

PUSAN, South Korea, May 10: The East Asian Games opened today amid tight security at the Kuduk Stadium and surrounding areas in the southern South Korean port city of

Pusan, reports AFP. Police dogs were in use at the stadium, while several thousand policemen and security guards have been mobilized for the 10-day event, watching on every floor of the main hotels of

Since South Korean Olympic chief Kim Un-Yong's suggestion that the city hosts the 2008 Summer Olympic Games, sports officials have faced growing protests by civil groups over spending on sports events.

ROME, May 10: German teenager Tommy Haas, semifinalist at the German Open, has been given a special invitation to play at next week's Italian Open, reports Reuter.

Haas, 19, left school less than a year ago and entered the Hamburg tournament as a wildcard. On Friday the 123rdranked player beat Spain's 11th seed Alberto Berasategui 2-6, 6-3, 6-3 to defeat his second seeded opponent in four days.

Olympic Committee President Juan Antonio Samaranch has supported a controversial bid by Pusan to host the Summer Olympics in 2008.

"Pusan could be a strong contender because South Korea has successfully staged the 1986 Asian Games and the 1988 Olympics," Samaranch told Younhap news agency here Fri-

In the round, Kayes tamed Din Mohammad Swapan to raise his tally to three and a half points.



Taylor continue to falter. Asked whether he would stand down from the side if it came to the crunch, Taylor told journalists at Sydney Airport on Saturday that he was realistic about the fact his form has

to improve. "I'm a tour co-selector and I have to make sure I'm doing the job as a batsman and captain and if it gets to that stage, I will", Taylor said.

"But that's a long way down the track at this stage. I've got a month to prove to myself and the other selectors that I am one of the two best opening batsmen in this side.

Taylor said he was reluctant to make any predictions about what would happen in England. "I, like everyone of the 16 men behind me, am going over there to impress the tour selectors and get picked in the oneday side and then the Test matches - and that's the way I'm going to approach the tour, he said.

The 17-man squad departed on the 16-week tour at lunchtime on Saturday.

When Kasparov plays chess, he visibly agonises over his moves, frequently rising from his chair to pace.

"He's a very emotional person and doesn't hide his feelings," said a friend, Frederic Friedel. "If he makes a bad move, he can't hold back. He's an expressive player."

Kasparov is at a disadvantage because Deep Blue does not "show the same frustrations and signs of fatigue that Garri himself shows," said Joseph Tecce, a professor of neuropsychology at Boston College. "He's not looking at a situation where he can see the visual imperfec-

tions of another human being." Joseph traub, a Columbia University computer science professor, captained the Bronx High School of Science chess

team as a teenager and has fol-

lowed the Kasparov-Deep Blue

"I sort of compare (Kasparov) to the song about John Henry,' the legendary 19th-century railroad worker who outworks a steam drill only to die of the strain.

"He may be the John Henry of the information age," Traub

The fact that Deep Blue is simply a super-advanced version of the humble pocket calculator, one that can calculate an average of 200 million chess positions each second, has not stopped Kasparov and others from ascribing human qualities to the machine.

Kasparov, 34, said he believed Deep Blue showed signs of intelligence during its Game 2 win last Sunday.

Miguel Illescas, a Spanish chess Grand Master who has consulted to the IMB team. seemed to hint at the computer getting a "second wind" in describing how the machine salvaged a draw from a difficult position in Wednesday's Game 4.

And what were the computer's breakdowns during Game 4 - when the IBM team had to repeatedly reboot the machine if not a sign of Deep Blue "cracking" under the stress of the fivehour contest?
