

4-nation cricket tournament in Pakistan

LAHORE, May 13: Sri Lanka, West Indies and South Africa will play in a four-nation cricket tournament in Pakistan in November, organisers said on Monday, reports Reuters.

They will take part in a one-day series marking Pakistan's golden jubilee in Lahore from November 1 to 8.

South Africa and West Indies will also play three-Test series against Pakistan between October and early December, the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) said.

Deep Blue defeated Kasparov Sunday to clinch the six-game match, a rematch of an earlier contest won by the Russian Grand Master.

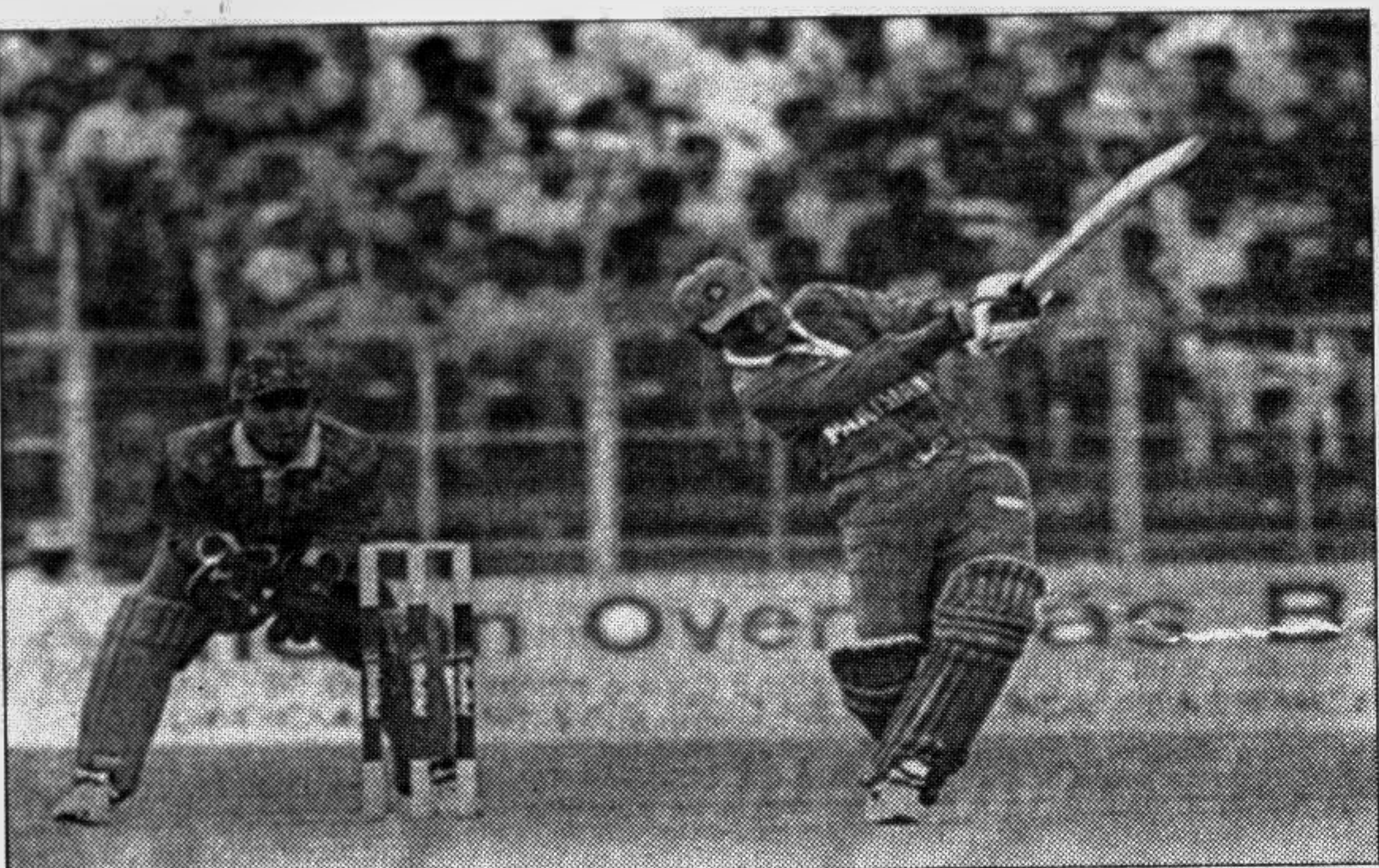

Aaquib spell sinks SL

**GWALIOR (India), May 13:** Aaquib Javed knocked out world champions Sri Lanka with a fiery new-ball burst here Monday night to resurrect Pakistan's faltering Independence Cup campaign, reports AFP.

