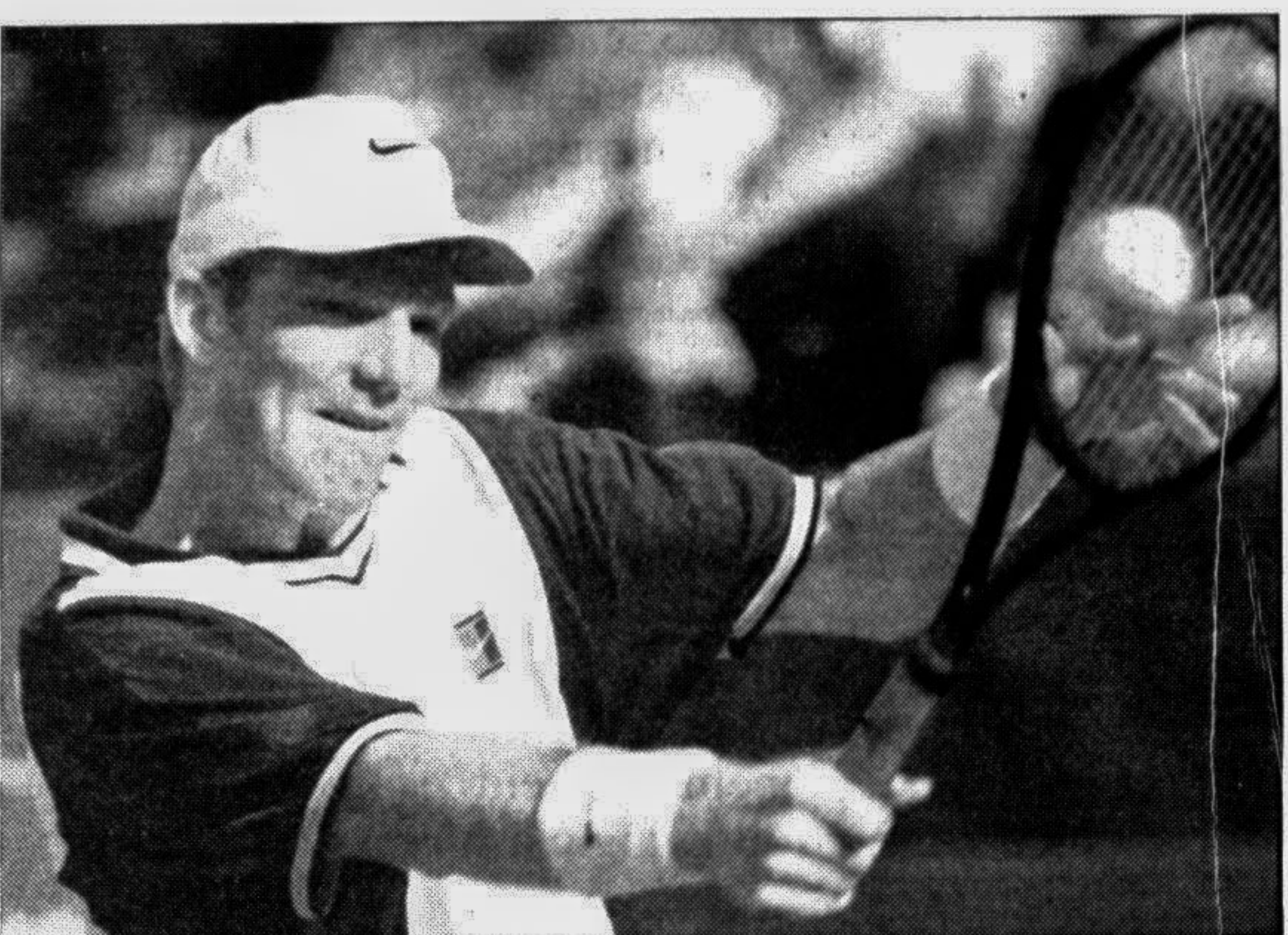

# Sampras, Chang bite dust

ROME, May 14: The world's two top players Pete Sampras and Michael Chang crashed out of the Italian Open on Tuesday with the crowd whistling and jeering as the Americans lost, reports Reuters.

