Hasan Amin yesterday pro-

nounced the judgement on the writ petition filed by Mahbubuddin Ahmed.

After promulgation of Martial Law in 1975, SP Mahbub was detained under the Special Powers Act, 1974, and was also implicated in a number of criminal cases.

Subsequently, his detention was declared illegal by the HC and the criminal cases were ultimately withdrawn for want of evidences.

He was released from Dhaka Central Jail on August 18, 1982. After his release, he was not allowed to join his service. He was informed that he had been suspended by an order dated March 20, 1975, but the suspension order was not communicated to him beforehand.

It was also stated in the judgement that no departmental proceeding was drawn against him.

SP Mahbub was dismissed from service under the Martial Law Order No-9, of January 4.

He challenged his dismissal before the Administrative Tribunal and also appealed before the Administrative Appellate Tribunal. But his appeal was also dismissed on the ground that the Tribunal had no jurisdiction to dispose of the impugned dismissal order as it was passed under the MLO.

Barrister Shafiq Ahmed along with H R Sharif assisted by Advocate G S Hug moved for Mahbubuddin Ahmed, while Deputy Attorney General Kaisaruddin Ahmed represented the government.

The Kashmir issue, however, was not mentioned in the speeches, which were remarkable for their unusually conge-

nial tone. Gujral said the seven countries of the Indian subcontinent should emulate other models of economic integration. "Our vision for South Asia should reach the contours of a South Asian Economic Community," he said.

Such a community would combine the forces of one-fifth of humanity, which now has nearly half of the world's poorest people and an average per capita income of just over dirs 300, less than sub-Saharan Africa.

"We must open up new horizons," said Abdul Gayoom, the president of the Maldives who assumed the chairmanship of the South Asia Association for Regional Cooperation.

Deputy Speaker Abdul Hamid yesterday expressed disappointment over the 'abusive language' used by an opposition MP against the Chair on Sun-

"The Rules of Procedure of Jatiya Sangsad clearly asks the legislators not to use any abusive as well as offending words while speaking in Parliament, but what can I do if the lawmakers do not abide by the rules," a disappointed Deputy Speaker said.

Abdul Hamid made the comment following a complaint raised by an Awami League MP, Sharif Khashruzzaman, that Amanullah Aman of the BNP had used some 'filthy words' against the chair while leaving the House on Saturday. "Had the BNP legislator been equipped with a gun, he might have shot you dead," the AL lawmaker also said and demanded that the Chair take action against him.

At this point Amanullah Aman sought the floor. But the Chair said, "I myself heard what the BNP legislator had said and expected that people like former Speaker Shaikh Razzak Ali or Prof Badruddoza Chowdhury would say sorry on behalf of the MP concerned."

Shaikh Razzak Ali was seen seeking the floor at this point. But Abdul Hamid, who was presiding over the sitting, adjourned the House at 9:45 pm.
