

Jap natants at their best

PUSAN, South Korea, May 15: Japan's swimmers were even more dominating than usual Thursday, sweeping all six of the day's races at the East Asian Games, reports AP.

Two more became triple gold medalists. Japanese swimmers finished 1-2 in the men's 200-metre butterfly and 100-metre backstroke and the women's 800-metre freestyle.

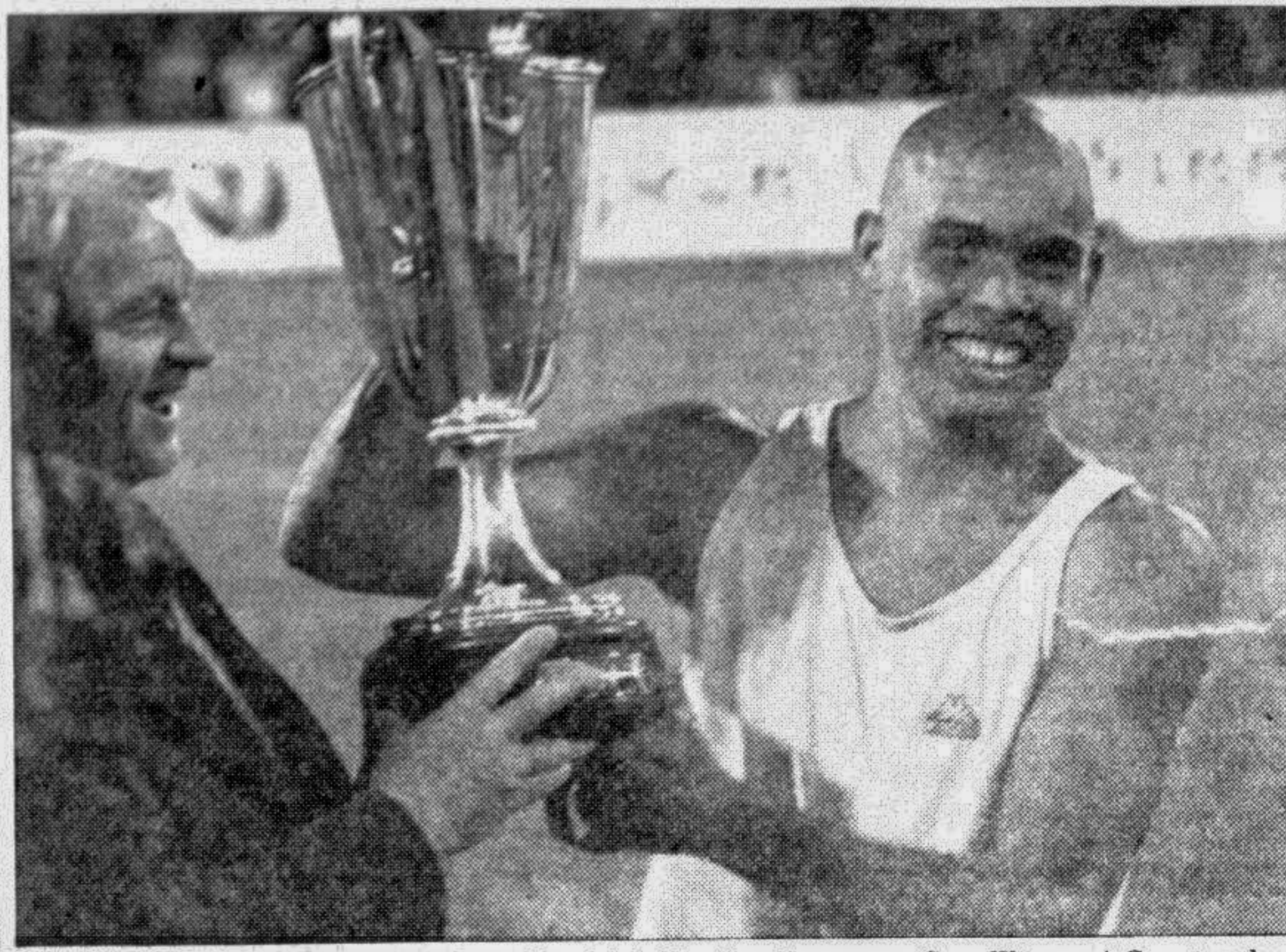
China edged in for the silver in the women's 200-metre individual medley and the 400-metre medley relay, while Kazakhstan missed gold in the men's 50-metre freestyle by 0.05 second.

Thursday's victories gave Japan 17 of the 25 swimming golds in the games so far. Takashi Yamamoto became a triple gold medalist by edging teammate Hisayoshi Tanaka in the 200-metre butterfly. His time of 1 minute, 58.01 seconds beat the Asian record. Tanaka was 2.92 seconds behind.