Top seed Sampras, beaten at the same stage on his last visit in 1995, was booed on his way to a 7-6, 6-4 defeat at the hands of unseeded compatriot and friend Jim Courier.

It was his second successive defeat on clay after losing to Sweden's Magnus Larsson at Monte Carlo last month and the first time since 1995 that he has gone out in the first round of two tournaments in succession.

Second seed Chang's 6-3, 6-2 loss to Argentine Hernan Gummy was also his second consecutive first round elimination following defeat at the American red clay court championships.

It was the first time the Italian Open had lost its top two seeds in the first round.

Sampras said he knew he was in for a tough match as soon as he drew Courier, who took him to five sets in Paris last year.

"It was a tough draw for both of us. We know each other's games," he said. "But you've got to play the cards you are dealt and he came out fractionally ahead of me."

Both players traded breaks in their opening service games before the remainder of the set went with serve and into a tie-break.

The world number one lost his serve in the very opening match of the second as Courier raced into a 3-1 lead.

At 30-40 in the fifth, Sampras served a double-fault provoking a chorus of whistles from the crowd.

"It's very tough to play if you're not playing well here," said the American afterwards. "When they're hissing and whatever, it makes it harder. It's not fun."

"I guess that if you're not playing well, they think you're not trying. But I was fighting out there."

With Courier serving for the set at 5-3, Sampras silenced the crowd by gaining one break back, but two games later a driving forehand into the corner from Courier ended it.

"It's a good day for me. I've beaten the world number one and that doesn't happen very often to me now," said Courier, a former world number one himself and twice champion in Rome.

Apart from Chang, the unseeded Gummy's only other victory over a top 10 player was Courier in Rome last year.

Chang, whose game was riddled with errors, showed sparkle only in the first game of the second set when he broke

# Barca, PSG set for history

ROTTERDAM, Netherlands, May 14 (AP) — Barcelona are seeking a record fourth victory in the European Cup Winners' Cup final Wednesday. Paris Saint Germain are seeking the tournament's first consecutive titles.

But most of all, both will be looking to rid themselves of the "second-best" tag that has haunted their season. PSG already lost out to Monaco in the French league and Barcelona are reduced to an outside chance of winning Spain's Primera Division.

Barcelona striker Ronaldo only has one tag to deal with that of the world's best player. But he is still without a major international trophy to give that title more luster.

Wednesday's final at Rotterdam's 48,000-capacity De Kuip Stadium should be his moment.

"If you want to be part of history, you need titles," the 20-year-old Brazilian told the French sports paper L'Equipe. With Ronaldo heading a host of internationals, Barcelona enters the final as a firm favorite.

But there are a trio of Brazilians on the other side trying to bar his ambitions.

Rai, the veteran PSG playmaker, only enjoyed a few minutes of last year's 1-0 final victory over Rapid Vienna before being injured. As Paris captain he will hope for a more decisive input this year.

Striker Leonardo is new to the team and hoping to make his mark, while Ricardo, a rookie coach after a long playing career for PSG, has survived more ups and downs in a season than some do in a career.

"There is a lot more stress now than there was as a player," he said.

Just ask Bobby Robson. The Englishman is in Barcelona's hot seat and could well be on the way out whatever happens on Wednesday.

In his first year, he has slowly massaged the massive egos of a slew of star players and now has a smoothly operating team that is in Wednesday's final, reach the Spanish King's Cup championship match and is well on the way to qualifying for next season's Champions Cup.

His crime? Trailing Real Madrid in the league, even though his team has reduced the deficit with the arch-rivals to five points with as many games to play by winning last weekend's grudge match 1-0.

