.

Shaheed Salimullah is the father of Khwaja Rahmat Ullah, the former hockey player and the manager of Abahani hockey team.

'Over 25 US cos offer sex tours to Asia'

More than 25 US companies offer sex tours to Asia. 'Real sex with real girls, all for real cheap,' boasted one California sex tour company in its advertising brochure.

Surita Sandosham — Executive Director of 'Equality Now' (EN), a New York based international human rights organisation — told The Daily Star in an interview on Monday: 'The main destinations of these companies are the Philippines, Thailand, Vietnam and Laos.'

Surita is currently meeting with NGOs, government officials and international organisations in Bangladesh to build a network to fight discrimination and all forms of oppression and violence against women.

Surita said the production of pornographic pictures and films in the US was not illegal, and that this material sometimes indirectly encouraged people to indulge in sex tours.

There is a strong debate over producing those, because it is the right of any US citizen under the country's Constitution,' she said. 'But I feel this material degrades women.'

Surita said although prostitution was illegal in every US state except Nevada, it secretly continued everywhere.

Surita wants to study the nature of oppression and violence against women in the South Asian sub-region. She said the times had changed and women were now far more aware of their rights. She said she believed public pressure could force governments worldwide to protect women from rape, torture, trafficking and all forms of discrimination.

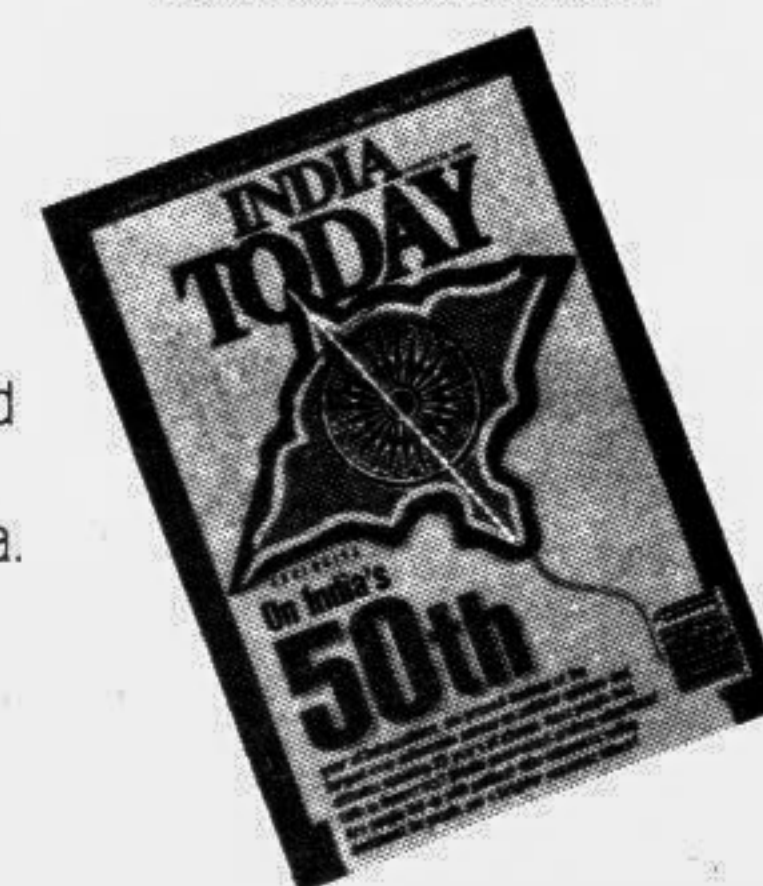

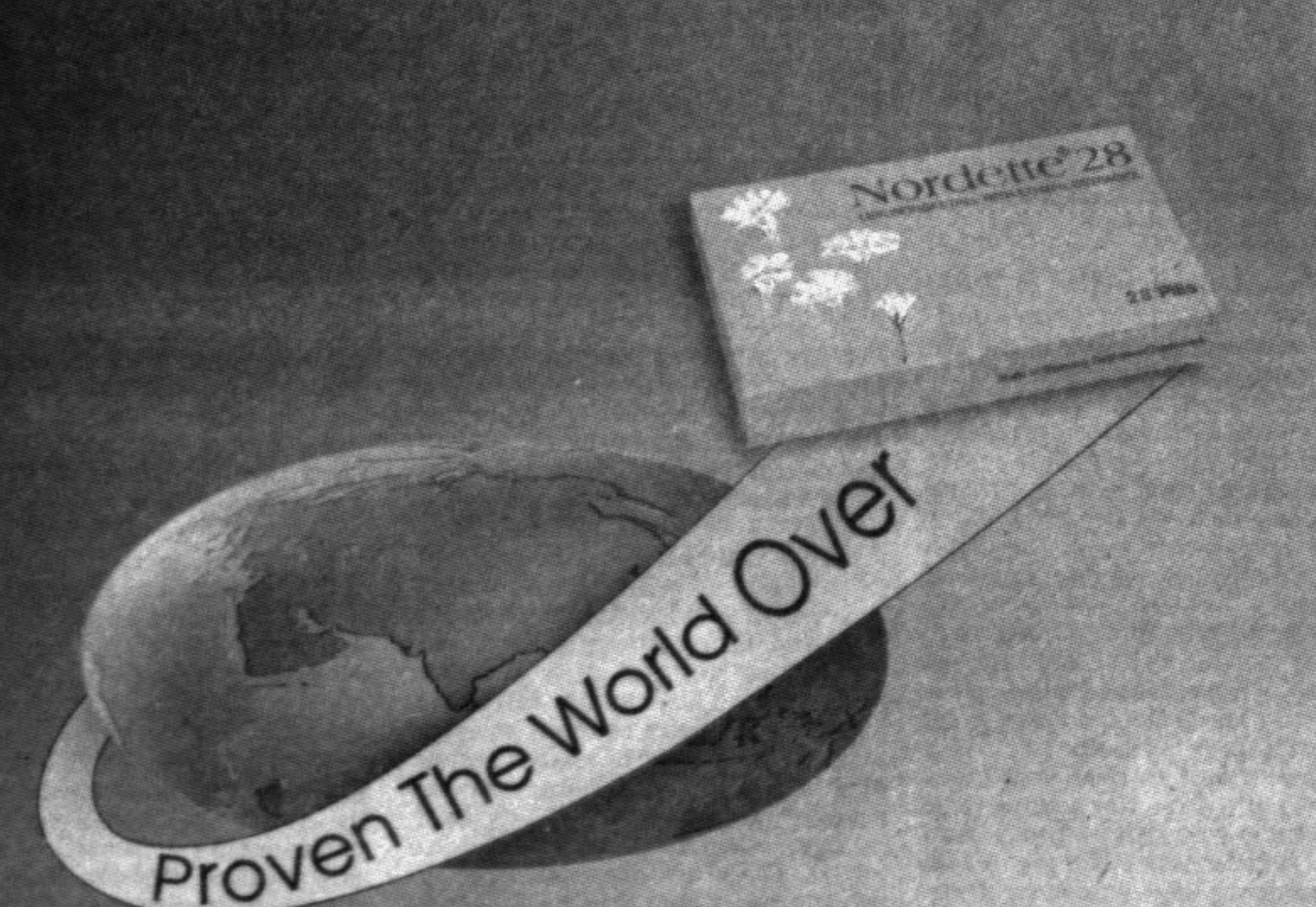

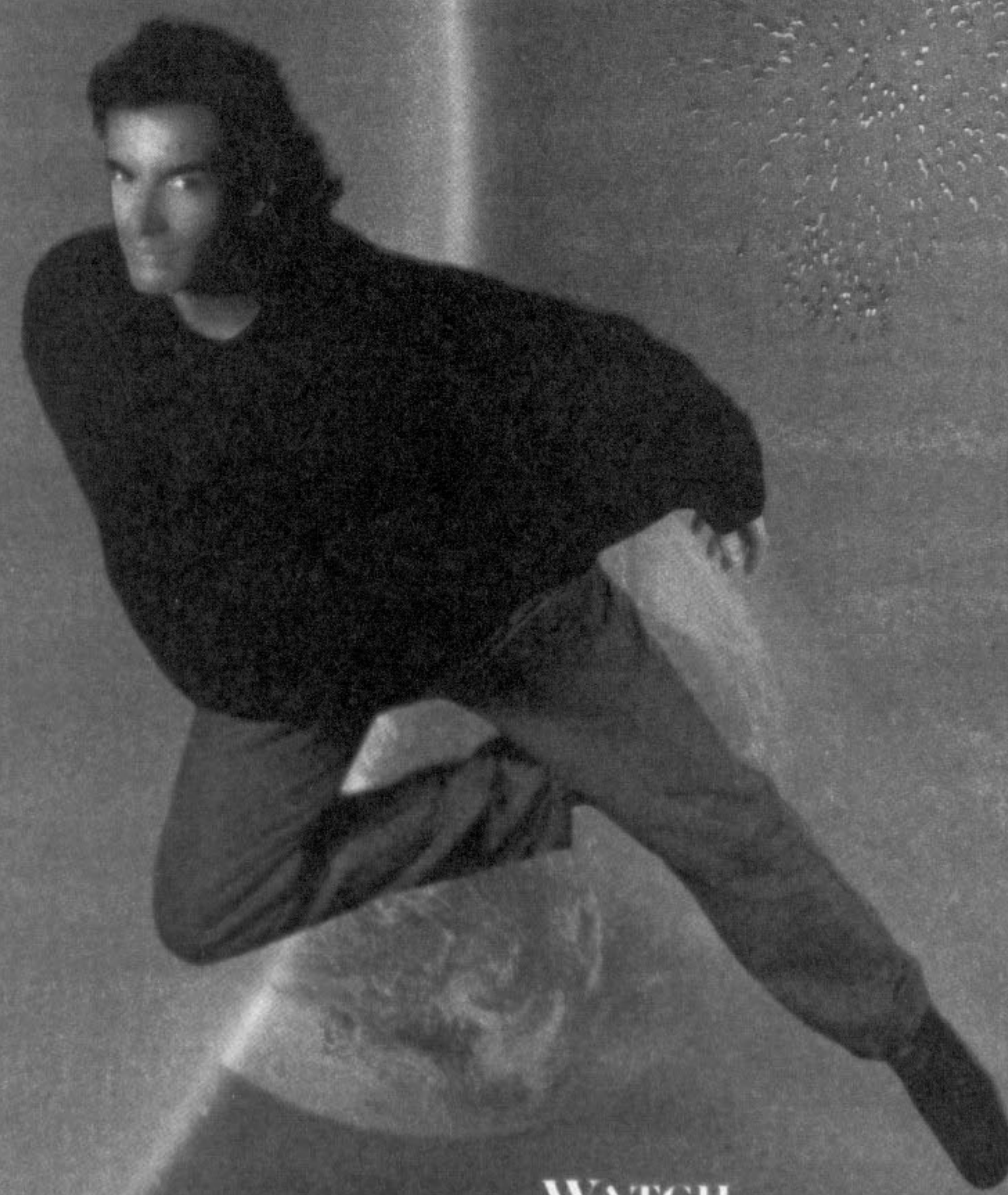
