BCIC loses Tk 495cr for import, marketing of urea

Bangladesh Chemical Industries Corporation (BCIC) incurred a loss of Tk 495.27 crore for import and marketing of fertiliser during the current fiscal year, reports UNB.

Disclosing this in parliament yesterday. Industries Minister Tofael Ahmed said a national committee on fertiliser is working to evolve a coordinated marketing system

for the soil nutrient. Replying to a number of supplementaries, he said the new system is expected to be formulated before the next peak season to make fertiliser marketing more effective and effi-

He said each thana will have equal number of fertiliser dealers and the additional dealership would be cancelled.

The minister said import of 428.252 metric tons of urea caused a loss of Tk 254.40 crore while marketing of the fertiliser produced by state-run BCIC caused a loss of Tk 240.87

He attributed the losses to the sale of local fertiliser at lower price than production cost and sale of imported fertilizer at a price less than landing

Replying to Prof Shahidul Islam of BNP, Tofael said the landing cost, or the mean import cost, for fertiliser was Tk 10.170 per ton and the fertiliser



Govt to consider proposal for Tk 2000 minimum wage for garments workers

The government will consider the proposal for a minimum wage of Tk 2000 for garment workers after the formation of wage board, Parliament was told yesterday, reports

State Minister for Labour and Manpower M A Mannan gave the assurance on a resolution moved by Harunor Rashid Khan Monnu.

In his motion, Monnu suggested that workers in garment industries, particularly in the Export Processing Zone, be given minimum wages of Tk 2000 in view of the rise in cost of living.

He said garment workers are deprived of different financial facilities when workers in other industries enjoy annual bonus, leave benefit or group insurance.

should be taken to combat trafficking of women and children. The leaders endorsed the idea of setting up of a Eminent Persons Group (EPG) which will undertake a comprehensive apprisal of SAARC and examine ways and means to enhance its

effectiveness. Farooq Sobhan said the heads of state and government also decided that the eminent persons group should formulate a perspective plan of action. It is expected that the EPG will include at least one person of great eminence from each SAARC member countries but not more than two persons will be chosen from one country.

The leaders also agreed to endorse the request from the President of Sri Lanka to host the next summit conference scheduled to be held in 1998. The Sri Lankan President was very keen to host the next summit in Colombo in 1998 which would coincide with the 50th anniversary of independence of Sri Lanka.

It was further agreed that Nepal would host the summit in 1999 while Pakistan would host in the year 2000, Farooq Sobhan said. On specific cooperation be-

tween two or more countries, such as sub-regional cooperation or the growth quadrangle, it was agreed upon that it would take place within the framework of Article Seven of the SAARC Charter. It was agreed

that henceforth specific projects agreed to by experts of two, three or more SAARC countries will be sent to the SAARC Secretary General who will obtain the consent of the standing committee.

The leaders also discussed a joint declaration setting the agenda for the future of the organisation to be issued at the end of the summit tomorrow.