That game could still haunt him on Wednesday. Rough challenges sidelined defender Miguel Nadal and midfielder Giovanni, another Brazilian. Giovanni is expected to recover in time for the final, but with stars like Bulgarian Hristo Stoichkov on the bench, Robson can afford to treat substitutions as a luxury.

Barcelona have by far the more glorious pedigree. Apart from winning the Cup Winners' Cup in 1979, 1982 and 1989, the won the European Champions' Cup in 1992 and the UEFA Cup 1958, 1960 and 1966.

A victory Wednesday would match Real's record of eight European trophies.

And after a backluster mid-season, Robson's men have buoyed by the leadership of Luis Figo and the finishing of Ronaldo.

PSG made a steady rise, reaching the semifinals of a cup for the sixth time in a row and capping it with a first trophy last year.

Since, the team has shed such stars like Youni Djorkaeff and coach Luis Fernandez, but amazingly, survived wholesale changes and is back in the final.

PSG's inconsistent season reached bottom when they lost 6-1 to Juventus in the European Super Cup final over the winter, but, against the odds, the team rebounded.

# Feeling the World Cup!

HONG KONG, May 14: Hong Kong's football team joined the likes of Brazil, Germany, Italy and England when they got their hands on the coveted World Cup today, the first time the trophy had made the trip to Asia, reports AFP.

Unfortunately for the players, who have already been all but knocked out of next year's tournament in France, the coveted solid-gold trophy was here only as part of a regional tour promoting the event.

During a seven-month world trek, the FIFA World Cup trophy will appear in 12 countries leading up to next summer's main event.

The British colony has virtually no chance of qualifying for next year's finals in France. "We are delighted to bring the World Cup trophy up-close to hundreds of thousands of loyal football fans throughout Asia and around the world, starting in Hong Kong," said Philip Davis, managing director of Anheuser-Busch China, one of the tour's sponsors.

The 14-inch (36-centimetre) trophy was designed by Italian sculptor Silvio Gazzaniga in 1974 after the original Jules Rimet Trophy was won outright by Brazil in 1970, their third victory. The original trophy was stolen in 1983.

The replacement weighs 11 pounds (five kilograms) and is made of solid 18-carat gold.

# Graf returns with a win

BERLIN, May 14: A rusty Steffi Graf, making her comeback from a knee injury Tuesday, struggled past Chanda Rubin in three sets to reach the third round of the German Open, reports AP.

Graf, battling to control her shaky strokes throughout the match, lost eight of the first nine points before recovering to beat the American 6-3, 3-6, 6-1 at the 927,000 dollars event.

The former world No. 1, who hadn't played since Feb. 2, finally grabbed control of the match when Rubin's double fault handed her a 2-0 lead in the third set.

Rubin, the world No. 27, had rallied from 2-3 down in the second set, closing out her first set win against Graf in six career meetings when the German misfired on both a forehand and backhand.

Rubin, who had been the world No. 6 before a fractured serving hand sidelined her for six months last year, appeared to be a potentially tough first opponent for Graf's comeback.

But neither player found their rhythm before Graf converted her first match point in one hour, 44 minutes when Rubin netted a return.

