

departments have shown little interest in the conversion project. According to the DOE. much of the black smoke in the city is caused by the large fleets of government as well as twostroke vehicles.

DOE officials said, the cost of conversion of a petrol driven vehicle into compressed natural gas is Tk 20,000 regardless of its size while conversion from diesel to gas is Tk 80,000. In the city, there is a conversion workshop at Joarshahara and refueling facilities are available in four filling stations.

"If a diesel-driven passenger bus is converted, its fuel cost will be drastically cut," said the DOE official explaining how the expenses incurred for the conversion could be recovered within a short time.

The official emphasised the need for more government intervention in checking air pollution in the city. He suggested that transport companies be offered easy bank loans to encourage conversion.