Aaquib snapped up four early wickets, including two in the first over, and one more in his second spell after Pakistan had piled up an imposing 289 for six in a must-win situation.

Sri Lanka scored 259 in reply to lose by 30 runs and keep the depleted Pakistanis alive in the four-nation event after their 22-run defeat to New Zealand in the opening match.

Aaquib, recalled to the side in the absence of five frontline bowlers including Wasim Akram and Waqar Younis, came back strongly after being smashed for 70 runs in eight overs by the Kiwis on Friday.

He trapped dashing opener Sanath Jayasuriya leg before with his first delivery and had new man Marvan Atapattu caught at point with his fifth before Sri Lanka had a run on the board.

Romesh Kaluwitharana was bowled in Aaquib's third over, giving the 135-match veteran his 150th one-day wicket and reducing Sri Lanka to 25 for three.

The in-form Aravinda de Silva cantered with a dazzling 33 off 32 balls before Aaquib had him top-edging a drive to the first Ahmed at point with the first ball of his sixth over.

Sri Lanka captain Arjuna Ranatunga (58) and Hashan Tillekeratne (29) carried the score from 59 for four to 134, before Salim Malik's gentle medium pace removed both batsmen in the 26th over.

That took the light out of both the Sri Lankans and the Roop Singh Stadium which was plunged into darkness for 18 minutes after a technical snag at the light towers.

When play resumed, Roshan Mahanama (54) and Kumara Dharmasena (28) lifted Sri Lanka's hopes by adding 71 for the seventh wicket but Pakistan kept the run-rate in check to emerge deserving winners.

Earlier, the Pakistanis used the easy-paced wicket and a lightning outfield to flay the Sri Lanka attack after electing to take first strike.

They began in sensational fashion as Shahid Afridi hit an explosive 52 off 29 balls to carry the score to 74 for no loss by the 10th over.

Pakistan appeared to have lost ground when they reached 236 for five by the 45th, but Malik (49), Moin Khan (23) and Mohammed Hussain (17) hammered 53 off the last five overs, including 18 off the final over from Chaminda Vaas.

Afridi, one-day cricket's fastest centurion, hit nine boundaries before reaching his half-century with two successive sixes off left-arm seamer Vaas.

Afridi and Saeed Anwar hammered 25 off the first three overs and brought up the fifty in

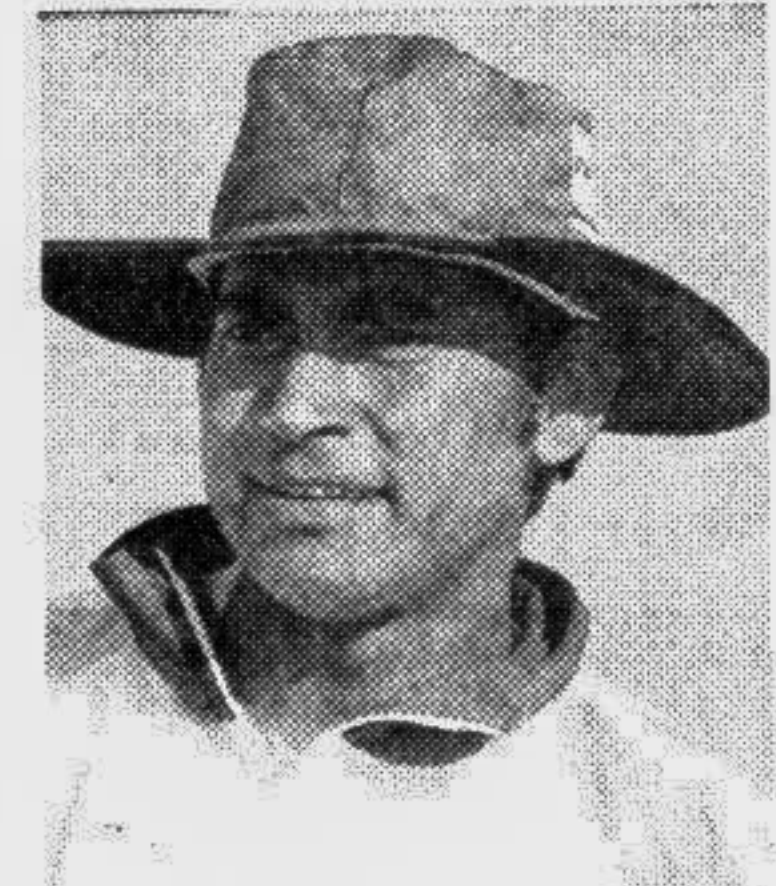

Pakistan coach to call it quits?