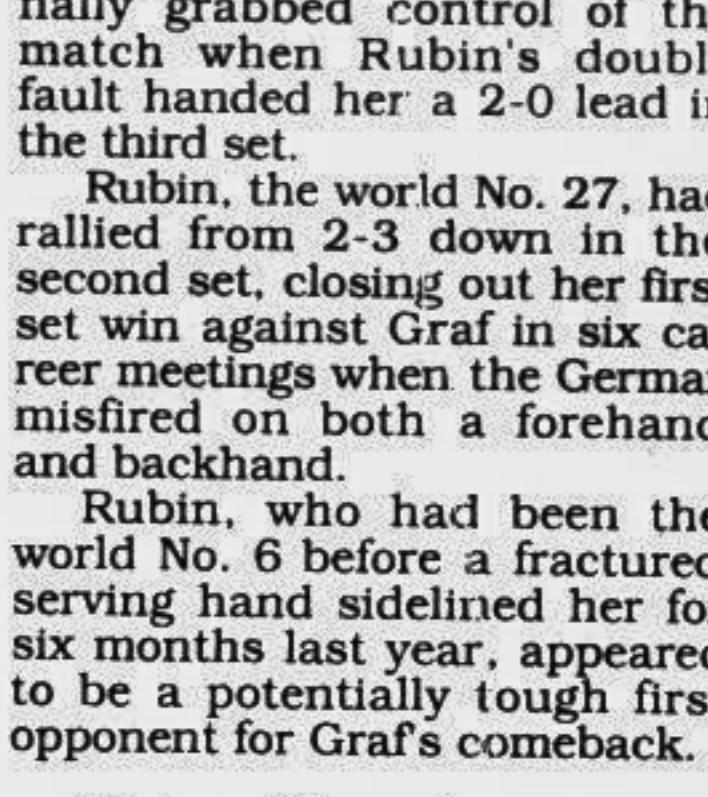
"At the start I was very tentative," said Graf. "But you could say neither of us played very well."

Graf, who last played at the Pan Pacific Open, has lost her top-ranking to Swiss teenager Mirina Hingis during her lay-off.

She is seeking her 10th German Open title at an event which boasts one of its strongest fields ever, with 16 of the world's top 20 players.

Mary Pierce, seeded 12th and fresh off her victory in Rome, sailed past Germany's Elena Wagner 6-2, 6-3, while number 11 Brenda Schwartz, 6-1, 6-4.

Pierce made short work of Wagner, world No. 123, but said she was tired from playing in Rome.

# ENGLAND CHRONICLES

This Paul Gascoigne, idolised by some Brits as Gazza, is living up to the Bengali meaning of his pet name. While his Rangers were playing Dundee last week, the substitute card was waved at him. And, believe me, instead of setting an example to the millions who watch him live and on telly, this "totally out" English star refused to come out of. He was mimicking a child who had lost his candy. But, in a more elderly fashion he told manager Walter Smith to "f--- off". What not a falling star will do!

In the 1989 FA Cup semifinal at Hillsborough, 96 Liverpool F.C. fans lost their lives in one of the worst soccer disasters. Last Saturday, 34,000 Liverpoolians packed their Kop to roar for charity as a concert for relatives of the victims got underway. Some of the pop world's biggest stars were there: Manic Street Preachers, The Beautiful South and the Lightning Seeds. They were performing free at the open air show at Anfield, where the club's footballers kicked off the show against the background of a giant poster that said, "You never walk alone". Organisers are hoping to raise more than half a million pounds towards a renewed campaign for another full inquiry into the tragedy.

British sports goods companies and Premiership football Manchester United F.C. have been accused of profiting from Indian child labour.

Children as young as seven have been found stitching footballs for export to a growing market in Britain where they sell for tens of pounds while the child ends up getting a penny or two. The charge of exploitation has been brought about by Christian Aid, a charity organisation, which says the West is demanding unrealistically cheap goods from poor countries.

Cannot the so-called conscientious West threaten Manchester United with closure if they continue likewise just as it demanded of Bangladeshi garment factories?

Talk of double standards!

It is possible to be in the FA Cup final and yet be relegated from the Premiership the same year. Bryan Robson's big money did not pay off.

His team, F.A. Cup finalists on May 17, Middlesbrough were without flamboyant Italian Fabrizio Ravanelli when it drew 1-1 with Leeds United in their last match. Even Brazilian Juninho's presence failed to bring about the winner. It meant they ended up collecting 39 points from 38 matches and were second from bottom. Also relegated were Nottingham Forest (34 points) and Sunderland (40 points).

Coventry scraped to safety with 41 points in the last match when they topped Tottenham 2-1 to remain in the Premier Division. The next season will be Coventry's 31st running season at the top flight.

This was the ninth time when the club managed to get the requisite life-saving points in its last match. Talk of nine nine lives.

