One succumbs to stab injuries at DMCH

A young man, who was seriously stabbed and assaulted by an unidentified gang of terrorists at Agargaon in the city Saturday morning, succumbed to his injuries at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) early yesterday.

Zakir Hossain, 20, a resident of an Agargaon slum, sustained injuries in his head, back and shoulder when the gang attacked him as he reportedly refused to pay a toll of Tk 500. Zakir, a grocer, died at about 3am yesterday, DMCH sources said.

However, Mohammadpur police said that Zakir, son of Rustom Ali, was attacked during a clash between two rival groups of terrorists in Agargaon area at about 10am Saturday.

Police arrested one Jamal in connection with the killing of Zakir.

Meanwhile, the body was sent to the DMCH morgue for autopsy and a case filed with Mohammadpur thana.

Alleged mugger shot in city

An alleged mugger sustained bullet injuries when a captain of the Special Security Force (SSF) fired on him at Tallabagh in the city early Saturday.

Rashidul Alam opened fire when he came under attack by a gang of three muggers at about 1 am, according to police.

Police said the injured snatcher identified as Billal, 25, tried to hit the captain with a Chinese axe. However, the two others of the gang fled away after firing. The captain was walking through the Tallabagh area at the time.

Billal was under treatment at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital under police custody.

Teenage boy beaten to death in Sylhet

SYLHET, May 11: A 13-year old boy was beaten to death by friends while playing cricket at village Ikrarchai of Jagannathpur thana under Sunamganj district. Muhibur Rahman and Nurul Haque had an altercation during their game. At one stage, Nurul beat Muhibur with a bamboo stick. Muhibur was immediately taken to the thana Health complex. Later he was rushed to the Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital in a critical condition. He succumbed to his wounds there this morning.

A case has been lodged in this connection.

Recovered pythons sent to Dhaka Zoo

Two pythons, recovered by police from the Gulistan area on Saturday, were sent to Dhaka Zoo yesterday, reports UNB.

One of the pythons is 12 feet long and weighs 20 kg while the other is 8 ft long and weighs 8 kg.

Police said they arrested two men — Reza alias Babul and Delwar — from Gulistan area Saturday afternoon.

Case against JCD, JCS activists filed

Police filed a case against some leaders and activists of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) and Jatiya Chhatra Samaj (JCS) in connection with the armed clash between the two student organisations on Friday last, reports BSS.

Ramna police said sergeant Masudur Rahman filed the case with Ramna thana on Saturday against 13 leaders and some activists of JCD and five leaders and some activists of Chhatra Samaj. At least 10 students were injured in the clash.

JCD leaders against whom the case has been filed are: Habibunabi Khan Sohel, Monwar Hossain Rana, Shahabuddin Lalit, Abdul Khaleque, Manzur Elahi, Dani, Titu, Shishir, Mukul, Dipu, Bhutan Manik, Nata Babu, Abu Jafar and a large number of activists. Chhatra Samaj leaders: Humayun Kabir Hiru, Nirmol Chandra Das, Swapan, Milon, Titu and nearly 100 activists of the organisation.

None was, however, arrested in connection with the case till night.