China set its fourth world record in weightlifting on Thursday, with Yu Wenyu snatching 103 kilograms (227 pounds) for the gold in the 70-kilogram class.

Yu broke the previous record of 102.5 kilograms (226) on her second attempt. Zhang Ying, a 14-year-old rookie in international competition, won China's fourth diving gold medal.

She scored 501.42 points in the women's platform, beating teammate Hu Wei, who finished fourth in China's national championships last year, by 8.55 points.

Barca break the record

ROTTERDAM, Netherlands, May 15: Barcelona lifted the Cup Winners' Cup for a record fourth time here on Wednesday as they put an end to Paris Saint Germain's dreams of becoming the first club ever to retain the trophy, reports AFP.

In a hard-fought but ultimately uninspiring encounter, Barca triumphed with a first-half penalty converted by FIFA world footballer-of-the-year Ronaldo.

That proved just enough to secure the Catalan club their eighth win in European competition. The World's biggest club also won the European Cup in 1992 and the Old Fairs Cup three times. Their previous Cup Winners' Cup victories came in 1979, 1982 and 1989.

It was a sweet moment for Barcelona coach and former England boss Bobby Robson, who has been under intense pressure to deliver silverware since taking over from Dutch legend Johan Cruyff last summer.

Barca and to do without the services of French defender Laurent Blanc, suffering from a groin strain, leaving Robson to plump for a central defensive partnership of Fernando Couto and Abelardo.

Skipper Gica Popescu, formerly of Tottenham Hotspur and substituted at half time by Guillermo Amor, received the cup from UEFA president Lennart Johansson.

Having survived a brief spell of PSG pressure, Barca took the lead in the 37th minute from the penalty spot.

And ironically it was Bruno Ngotty, the French side's goalscoring hero of last year's final against Rapid Vienna, who conceded the spotkick, bringing down the irrepressible Ronaldo as the Brazilian striker hared into the box.

Ronaldo, who had missed from the spot in Saturday's win over Real, promptly drilled the ball into the back of the net past PSG keeper Bernard Lama to the delight of the Catalan contingent in the 45,000 crowd.

Barca's Portuguese midfielder Luis Figo, star of last Saturday's crucial league win over title favourites Real Madrid, had earlier shot just wide of Lama's left-hand post.

PSG stepped up the tempo after the break and Patrick Loko had an excellent chance

equalise after an hour. But although his low effort beat Barcelona's Portuguese keeper Vitor Baia, the ball bounced agonisingly against the base of the far post before falling to Brazilian midfielder Leonardo, who lashed the rebound over.

Benoit Cauet had earlier forced Baia into a fine save with a fierce drive from the edge of the box.

But the Parisians were still having difficulty controlling the ubiquitous threat of Ronaldo, and Paul Le Guen resorted to a yellow card on 51 minutes for fouling the explosive attacker, whose long-term future at Barca remains uncertain.

PSG's Laurent Fournier, floored by Couto who was booked for his own for a foul on Luis Enrique.

PSG's general manager Riccardio reacted swiftly by bringing in Jimmy Algerino in Fournier's place.

Portuguese defender Couto had earlier had a headed goal chalked out for a foul following a Josep Guardiola corner from the left.

Having soaked up another spell of pressure, Barcelona cautiously moved forward once more and, led by Ronaldo, fired just over from 20 yards.

In a final throw of the dice, PSG threw on Cyrille Pouget for the tiring Loko with 13 minutes remaining.

Barca, themselves needing fresh legs, then replaced De La Pena with Stoichkov and Jusep Enrique with Juan Antonio Pizzi in quick succession as the final minutes ticked away.

Figo should have wrapped it up for the Catalans in the dying minutes, but he hit the bar with a close range chip over Lama after Bulgarian veteran Stoichkov had astutely played him through on the edge of the area.

Afterwards, Barca vice-president Joan Gaspart was quick to thank traditional rivals Real Madrid for sending his club a good luck telegram before the encounter.

International Olympic Committee president Juan Antonio Samaranch, a native of Barcelona, described the final as moving.

But, although he felt his home town club had played well, he admitted "it wasn't a great final."

Ivan de La Pena, winning his first European trophy at the age of 21, said: "I'm the happiest man in the world, I just can't find words to describe it." He dedicated the win to his family.

One of Barca's many celebrity fans — the club counts the Pope among its 110,000 members — the tenor Josep Carreras, said, he was proud of the team and proud to be a Catalan.

"Without wishing to appear chauvinistic in any way, I must say that Barcelona are worthy champions."

Mushtaq turns up heat

LONDON, May 15: Pakistan leg-spinner Mushtaq Ahmed wrecked Sussex with a haul of six for 70 as they were dismissed for 241 by Somerset on the opening day of their county championship match on Wednesday, reports Reuters.