**NEW DELHI, May 13:** Pakistan cricket coach Mushtaq Mohammad said today he would resign after the four-nation Independence Cup in India because he was not being paid enough, reports AFP.

"This is my last assignment," said Mushtaq about his decision to terminate a three-year contract after a year. "After all, 1,000 dollars a month is not very attractive money."

The Birmingham-based Mushtaq, one of the four Mo-hammed brothers to represent Pakistan and a former Test captain, said he will return to England after the tournament to pursue other interests.

"I am satisfied with my work over the past year, because Pakistan has done very well," he said. "But you also need money to support your family and yourself."

Mushtaq's revelation came a day after his depleted team shocked world champions Sri Lanka by 30 runs to stay in the second match of the tournament.

Even without the services of star bowlers Wasim Akram, Waqar Younis and Mushtaq Ahmed, Pakistan did that.

Sources in the Pakistani team said there were three contenders for Mushtaq's job — former skipper Zaheer Abbas, left-arm spinner Iqbal Qasim and current manager Nasimul Ghani.

Zaheer, who coaches Pakistan's second string, is the front-runner, but Ghani is keen to get the job — provided he is paid well.

"In today's world, financial considerations are very important, so if the board offers me good money, why not?" said Ghani, who is a national selector and a member of the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB).

Pakistan have a busy season ahead with the Asia Cup in Sri Lanka in July, followed by two one-day series against arch-rivals India in Canada and at home in September.

Pakistan is also scheduled to host its own four-nation Independence Cup in October and home Test series against South Africa and the West Indies.

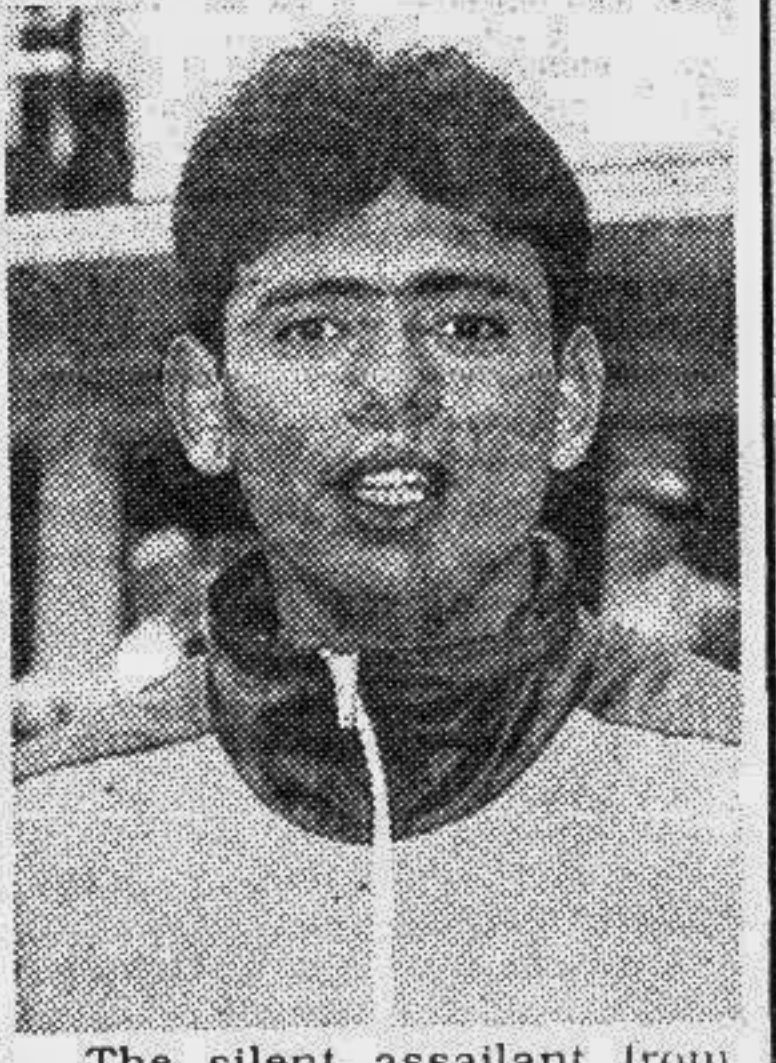
Three cheers for Saqlain!

