Huge loss to country's power sector

Cyclone damages 70 transformers, 1150 towers in coastal areas

Monday's cyclone, which left behind a trail of devastation on property worth crores of taka, also caused huge loss to country's dimming power sector, re-

ports UNB. Most part of Chittagong and Cox's Bazar districts ran out of power soon after the storm hit the coastal belt of Bangladesh, damaging 1150 towers and poles, 70 transformers and 580kilometers line conductor.

Meanwhile, gusty wind on Tuesday caused colossal damage to Bheramara-Iswardi 132 KV grid line damaging four huge towers that threw the entire Faridpur, Khulna, Jessore, Kushtia and Barisal region into a blackout, lasting about three hours from 5 pm.

8 highway dacoits arrested

They also recovered looted goods, including gold ornaments and clothes from their possession. The arrested had long been wanted by police in several dacoity cases.

Babu confessed to the police that they had committed dacoity in two buses on Siddirganj-Bhairab road on May 15 and April 26 this year.

An Energy Ministry source said out of 112 feeder lines of Chittagong zone damaged during the storm, 38 were made op-erative, while PD through a special arrangement ensured power supply to important in-stallations of Chittagong city, like hospitals, T&T, WASA pumps, port, circuit houses, cantonment, naval base, television station, radio station and railway.

The sources said a total of 52 teams headed by executive engineers were working round the clock to repair the damaged lines and restore power in the

affected areas. The ministry sources said Monday's cyclone equally damaged the lines and installations of Rural Electrification Board