It continued a remarkable run by the Pakistani in his two previous county championship appearances against Sussex having finished with match figures of 12 for 175 and 10 for 116.

Mushtaq took two wickets in the morning session and then after some defiant batting by Bill Athey (35) and Keith Newell (24) returned to take the last four wickets after tea.

Seamer Paul Jarvis responded for Sussex by trapping opener Mark Lathwell leg before and at the close Somerset were 35 for one.

Two former England Test bowlers, Devon Malcolm and Phil DeFreitas, did their hopes of a recall no harm when they each took five wickets for Derbyshire against Middlesex at Lord's.

Fast bowler Malcolm finished with five for 50 and seamer DeFreitas five for 46 as Middlesex were dismissed for 146 after winning the toss.

Derbyshire then looked to be faring just as badly when they were batted rapidly being reduced to 23 for three with another former Test bowler, Angus Fraser, taking two of them.

But by the close Derbyshire had recovered to 123 for five with Australian Dean Jones unbeaten on 42.

Worcestershire's Graeme Hick ended a lean spell by hitting his 91st first-class century and went on to make an undefeated 164. But it was against Oxford University and he will need a lot more runs against sterner opposition if he is to earn an England recall.

With Phil Weston making 119, Worcestershire declared at 359 for two. The University were 36 without loss at the close.

Graf gets up steam

BERLIN, May 15: Steffi Graf was close to her fluent best on Wednesday as she romped into the quarterfinals of the 926,250-dollar WTA event here with a 6-3, 6-2 win over 15th-seeded Romanian Ruxandra Dragomir, reports AFP.

The former world number one, out for three months with a knee injury, had struggled past American Chanda Rubin on Tuesday but the top seed wasted little time putting Dragomir to the sword in front of 6,000 fans.

Graf's famed forehead and serve were much in evidence as she swept into the last eight of a tournament she has won nine times. The 27-year-old German capped a fine display with two aces in the final game, which she won to love.

In Friday's quarterfinals Graf faces seventh seed Amanda Coetzer from South Africa, who best her at the Australian Open in January, or Austrian Judith Wiesner.

In other action on Wednesday, third-seeded American Lindsay Davenport crashed out, beaten by Frenchwoman Sandrine Testud 7-6 (11-9), 7-6 (9-7) in the second round.

Also through was another French hope, 12th seed Mary Pierce, who defeated Sandra Kleinova of the Czech Republic 6-3, 2-6, 6-2.

Bobby hopes against hope?

ROTTERDAM, May 15 (Reuters). Despite Barcelona's triumph in the European Cup Winners' Cup final over Paris St Germain on Wednesday, the future of coach Bobby Robson still rests in the balance.

But the 64-year-old Englishman hopes the 1-0 victory over the French side will help him see out the second year of his two-season contract.

"People must judge me on my results. They have to think about just that. There aren't too many presidents that get given the European Cup Winners' Cup Trophy," he said.

"I came here for two years and I always thought I would be here two years," he added.

But he would not be drawn any further about his chances of staying at the Catalan club.

"You'd have to ask that to the president," he said.

Robson's tenure at Barcelona, not yet a season old, had looked shaky ever since arch-rivals Real Madrid drew away from the Catalan club in the league.

Ajax Amsterdam coach Louis van Gaal has been strongly linked with Barcelona since he announced mid-season that he would be leaving Ajax this summer. Last month, Barcelona president Josep Luis

Nunez even went so far as to name Van Gaal as next season's manager.

However, Robson dismissed talk of his early demise, saying he has already set himself a challenge for next season. Although Robson was not hopeful of overtaking Real, he said Barcelona would almost certainly qualify for the Champions League as the Spanish league's second-placed team. And Robson said, he is the man

think I would have a chance to be there," he said.

Robson has a chance to steer Barcelona to four trophies this season — the Spanish title, Spanish Cup, and the Spanish Super Cup and European Cup Winners' Cup which they have already secured.

But the internal politics at the Camp Nou could yet drive him out.

Passion was running deeply among the Barcelona fans on Wednesday. Although they saw their team with the European Cup in 1992, they remembered losing to AC Milan 4-0 in that competition in 1994 and also losing in the final of this Cup in 1991.

Guardiola, who played a key role in Wednesday's victory, said, "I dedicate this win to the fans who saw us lose those matches. I wish I could cut my medal in half and represent one part of it to the fans for those defeats."

Barcelona skipper Gheorghe Popescu, who was substituted at half-time said: "My hamstring started to seize up after half an hour and I could not continue. But we did very well as a team tonight."