Aaquib Javed's sizzling bowling performance against Sri Lanka overshadowed three new world records set at a time by another young Pakistani — Saqlain Mushtaq — in the same match in Gwalior Monday.

Albert speedster Aaquib Javed, who scalped five Sri Lankans, was the hero of Pakistan's crucial 30-run victory, Saqlain, who claimed three wickets with his mesmerising spell of off-spinners, went down in history with three records under his belt. The mild-mannered offie, arguably the best nowadays in this branch of artistry, became the youngest player to pass the hundredth one-day haul, playing the least number of matches. Saqlain also spared a record 39-month to take 101 wickets since his debut in this abridged version of the game in Sept, 1995.

He reached the hallmark by trapping his Sri Lankan counterpart Kumara Dharmasena in front of the wicket.



The silent assailant from Lahore dethroned his illustrious teammate and fast bowler Waqar Younis, who set the mark in 1993 in his 58th appearance at the age of 21 years and 78 days. Saqlain achieved the excellent feat in his 52nd one-day match at the age of 20 years, 3 months and 14 days.

The always-smiling spin sensation was also the highest wicket-taker in the international cricket calendar last year.

Maroney makes history

**MIAMI, Florida, May 13:** Australian swimmer Susie Maroney on Monday became the first person to swim solo from Cuba to Florida in a 25-hour swim from Havana to Key West, organizers said, reports AFP.

"I'm so glad to be here. It's such a long way," Maroney told reporters moments after swimming the last of approximately 200 kilometres (124 miles) to Fort Taylor Beach in Key West at 12:21 pm (16:21 GMT), the southernmost point of the United States.

Asked how she made the swim in less than the 40 hours initially estimated, she said: "We had strong currents."

Hours later, Maroney collapsed during a television interview and was taken to a hospital, said Cable News Network.

The swimming feat more than doubled Maroney's own previous 24-hour distance record. The 22-year-old swimmer at the astounding speed of eight kilometres (five miles) an hour.

Last year, Maroney failed in her first attempt at the swim. This time she took a slightly U-shaped path of about 200 kilometres (124 miles) to avoid strong cross-currents.

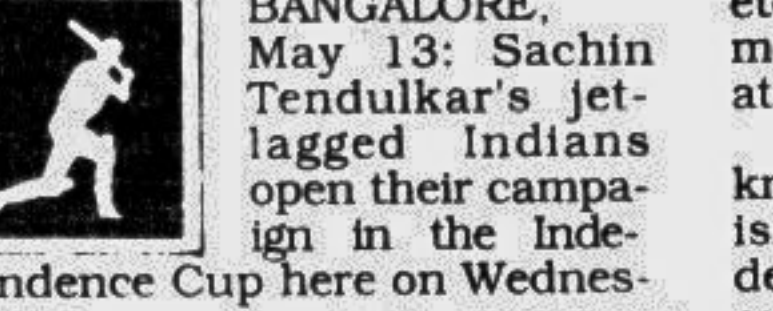
Maroney already holds the Guinness women's record for 24 hours of distance swimming (93 kilometres), the record for both sexes for the Around-Manhattan Swim, and the fastest round-trip English Channel run.