However, the Middlesbrough chairman Steve Gibson has threatened court action because the Football Association had deducted three of their points for not turning up to play against Blackburn. And, he believes, that cost the club Premiership survival. He said, "We have been relegated not because of what happened on the pitch but by a decision made by grey men in grey suits behind closed doors". I tell you, football is the same, where ever you go.

# Fu, Lu back with a bang

PUSAN, South Korea, May 14: Chinese swimmers Fu Yong and Lu Bin bounced back from the disgrace of a two-year ban leading China's gold medal tally on the third day of the East Asian Games on Tuesday, reports AFP.

Fu, who failed drug tests to lose his individual 400m medley bronze he won in the Hiroshima Asian Games in 1994, enjoyed his first victory after his comeback by winning the men's 200-metre backstroke.

The 19-year-old from Qingdao led from the start to the finish, clocking 2 min 07.3 sec to beat Japan's Keitaro Konnai by 1.82 sec and South Korea's Ji Sang-Joon by 2.02 sec.

Former world champion Lu, also the winner of four golds and two silvers in Hiroshima before they were taken away, anchored their women's team to win the 4x100m freestyle in 3:47.39.

"This is only my second international competition. I'm really glad to win a gold by representing my country," said Lu, 20, who took part in the short course World Cup at the beginning of the year.

"It's a long time ago that I competed in a race, so I was a little bit tight. I'm going to swim in the 50m freestyle and 200m individual medley races here," added Lu, whose smile never left her face.

"I don't want to talk about doping," said Fu, who also took part in short course races on his home ground in January. "I want to prove that I was innocent, so I want to win more international races."

"I clocked 2:00.79 in Tianjin to set a new national record last month, so this is another new record for me," he added.

PUSAN, May 14: Japan ruled the pool again Wednesday at the East Asian Games, winning four of five swimming events, leaving just one gold for China, reports AP.

Wednesday's victories in the men's 400-metre freestyle and 400-metre freestyle relay and the women's 100-metre breaststroke and 100-metre butterfly gave Japan 11 of the 19 swimming golds and made Shusuke Ito a triple gold medalist.

Hiroshi Fukuda, like Ito a member of the winning relay team, became a double winner. Fukuda and Ito earlier won golds in the men's 800-metre freestyle relay, and Ito won the 200-metre freestyle.