"We knew PSG would be hard to beat and they were. We had no particular tactics to beat them, you can't play like that in a cup final. But we deserved the victory for the way we played."

Muster muffs it on clay

ROME, May 15: By outlasting Thomas Muster on clay, Scott Draper certainly turned around his season. He might have given his career a boost, as well.

After three straight first-round exits at clay court tournaments, Draper advanced to the third round of the Italian Open by winning a battle of attrition with a true impresario on the slow, red surface, reports AP.

"It's funny what a week can do," Draper said after eliminating Muster, the third seed and two-time defending champion here. "If you'd seen me last week, you'd have said, 'God, who's that guy?' This was a good result, but I'm far from finished, hopefully."

The Australian's 7-6, 5-7, 7-5 win Wednesday in three hours under the midday sun, with the mercury touching 32 degrees Celsius, left No. 4 Yevgeny Kafelnikov the highest remaining seed. The top two, Pete Sampras and Michael Chang, lost in the first round.

Matches-up in Thursday's third round featured Draper against qualifier Davide Scola, who was eliminated by No. 15 Marc Rosset of Switzerland.

Draper made a splash at the 1995 French Open, reaching the fourth round — a feat he repeated last year. He drew comparisons with former Australian great Rod Laver, in part for his smooth left-handed groundstrokes.

But slumps such as this season's have kept him down in the ATP Tour rankings. The first-round exits at Barcelona, Munich and Hamburg left Draper at 75th in the world, and he says he knows why.

"I have to work mostly on my mind. I need to play as many matches as possible in order to get the necessary experience," the 22-year-old said. "When I played junior tennis, I didn't have a clue how to play. Sometimes I find it difficult to play the right shot at the right time. I'm improving on that."

Draper eliminated clay specialist Andrei Medvedev, the winner at the German Open last week in the first round here. He followed that up by wearing down Muster, who was treated for severe dehydration after the match.

"The scary part about it is that I think I won over him physically and mentally," Draper said.

Muster, who owns 40 career clay-court titles, is usually the one overpowering opponents into submission.

"I just kept pushing and pushing and pushing. I tried to feed off Thomas. To know he is tired as well makes you feel good," added Draper who's accustomed to the heat and humidity of his native Queensland.

Draper will have to contend with the rowdy fans at the Foro Italico in his match with Scola, who stormed back to shock 14th-seeded Tim Henman of Britain 1-6, 6-3, 6-4 Wednesday night.

"I wouldn't say I made life too difficult for him," said Henman, who was coming off a three-month layoff after elbow surgery. "I think with Draper beating Muster there was definitely an opportunity to progress here, and it's frustrating to miss that."

Fifth-seeded Richard Krajicek, who lost to Muster in last year's final, was another upset victim, falling to Germany's Marc-Kevin Goellner 7-6, 7-6.

Action was not forthcoming on Board 66 either. This was a tame 3 NT for East-West with the only interest coming in the play.

Open Room The auction was uneventful, Solodar-Levin employing a standard one over one approach to the straightforward notrump game.

Zia did well to lead the ♠Q rather than the 5 which would have blown a trick immediately. Levin won the ♠A, tested clubs with the king and ace, and got off dummy with a low diamond, queen, deuce, 5. Masood returned his remaining spade and Levin's 10 lost to the jack.

Zia carefully shifted to hearts and Masood was allowed to win his queen. To save himself at this point he had to return the ♠Q, but instead he led a second heart to dummy's ace. Now Levin played two further clubs, extracting a diamond from Masood and one card in each red suit from Zia (that did not matter). Now the ♠K forced a heart from Masood and the last club finished everyone off (although it seemed that only Masood was squeezed in the red suits here). In fact Zia had been squeezed in spades and diamonds. Had he pitched a heart to keep his diamonds intact, he would have

been squeezed on this last club as well. When dummy threw the ♠7, Masood had to resign. A double squeeze which was given the look of non-simultaneity. Making four the hard way.

Closed Room Here Fazli elected to treat his meaty 14 HCP as 15 and so rejected the weak notrump opening in favour of the stronger notrump rebid. Game was reached quickly thereafter.

Rodwell's normal lead of the ♠5 conceded and early 10th trick. Essentially Fazli had to maneuver a position similar to the one Levin achieved (without conceding a spade) in order to take an 11th. The play took a different turn, however. Fazli played ♠A and ♠K in that order and then led the ♠J passing it to the queen. 5-month ban on Lama

PARIS, May 15: Paris St Germain and French international goalkeeper Bernard Lama was banned from football for five months today after failing a drugs test, reports AFP.

But the French football federation announced that three of the five months ban would be suspended.

Lama, who played in the European Cup Winner's Cup final against Barcelona on Wednesday night which the Spanish side won 1-0, had tested positive for cannabis last February.