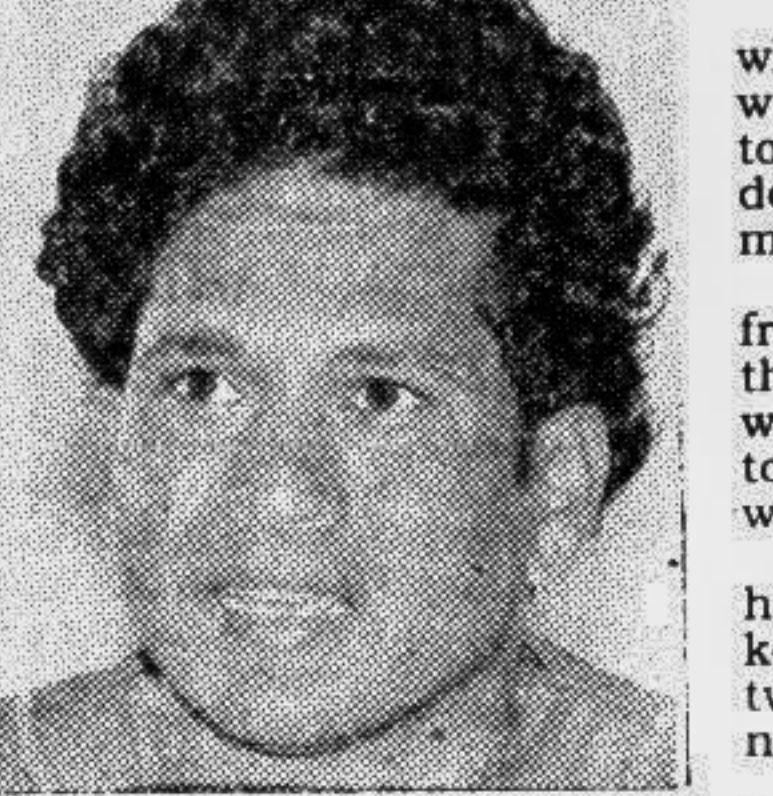

Indians face Kiwis today

day determined not to "freeze" in the summer heat, reports AFP.

The home team returned from a tour of the West Indies and Bermuda late on Monday night, less than 40 hours before taking on resurgent New Zealand in their first match.

The bleary-eyed Indians flew in to Bangalore today afternoon after an overnight stop-over at Bombay and hit their hotel beds after a light work-out at the Chinnaswamy Stadium.

It was not the ideal preparation for the four-nation tournament being organised to celebrate the 50th year of India's independence, but coach Madan Lal had other worries on his mind.

"There's no point brooding about the hectic schedule, it's part of a professional crick-

eter's life," Madan said. "I am more worried about the team's attitude to the game."

"We freeze at the crunch, you know. We're just not able to finish well," he said, referring to defeats in both the Test and one-day series in the West Indies.

Madan said he was disgusted when India were shot out for 81 while chasing a moderate victory target of 120 in the Barbados Test which won the five-match series for the West Indies.

India then snatched defeat from certain victory in the third one-day at St Vincent, which allowed the West Indians to take a 2-1 lead. The hosts won the four-match series 3-1.

"Those two matches will haunt me for ever. I am going to keep asking the boys about the two matches till they win the next tournament," Madan said.

"We just freeze. Do you expect bowlers to give you half-volleys when there is a small total to defend. The Indians have to make things happen, not let the others overtake you."

Madan would like his team to perform like the Pakistanis, who raised their game to stun world champions Sri Lanka on Monday in a match they had to win to stay in the tournament.

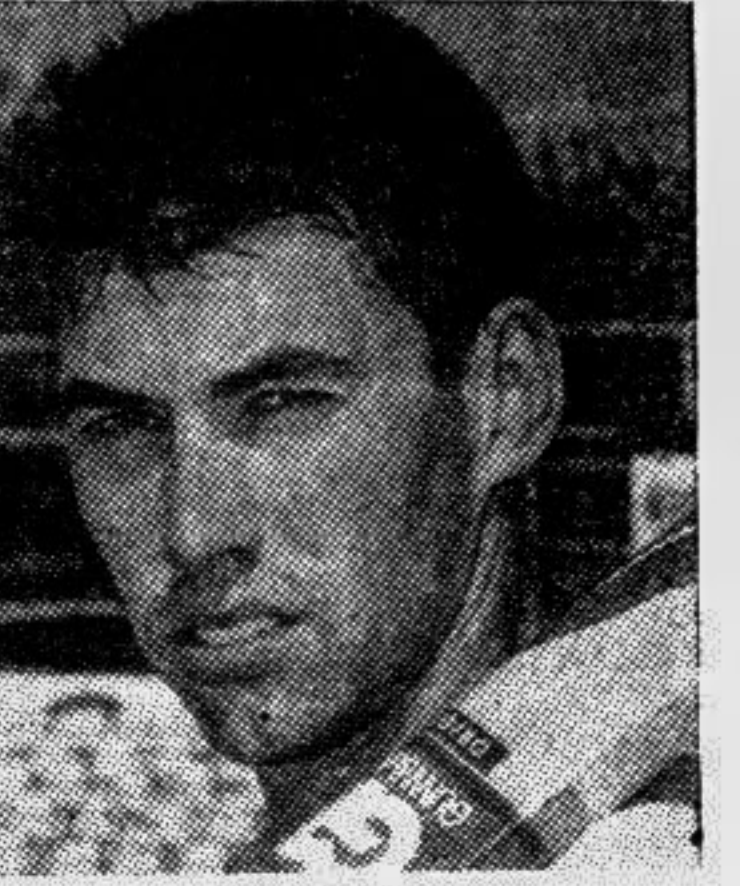
"The Pakistanis fight well. To beat the Sri Lankans without their top bowlers is very creditable. We need to play like them."

