"I want to at least reach the semi finals in Paris," the 16year-old told the Sunday newspaper Sonntagsblick.



overs, the best figures by a Sri Lankna bowler in 50-over internationals, to restrict the home team to 225 for seven on an unusually bouncy Wankhede Stadium wicket. Jayasuriya then smashed a

monumental 151 not out off 120 balls, Sri Lanka's highest individual one-day score, to help his team gallop past the modest target with 9.1 overs to spare.

The result left all four teams with one win each form two matches and turned the last round of league matches Sri Lankan vs New Zealand on Tuesday and India vs Pakistan on Wednesday into semifinals. India's hopes of making the


