NEW YORK, May 19: Still feeling his loss to IBM supercomputer Deep Blue, chess champion Garri Kasparov says he wants a rematch, reports AP. But a less-than-enthusiastic

IBM wasn't biting. "I hereby challenge IBM to a match of 10 games, 20 days long, to play every second day," the world champion wrote in an essay published in this week's Time magazine. "I think IBM owes me, and all mankind, a rematch.

Deep Blue designers refused to commit to another face-off against the 34-year-old Russian. The computer beat Kasparov by a score of 3.5 points to 2.5 points in a match that ended last weekend.

"There are a lot of great chess players," IBM scientist Joe Hoane told The New York Times.

Fernandez ends title drought

BERLIN, May 19: Mary Joe-Fernandez captured her first title in more than two years, negating the power game of Mary Pierce to win the Berlin Open 6-4, 6-2 on Sunday, reports AP.

"This was the biggest title of my career," Fernandez said. The 25-year-old American, who reached the semifinals in four of eight tournaments she has played in 1997, including the Australian Open, was

largely ignored at Berlin, where 16 of the world's top 20 players had entered. Fernandez ousted No 2 Jana Novotna 6-3, 6-1 in the semis on Saturday. The tenth-seeded American baffled Novotna with her steady

PUSAN, South Korea, May 19: With five world weightlifting records and 62 gold medals. China was once again the undisputed leader as the East Asian Games ended Monday.

report agencies. But the day's glory belonged to the Taiwan men's basketball team, whose 71-70 upset of favourite South Korea gave it its first basketball gold ever at an international competition.

South Korea won the soccer gold Monday for a Games total of 45, but failed in its bid to overtake Japan as No 2.

Japan ended the nine-day competition with 47 golds, 53 silvers and 53 bronzes, while newcomer Kazakhstan finished with 24 golds. In soccer, China tied Kaza-

khstan 0-0 and Japan beat South Korea 1-0 Monday. The Koreans still came out on top with a 4-1 record, while Japan and China each were 3-1-1. Japan took the silver based on goals scored.

Japan, propelled by quadruple gold medalist Takashi Yamamoto and other top athletes, took 21 of the 31 swimming golds against China's seven.

Chinese swimming stars Lu Bin and Xiong Guoming, returning to competition after a twoyear ban for failing drug tests, did not meet expectations, winning just one gold each.

But China had a hero in gymnast Zhang Jingjin, who won the men's individual allaround, the parallel bars and the horizontal bars, as well as a share of the team victory, for four gold medals, helping China take 12 out of 17 gymnastic golds. Chinese women also set four

world records in weightlifting, while Wang Guohua set a record in the men's 64-kilogram class.

Kazakhstan had its own heroine in Svetlana Kazanina, who seized the title of top allaround woman athlete by winning the seven-event heptathlon at the track.

Hong Kong had Ng Siu Ching, who won the women's forms competition in wushu, the Chinese fighting art, to give her country its only gold.