The Indians can take comfort from playing New Zealand at a venue where they defeated Pakistan in last year's World Cup quarterfinal and followed that with a last-over win over Australia.

Tendulkar's men will need all the support they get from 40,000 frenzied fans against the Kiwis, flying high after defeat-

ing Pakistan in the tournament opener at Mohali on Friday.

But the home team's first appearance in the tournament is clouded by a controversy over the sacking of former skipper Mohammad Azharuddin, the

only Indian to score more than 6,000 one-day runs.

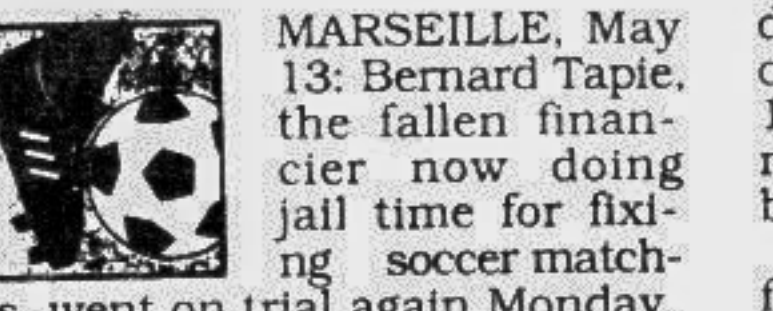
Angry Azharuddin fans raised slogans against Tendulkar and Madan Lal when the team flew in to Bombay on Monday night, and demanded the stylish middle-order batsman be reinstated.

Madan Lal, who like Tendulkar needed police protection to be escorted out of the airport, said he had "nothing to comment about anything on Azhar."

New Zealand captain Stephen Fleming played down the uneasiness in the Indian camp, saying the home team was strong enough to make a mark in the tournament.

They will be tough to beat, in fact I would say we are the underdogs for tomorrow's match," Fleming said.

Tapie returns to court



MARSEILLE, May 13: Bernard Tapie, the fallen financier now doing jail time for fixing soccer matches, went on trial again Monday, this time accused of fraudulent financial dealings involving his championship team, Olympique Marseille, report agencies.

Police led Tapie, 53, a former urban affairs minister, into a side door of the courthouse after moving him from Marseille's Baumettes prison, where he is serving an eight-month term.

The former urban affairs minister is one of 20 people being tried on charges of fraud, abuse of company assets and abuse of confidence. The defen-

dants will have to explain the disappearance of more than 101.4 million francs (about 18 million dollars) in club money between 1987 and 1993.

The other defendants are former club officials, intermediaries and heads of companies. They all face maximum five-year prison sentences and fines of up to 2.5 million francs (440,000 dollars). The trial is expected to last three weeks.

The trial could shed light on soccer corruption after defendant Jean-Pierre Bernes, Tapie's former right-hand man, promised the court disclosures.

He has accused Tapie of spending five to six million francs (850,000 dollars to one million) a year on rigging French league and European

Cup games.

Tapie entered jail three months ago when the supreme court upheld his sentence for bribing players of league rival Valenciennes to give Marseille an easy game days before Marseille beat AC Milan 1-0 in the 1993 European Cup final.

The investigating magistrate has accused Tapie of falsifying accounts to conceal bonuses and loans to players and illegally paying advertising companies based in tax heavens to improve the image of soccer stars.

Tapie has said he can justify all the sums spent.

His lawyer Jean-Yves Lienard told reporters the trial would "expose the workings of a certain high-level soccer."