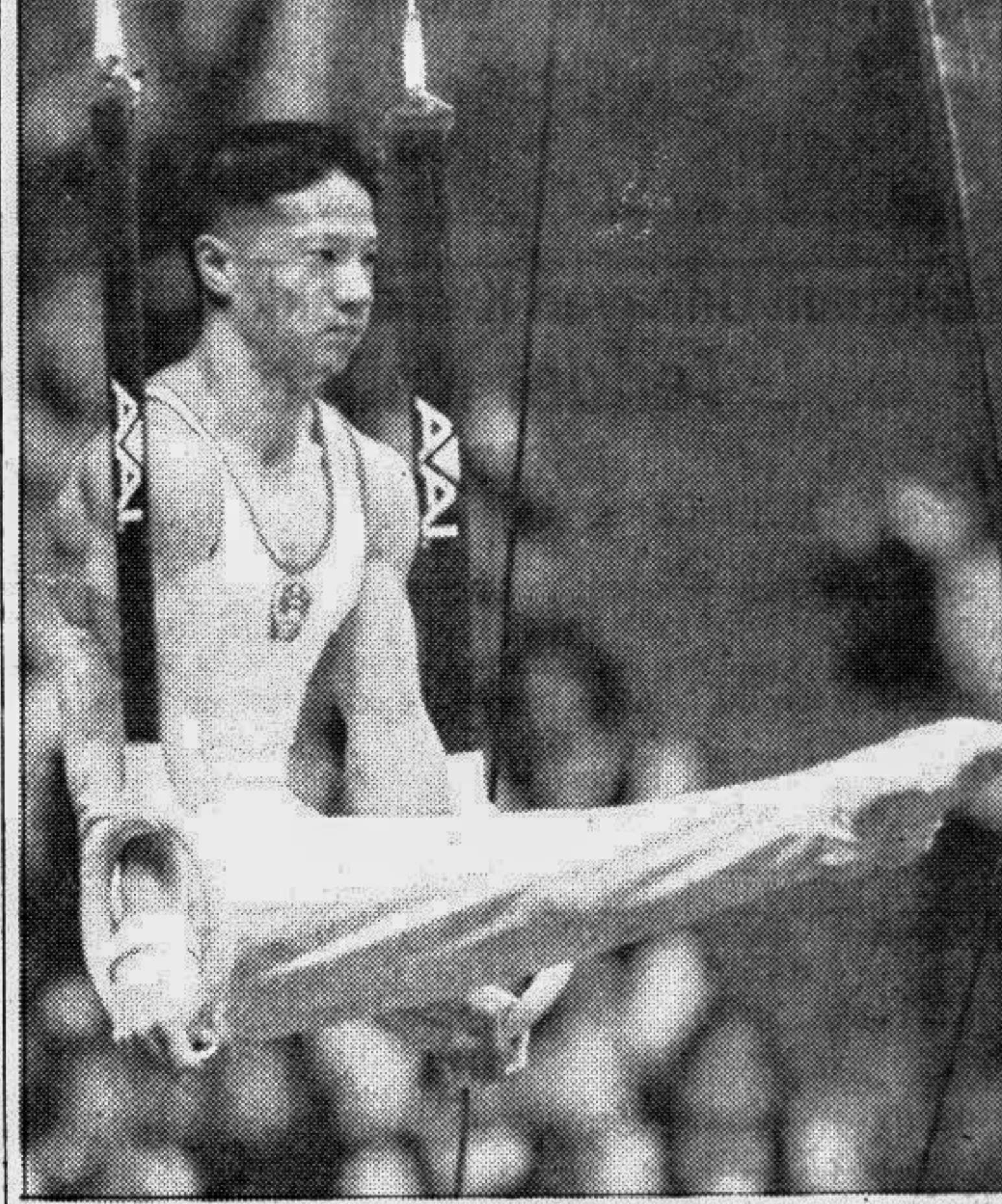
China placed second and South Korea took the bronze in the relay.

In the women's 100-metre breaststroke, Japan finished 1-2, with Masami Tanaka winning in 1 minute, 10.31 seconds, 1.58 seconds ahead of teammate Junko Isoda. South Korea's Byun Hye-yung won the bronze in 1:11.96.

The gold was the second for Tanaka, who earlier won the 200-metre breaststroke.

Japan again finished 1-2 in the men's 400-metre freestyle. Hisato Yasui won in 3:56.23 — 3.64 seconds ahead of Yosuka Ichikawa.

Ayari Aoyama won the women's 100-metre butterfly breaststroke ahead of two Japanese swimmers.

# Taiwan's finest hour

PUSAN, South Korea, May 14: Taiwan scored a historic 90-78 victory over China in the women's basketball at the East Asian Games here today, reports AFP.

Along with leader Chen Shu-Jen, who pumped in 23 points, Chien piloted the Taiwanese team to its first win against archrivals China in international competition.

Chien scored 20 points as Taiwan extended the margin in the second half after a narrow 46-45 half-time lead, capitalizing on China's frequent errors and fouls.

China, bronze medalists in the Hiroshima Asian Games in 1994, is fielding inexperienced teenagers in Pusan as part of preparations for next year's Asian Games in Bangkok and the 2000 Olympics in Sydney.

On the first day of competition Sunday, Taiwan shocked Asian Games silver medalists Japan with a 79-47 victory.

Taiwan, who finished fourth in Hiroshima, remained level with China and Japan with one win and one loss in the four-nation round robin contest.

South Korea, Asian gold medalists, was ahead with two wins. Japan was fourth after two defeats.
